INTRODUCTION

PERC is a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit research and educational institute founded in Bozeman, Montana, in 1980 with the mission of improving environmental quality through property rights and markets

2011 proved to be the busiest year ever at "PERC University" Scholars, students, environmental entrepreneurs, and media professionals visited from the world's most prestigious schools, a myriad of countries, and leading media outlets. In addition to dozens of daily seminars, PERC held 13 conferences with 168 participants, six Liberty Fund colloquia, welcomed 25 visiting professors from Harvard, Yale, MIT, and Columbia, to mention a few, 28 graduate and undergraduate students, five journalists, and mentored 16 early-career environmental leaders as part of PERC's Enviropreneur Institute (PEI)

Our top organizational priority is to make PERC *the* center for Free Market Environmentalism (FME) We plan to reach this goal by fully realizing our vision of creating "PERC University" PERC University has three goals

- Research—to be the premier research institute for studying how property rights and markets can improve environmental quality,
- Outreach—to be a sought-after source of information on the application of FME to environmental problems,
- Applied Programs—to be not just a "think tank" but also a "do tank" Practitioners and
 environmental entrepreneurs see PERC as the recognized source for practical solutions to
 conservation problems

PERC is the oldest and largest organization in the world devoted to helping decision makers, opinion leaders, and environmental entrepreneurs understand how they can achieve their environmental goals by using economic principles

RESEARCH

PERC Research Director and Senior Fellow, Don Leal, conducts research that explores how we can encourage innovation and adaptation in the catch share approach to managing tuna and other transboundary fisheries Leal completed a preliminary outline of topics for a PERC forum on the subject which is currently under review by representatives of the World Bank, the World Wildlife Fund, and the International Seafood Sustainability Fund (ISSF) Leal participated in several fisheries workshops and conferences hosted by government and non-government organizations, including the Gulf of Mexico Fisheries Management Council, Environmental Defense Fund, the International Seafood Sustainability Foundation, and the World Bank

PERC held two Searle workshops on "Property Rights, Markets, and the Environment," one in July, directed by Don Leal and Kurt Schnier, and another in November, directed by Terry Anderson and Dominic Parker The workshop in July featured presentations focusing on lessons learned in rights-based fisheries management. Despite evidence that these market approaches generally improve fishing efficiency, fish stocks, and fish quality, there remain challenges in their implementation and in their design to overcome social and remaining environmental concerns. The ideas presented in the workshop represent cutting-edge research and will be extremely helpful in improving property rights-based strategies in the United States and abroad

The second workshop was held at Lewis and Clark College in Portland, Oregon, on "Institutions, Resource Use and Economic Prosperity for North American Indians" The goal of this workshop was to improve understanding of the impacts of federal policies and tribal institutions on capital formation and resource development in North American Indian economies and to lay the groundwork for a three-year research project funded by the M J Murdock Trust Work by PERC scholars has shown that Indian and First Nation economies lag far behind neighboring local economies mainly due to institutions that limit property rights, raise transaction costs, and weaken the rule of law One new participant emphasized that he learned more about the law and economics interface at this workshop than he ever realized existed This workshop achieved PERC's goal of using the series to expand our network of scholars Of the eighteen participants, eight were new to PERC conferences The new scholars included professors from Harvard, Colgate, UCLA, and the University of Utah, as well as two graduate students

In late July, PERC hosted a Lone Mountain Forum, focusing on "Human Adaptation to Climate Change" The forum included a lecture by Michael Greenstone, the 3M Professor of Environmental Economics at MIT and former chief economist of the Council of Economic Advisers during the first year of the Obama administration Professor Greenstone addressed the question, "Will Adaptation Save Us from Climate Change?" Two crucial components of adaptation are likely to be migration and responses to changing land values

Terry Anderson, Brandon Scarborough, and Reed Watson completed *Tapping Water Markets*, which will soon be released by Resources For the Future Press, an imprint of Taylor and Francis The fact that this book is being published by a press not noted for publishing free market approaches is a testament to the power of PERC's ideas. Here is what Tracy Mehan, formerly with the EPA, had to say about the book "*Tapping Water Markets* makes a persuasive case for using prices, property rights and markets to allocate water for the

benefit of society rather than resorting to politics to allocate it for the benefit of the few and well connected It is an indispensable book and an invaluable contribution to the water policy debate"

PERC Senior Fellows, Terry L Anderson and Donald R Leal, began writing the third edition of Free Market Environmentalism in 2011 This edition will differ substantially from the previous two editions in that it is subtitled, "The Next Generation" That subtitle has a double entendre the third edition will include the next generation of ideas for applying property rights and markets to environmental problems and most chapters will be co-authored with young scholars who represent the next generation of free market environmentalists. A draft of the third edition will be completed in 2012

PERC's fellowship programs were filled with outstanding scholars, journalists, policy makers, and environmentalists who brought unique research projects with them These fellowship programs offer a unique opportunity to spend time at PERC and advance fellows' understanding of the role of markets and property rights in protecting and enhancing environmental resources. Once again, we drew fellows from a variety of disciplines economics, law, political science, environmental science, agriculture, and public policy. And again, their topic areas covered a wide range, including water law, forestery, alternative energy, endangered species protection, conservation easements, and land tenure on Indian reservations

Each fellow provided feedback through a final evaluation Here are a few of their comments

Last year I found PERC to be just the place I needed to recharge my scholarly batteries after an intense summer of work, and this year it was even more refreshing to spend a week in beautiful Bozeman I continue to be impressed with how many interesting and different scholars that PERC brings together Over the course of one week I learned something new in every daily seminar, insights that I would not have encountered in the course of my normal summer activities – Bart Wilson, Lone Mountain Fellow, Professor of Economics and Law, Donald P Kennedy Endowed Chair in Economics and Law, Chapman University

I found the time I spent at PERC from May to August to be very productive I was able to make substantial progress on various dimensions of my research I also enjoyed the opportunity to present a seminar and found the response to my presentation to be extremely positive. The audience was high caliber, and a number of useful and insightful comments and suggestions were offered that will doubtless enhance the quality of our paper.

OUTREACH

Not only did the Outreach team meet its 15 targets for 2011 but in many areas they shot well beyond PERC's media clippings, for example, were projected to reach a circulation of 14,527,873 by year end—we hit 46,000,000 Publications in the *Wall Street Journal*, *Los Angeles Times*, and *Washington Times* helped boost this number

PERC produced an eight-minute film on catch shares for fisheries, which is used by the World Bank and will be integrated into a classroom curriculum and shown to millions of students across the country

PERC also increased its radio and television presence For example, PERC scholars were featured on the John Batchelor Show, Radio West, Greensense Radio, and ABC Australia In addition, PERC Executive Director, Terry Anderson, appeared on the John Stossell show in May to discuss the causes of American Indian poverty

Publications: After 31 years of being in print, PERC Reports—The Magazine for Free Market Environmentalism, continued to educate a broad audience about the application of markets and property rights to environmental problems. The spring 2011 "Enviropreneur" issue was followed by a special summer issue answering "The Tough Questions for Free Market Environmentalism." The fall issue focused on Lone Mountain Fellows and their varying research endeavors. Several PERC articles were reprinted in larger magazines such as the American Spectator, Townhall Magazine, and High Country News.

In addition to *PERC Reports*, PERC produced "The Green Tea Party Pocket Guide" and three *Case Studies* including "Saving African Rhinos A Market Success Story," "Funding Parks Political versus Private Choices," and "Vermont Schools the Nation in Woody Biomass Heating" We also produced two *Policy Series*, "Fencing Fisheries in Namibia and Beyond," and "Colony Collapse Disorder The Market Response to Bee Disease" Here is what others are saying about these publications

Laura Huggins uses her interesting story-telling style to grab the reader's attention This *PERC Policy Series* strengthens the case that rights-based fishery management works and a well-designed catch share system customized to the local culture and history will work even in underdeveloped countries —Jingjie Chu, The World Bank Group, Africa

Website: The PERC website continues to be the main platform for online communication and promotion of FME In 2011 PERC saw a 19 percent increase in visitors to the website, a 26 percent increase in pages visited, and an 11 percent increase in visits of longer than 15 minutes. The website also incoroporated more giving opportunities for supporting PERC through online contributions by adding more donate buttons and promoting PERC's "4 Star Charity Navigator Rating" on the homepage. This effort, in conjunction with fudraising efforts via social media, helped produce a 40 percent increase in the number of donors giving online in 2011.

Social Media: In the summer of 2010, PERC launched four forms of social media Facebook, Twitter, a blog, and YouTube Since August 2010, PERC has accumulated nearly 2,000 followers on Facebook These followers receive daily updates on free market environmentalism Similarly, since its launch in September 2010, PERCs blog, *The PERColator*, has received 33,000 visits and has helped move more traffic to perc org PERC has 367 followers on Twitter PERC's first short documentary video launched on PERC's YouTube page and received 2,224 views in 2011 These numbers indicate that PERC's social media

campaign is succeeding and is engaging new audiences in the ideas of FME

Public Affairs: PERC and its partner, the Liberty Fund, Inc., co-sponsored six colloquia with audiences ranging from marine fisheries experts to renowned climate change scholars. PERC hosted five media fellows including John Koppisch, an editor at Forbes, Andrew Wilson, a writer for the American Spectator and Weekly Standard, and Kristina Kendall, executive producer for the John Stossel show on Fox News

Awards: PERC was recognized internationally with several awards presented to executive director, Terry Anderson On March 8, Anderson was awarded the Liberalni Institute Annual Award, in Prague, Czech Republic, for "Contribution to the Proliferation of Liberal Thinking, and Making Ideas of Liberty, Private Property, Competition, and the Rule of Law Come True" And on June 14, he and PERC senior research fellow, Dominic Parker, won the Addington Prize in Measurement from the Fraser Institute for their paper, "Sovereignty, Credible Commitments, and Economic Prosperity on American Indian Reservations"

APPLIED PROGRAMS

On June 26 - July 8, PERC hosted the eleventh annual PERC's Enviropreneur Institute (PEI) which has become PERC's flagship applied program. It has established a global network of 185 fellows who have learned how to apply property rights and markets to achieve environmental quality and effectively become an active force in market-based environmental conservation. These fellows represent a wide range of conservation-oriented businesses and organizations, including the Nature Conservancy, Environmental Defense Fund, World Bank, well-respected environmental management schools, and for-profit firms

The 2011 institute gathered 16 enviropreneurs from around the globe to explore how markets and property rights promote environmental stewardship Fellows represented a number of countries including China, Cuba, Ecuador, Israel, and South Africa

The following comments are indicative of satisfaction with the institute

In a world of increasing pessimism about the economy and the environment, PEI stands out as a refreshing front of hope During my time at the Enviropreneur Institute, I learned many practical and theoretical lessons that will assist my work in free market environmentalism. However, the most beneficial aspect of the program was the connections with PERC staff, fellows, and alumni and their 'can do' spirits — Dave Wager, 2011 PEI Alumnus, Tree Ring Pens

The two weeks in Montana were a life changing experience for me, not only because I had a chance to interact with really smart, knowledgeable, and innovative people and made friends with them forever, but also because the way I think about things has been changed forever. I heard so many good examples on how markets can succeed to protect the environment when other instruments failed. I felt I got more ideas and wanted to apply all the tools and principles we learned to my life

PEI alumni continue to build a global network of enviropreneurs. The Enviropreneur Alumni Association was formed to take ownership of that network. The association seeks to improve networking and peer mentoring and foster increased collaboration among PEI alumni, advance projects that support PERCs mission, and strengthen the relationship between PERC and PEI alumni. Each year, 16 alumni participate in a colloquium co-sponsored with Liberty Fund where disscussions revolve around current issues and topics relevant to the enviropreneurs. The invitations are an honor and priviledge for the alumni.

The Enviropreneur-in-Residence (EIR) Program provides an incubation period for enviropreneurs launching a business and is another opportunity for PEI alumni to continue their work at PERC Monty Simus was chosen as the 2011 Enviropreneur-in-Residence While at PERC, Monty refined the business plan for SmartMarkets, an integrated online trading platform that encourages a defined group of citizens to find creative ways to conserve water and power During his stay, Monty also interviewed potential clients, participated in PERC workshops, and mentored other enviropreneurs visiting PERC

2011 was a year for expanding PERC's Applied Programs beyond PEI

- PERC received a grant to explore policy reforms that reduce the transaction costs and increase the gains from trading water in California Towards that end, PERC hosted a workshop at Stanford University which brought together the state's leading scholars and water practioners. Over the next two years, PERC will advance the innovative legal reforms generated at the 2011 workshop.
- Applied Programs received a similar grant to explore the viability of a market for coral reef restoration in Florida Working with a 2011 alumnus of PEI, PERC is hosting a workshop in Florida for local conservation groups, businesses, and government agencies such as Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and NOAA/Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary The objective is to develop mutually beneficial agreements between the producers and beneficiaries of reef restoration
- A third applied program initiated in 2011 focused on how markets might be applied to Texas groundwater Following a successful presentation to legislative and administrative staffers at the Texas State Capital, Applied Program Director, Reed Watson, was asked to explore the feasability of a program for municipalities to compensate agricultural landowners for adopting management practices that enhance aquifer storage and quality

PERC finalized a report on the impact of sustainability certification and renewable fuel subsidies on family owned forests. This report will serve as the basis for a presentation to the forest products industry, an academic publication in the *Journal of Forestry* or similar journal, and several publications in forestry trade journals

PERC UNIVERSITY CAMPUS CAMPAIGN

PERC has launched a three-year capital campaign to raise \$1 8 million to purchase a building as the "campus" for "PERC University" A true PERC campus will further ensconce the connection between the place and the idea of free market environmentalism. To show their commitment, 100 percent of the board members pledged a total of more than \$1 million toward this goal

The most important reason for launching the campaign is that it will allow us to more effectively delivery of programs Purchasing and remodeling the building will allow us to occupy 30 percent more office space which can house more scholars and visiting fellows, to nearly double our conference facility and seminar space which means we can better accommodate the 15 conferences we host annually and save money by not using outside facilities, and to create a media communications center which will allow us to better connect with the mainstream media

CONCLUSION

Since PERC opened its doors in 1980, the tapestry of environmentalism has changed dramatically PERC has played a pivotal role in this transition by sponsoring and conducting research on FME PERC scholars and researchers continue to pursue our vision of creating "PERC University," *the* place where scholars, journalists, and environmental entrepreneurs gather to study and implement the ideas of FME This vision includes reaching beyond the Rocky Mountains and the borders of the United States to take PERC's message to broader audiences PERC's approach will simultaneously enhance freedom and environmental quality
