(1) Nature of Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) *Nature of Business*

Valley Hospital Association, Inc. (Association) owned and operated a 40-bed acute-care, tax-exempt community hospital facility located in Palmer, Alaska and also owned and operated the Valley Hospital Medical Center, as well as a variety of outpatient programs located therein. The outpatient programs included primary care clinics, laboratory, imaging, retail pharmacy, home health care, and hospice. Effective December 1, 2003, the Association ceased its patient care and pharmacy operations and contributed the majority of its assets and liabilities to a newly formed limited liability company (see note 3 to the financial statements). The Association continues to operate exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or other educational purposes, for the sole benefit of the Association members and the local community.

(b) *Use of Accounting Estimates*

The preparation of the financial statements requires management of the Association to make a number of estimates and assumptions relating to the reported amount of assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(c) *Cash and Cash Equivalents*

For purposes of the statements of cash flows, the Association considers all highly liquid investments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents. Cash and cash equivalents include amounts held in checking and savings accounts.

(d) *Donor Restricted Gifts*

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets to the Association are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received. The gifts are reported as either temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the statements of operations as net assets released from restrictions. Donor restricted contributions whose restrictions are met within the same year as received are reported as unrestricted contributions in the accompanying statements.

(e) *Investment Securities*

Investment securities consist of mutual funds, debt and equity securities and are measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. Fair value of the mutual funds, debt and equity securities are based on quoted market prices at the reporting date multiplied by the quantity held. Investment income or loss (including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends) is included in the excess of revenues, gains and other support over expenses unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law.

(f) *Investment in Joint Ventures*

Investment in joint ventures is accounted for on the equity method of accounting. The Association's prorata share of earnings or losses are reflected in the statements of unrestricted revenues, expenses, and other changes in unrestricted net assets. The Association would recognize a loss when there is a loss in value in the equity method investment, which is other than a temporary decline.

(g) *Grant Awards*

The Association recognizes a grant as a liability when the award is approved by the board of directors.

(h) *Fair Value Measurements*

The Association utilizes valuation techniques that maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs to the extent possible. The Association determines fair value based on assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability in the principal or most advantageous market. When considering market participant assumptions in fair value measurements, the following fair value hierarchy distinguishes between observable and unobservable inputs, which are categorized in one of the following levels:

- Level 1 Inputs: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date.
- Level 2 Inputs: Other than quoted prices included in Level 1 inputs that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs: Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability used to measure fair value to the extent that observable inputs are not available, thereby allowing for situations in which there is little, if any, market activity for the asset or liability at measurement date.

(i) *Subsequent Events*

The Association has evaluated subsequent events from the balance sheet date through May 7, 2012, the date at which the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that there are no items to disclose.

(3) Investment in Joint Ventures

During the year ended December 31, 2003, the Association entered into a contribution and development agreement with a wholly owned subsidiary of Triad Hospitals, Inc. (Triad), a Texas-based company. Under the terms of the agreement, the Association contributed a majority of its assets and liabilities in exchange for cash and a 23.8% – equity interest in Mat-Su Valley Medical Center, LLC (joint venture). Additionally, a new \$87.7 million hospital facility was built to replace the existing hospital facility. The new facility is twice the size of the existing facility at 76 acute care beds. Under the agreement, Triad provided the majority of the financing. The joint venture is governed by a board consisting of an equal number of Association and Triad representatives. The agreement grants the Association the option to purchase, at fair value, an additional equity interest in the joint venture up to a maximum of 10%. During 2006 the Association exercised the purchase option to increase its ownership percentage to 25%. In 2007, Community Health Systems, Inc. (CHS), a Tennessee-based publicly traded company, acquired Triad Hospitals, including Triad's interest in the joint venture. Also in 2008, the joint venture board of directors voted to sell 0.8% of the interest in the hospital to a physician syndication group. Under the syndication agreement, the physicians do not hold a board seat or any voting rights. At the same time of the syndication, the joint venture board of directors voted to spin off home health, and hospice and also the MyDok's pharmacy into separate legal entities, Mat-Su Valley II LLC and Mat-Su Valley III LLC, respectively.

In April of 2011, the Association learned that the U.S. Department of Justice has begun a consolidated investigation of the Joint Venture's majority owner, Community Health Systems, Inc. (CHS) and its wholly owned entities. The investigation is related to allegations of improper Medicare billing practices and that the civil division of the Department of Justice, multiple U.S. Attorney's offices, and the Office of Inspector General for the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) are now closely coordinating their investigation of several overlapping allegations of billing practices. The Office of Audit Services for the Office of Investigations for HHS has been engaged to conduct a national audit of certain of CHS's billing practices. It is uncertain at this time if this investigation will extend to the Joint Ventures. Accordingly, management is unable to determine the ultimate outcome of this matter and its impact on the Joint Venture and the Association.

(4) Concentrations of Risk

At varying times during the year, the Association had cash deposits with major financial institutions, which exceed Federal Depository Insurance limits. These financial institutions have a strong credit rating and management believes credit risk related to these deposits is minimal.

(5) Promises to Give

On October 20, 2008, the Association announced a \$1,000,000 promise to give (or 12.5% of the total project cost, whichever is lower) over three years to the Palmer Senior Citizens Center in Palmer, Alaska, to help with construction costs of a new senior center. This promise was recorded as an expense in 2010 when the recipient fulfilled the conditions of the promise to give.

(6) Income Taxes

Valley Hospital Association, Inc. is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is also exempt from State of Alaska income tax. Certain activities of the Association may constitute unrelated business income and be subject to tax; however, any such tax is immaterial to the financial statements.

At December 31, 2010, the Association has net operating loss carry-forwards for Federal and State of Alaska income tax purposes of \$477,000 which are available to offset future Federal and State of Alaska taxable income, if any, on unrelated business income, through 2026. The related deferred tax assets were \$72,000 and \$68,000 at December 31, 2010 and 2009, respectively. The Association also recorded a valuation allowance equal to the amount of the deferred tax assets for each year as in the judgment of management, it is more likely than not that these deferred tax assets will not be realized. The ultimate realization of deferred tax assets is dependent upon the generation of future unrelated business income during the periods in which those temporary differences become deductible. The change in valuation allowance for the years ended December 31, 2010 and 2009 was \$4,000 and \$7,000, respectively.

U.S. generally accepted accounting principles require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Association and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Association, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2010, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Association is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. management believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2007.

(7) Defined Contribution Plan

The Association has a qualified 401 (k) safe harbor plan (the Plan) whereby employees may contribute up to Federal annual limits. The Association matches up to 4% of employee compensation for all full-time employees who have been employed for 3 months. During the years ended December 31, 2010 and 2009, the Association contributed \$13,962 and \$10,482, respectively, to the Plan. The Plan also provides for employer discretionary profit sharing contributions. No profit sharing contributions were made in 2010 or 2009.

(8) Commitments and Contingencies

The Association is a party to various claims, legal actions, complaints, and regulatory investigations arising in the ordinary course of business. After consultation with legal counsel, management estimates that these matters will be resolved without material adverse effect on the financial statements of the Association.
