OF
BRAIN MAPPING SUPPORT FOUNDATION

May 12, 2011

ARTICLE I

OFFICES

Section 1. PRINCIPAL OFFICES. The Board of Directors shall fix the location of the principal executive office of the Corporation, c/o John C. Mazziotta, M.D., Ph.D., UCLA School of Medicine, 710 Westwood Plaza, Los Angeles, California 90024-1769.

Section 2. OTHER OFFICES. The Board of Directors or the Chief Executive Officer may at any time establish branch or subordinate offices at any place or places where the Corporation is qualified to do business.

ARTICLE II

BOARD OF TRUSTEES IN LIEU OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. NUMBER OF TRUSTEES. The authorized number of Directors, who may be known as "Trustees," shall be no less than four (4) and no more than ten (10), until changed by a duly adopted amendment to these Bylaws approved by at least eighty percent (80%) of the Trustees.

Section 2. TYPES OF TRUSTEES. No more than three (3) of the Trustees shall represent the Founders of this Corporation and shall be designated the "Founder Trustees." A majority of the Trustees shall represent the publicly-supported organization this Corporation supports and shall be designated the "Charitable Trustees." Each of the Trustees rights, powers, duties and authority shall be the same."

Section 3. ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE OF TRUSTEES.

(a) The initial Founder Trustees shall be JON B. LOVELACE, LILLIAN P. LOVELACE and ROBERT LOVELACE. Each of the initial Founder Trustees and his or her successors shall serve as such for as long as he or she desires to serve and is capable of serving or until such Trustee's term of office is reduced by the unanimous vote of JON B. LOVELACE and LILLIAN P. LOVELACE, during their joint lifetimes and the survivor, alone, during the survivor's lifetime.

(b) In the event that a Founder Trustee becomes unable or unwilling to serve, JON B. LOVELACE and LILLIAN P. LOVELACE, acting jointly, or the survivor acting alone,

while living and competent, shall have the power to appoint or remove a replacement or successor Founder Trustee. If neither JON B. LOVELACE nor LILLIAN P. LOVELACE are living or competent, then those Founder Trustees then acting shall have the power to appoint or remove a replacement or successor Founder Trustee. If there are no Founder Trustees then acting, then a committee consisting of CAREY LOVELACE, JAMES LOVELACE, ROBERT LOVELACE and JEFFREY LOVELACE, acting by majority, shall have the power to appoint or remove a replacement or successor Founder Trustee. Such successors shall be designated in a written instrument delivered to each of the other Trustees. If under the above procedures no successor is appointed, then a majority of all the Charitable Trustees shall elect up to three (3) replacement Founder Trustees at the next annual or special meeting of the Board.

(c) The Charitable Trustees shall be appointed or elected by the governing body, members of the governing body, or officers acting in their official capacity of the publicly-supported organization this Corporation supports. Each Charitable Trustee shall hold office for the term decided upon by the publicly-supported organization. Vacancies on the Board of Trustees (among the Charitable Trustees) may be filled by a majority of both types of the remaining Trustees, though less than a quorum, or by a sole remaining Trustee, if the supported organization does not designate a successor in a reasonable time prior to the next annual meeting.

Section 4. VACANCIES. A vacancy or vacancies in the Board of Trustees shall be deemed to exist in the event of the death, resignation or removal of any Trustee, or if the Board of Trustees by resolution declares vacant the office of a Trustee who has been declared of unsound mind by an order of court, or convicted of a felony, or if the authorized number of Trustees is increased.

Any Trustee may resign effective on giving written notice to the Chair of the Board, the President, the Secretary or the Board of Trustees, unless the notice specifies a later time for that resignation to become effective. If the resignation of a Trustee is effective at a future time, the Board of Trustees may elect a successor (in accordance with Section 3 hereinabove) to take office when the resignation becomes effective.

Section 5. POWERS. Subject to the provisions of the California Non-Profit Corporation Law, the business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed and all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of the Board of Directors. Without prejudice to this general grant of power, and subject to the same limitations, the Directors shall have the power to:

(a) Select and remove all officers, agents, and employees of the Corporation; prescribe any powers and duties for them that are consistent with law, with the Articles of Incorporation, and with these Bylaws; fix their compensation; and require from them security for faithful service.

(b) Approve indemnification of Directors, officers, and agents and amend Articles of Incorporation;

(c) Change the principal executive office or the principal business office in the State of California from one location to another; cause the Corporation to be qualified to do business in any other state, territory, dependency, or country and conduct business within or

without the State of California; and designate any place within or without the State of California for the holding of any members' meeting, or meetings, including annual meetings.

(d) Adopt, make, and use a corporate seal and alter the form of the seal;

(e) Borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the Corporation, and cause to be executed and delivered for the Corporation's purposes, in the corporate name, promissory notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of trust, mortgages, pledges, hypothecations, and other evidences of debt and securities.

Section 6. PLACE OF MEETINGS AND MEETINGS BY TELEPHONE. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at any place within or outside the State of California designated from time to time by resolution of the Board. In the absence of any such designation, regular meetings shall be held at the principal executive office of the Corporation. Special meetings of the Board shall be held at any place within or outside the State of California that has been designated in the notice of the meeting or, if not stated in the notice or there is no notice, at the principal executive office of the Corporation. Any meeting, regular or special, may be held by conference telephone or similar communication equipment, so long as all Directors participating in the meeting can hear one another, and all such Directors shall be deemed to be present in person at the meeting.

Section 7. ANNUAL MEETING. The Board of Directors shall hold an annual meeting each year on a date and at a time designated by the Board of Directors. The date designated shall be within five (5) months after the end of the fiscal year of the Corporation and within fifteen (15) months of the last annual meeting. At each such meeting, any business to come before the Board may be conducted, including election of officers.

Section 8. OTHER REGULAR MEETINGS. Other regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held without call at such time and places as shall be fixed by the Board of Directors.

Section 9. SPECIAL MEETING. Special meetings of the Board of Directors for any purpose or purposes may be called at any time by the Chair of the Board, or the President or any Vice President or the Secretary or any two Directors. There shall be four (4) days notice of special meetings given by first class mail or forty-eight (48) hours notice delivered personally or by telephone or by electronic mail.

Section 10. NOTICE OF MEETINGS. All notices of meetings shall be sent or otherwise given in accordance with Section 10 of this Article II not less than ten (10) nor more than sixty (60) days before the date of the meeting, except, however, for special meetings where there shall be four (4) days notice as provided in Section 8 above. The notice shall specify the place, date and hour of the meeting and (i) in the case of a special meeting, the general nature of the business to be transacted, or (ii) in the case of the annual meeting, those matters which the Board of Directors, at the time of giving the notice, intends to present for action by the members.

Section 11. MANNER OF GIVING NOTICE; AFFIDAVIT OF NOTICE. Notice of any meeting requiring a notice shall be given either personally or by first-class mail or by electronic or other written communication, charges prepaid, addressed to the Directors at the address of each Director appearing on the books of the Corporation or given by the Director to the Corporation for the purpose of notice. If no such address appears on the Corporation's books or is given, notice shall be deemed to have been given if sent to that Director by first-class mail or telegraphic or other written communication to the Corporation's principal executive office, or if published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where that office is located. Notice shall be deemed to have been given at the time when delivered personally or deposited in the mail or sent by electronic or other means of written communication.

If any notice addressed to a Director at the address of that Director appearing on the books of the Corporation is returned to the Corporation by the United States Postal Service marked to indicate that the United States Postal Service is unable to deliver the notice to the Director at that address, all future notices or reports shall be deemed to have been duly given without further mailing if these shall be available to the Director on written demand of the Director at the principal executive office of the Corporation for a period of one (1) year from the date of the giving of the notice.

An affidavit of the mailing or other means of giving any notice of any Directors' meeting shall be executed by the secretary or assistant secretary of the Corporation giving the notice, and shall be filed and maintained in the minute book of the Corporation.

Section 12. WAIVER OF NOTICE OF MEETING. Notice of a meeting need not be given to a Director who signs a waiver of notice or a written consent to hold the meeting, or who signs an approval of the minutes of such meeting. Notice need not be given a Director who attends the meeting without protesting, prior thereto or at its commencement, the lack of notice to such Director. All such waivers, consents and approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made part of the minutes of the meeting.

Section 13. QUORUM. A majority of the authorized number of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, except to adjourn, as provided in Section 14. Every act or decision done or made by a majority of the Directors present at a meeting duly held at which a quorum is present shall be regarded as the act of the Board of Directors subject to the provisions of Section 5233 of the Corporations Code of California (as to approval of contracts or transactions in which a Director has a direct or indirect material financial interest), Section 5212 of that Code (as to appointment of committees), and Section 5238 of that Code (as to indemnification of directors). A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business notwithstanding the withdrawal of Directors, if any action taken is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum for that meeting.

Section 14. ACTION BY BOARD WITHOUT A MEETING. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting, if all members of the Board shall individually or collectively consent in writing to such action. Such written consent or consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board. Such action by written consent shall have the same force and effect as the unanimous vote of such Directors.

Section 15. ADJOURNMENT. A majority of the Directors present, whether or not constituting a quorum, may adjourn any meeting to another time and place.

Section 16. FEES AND COMPENSATION OF DIRECTORS. Directors and members of committees may receive such compensation, if any, for their services, and such reimbursement of expenses, as may be fixed or determined by resolution of the Board of Directors. This Section 15 shall not be construed to preclude any Director from serving the Corporation in any other capacity as an officer, agent, employee, or otherwise, and receiving compensation for those services.

ARTICLE III

COMMITTEES

Section 1. COMMITTEES OF DIRECTORS. The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the authorized number of Directors, designate one or more committees, each consisting of two or more Directors, to serve at the pleasure of the Board. The Board may designate one or more Directors as alternate members of any committee, who may replace any absent member at any meeting of the committee. Any committee, to the extent provided in the resolution of the Board, shall have all the authority of the Board, except with respect to:

- (a) The filling of vacancies in any committee;
- (b) The fixing of compensation of the Directors for serving on the Board or on any committee;
- (c) The amendment or repeal of Bylaws or the adoption of new Bylaws;
- (d) The amendment or repeal of any resolution of the Board of Directors which by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable;
- (e) The appointment of any other committees of the Board of Directors or the members of these committees.

Section 2. MEETINGS AND ACTION OF COMMITTEES. Meetings and action of committees shall be governed by, and held and taken in accordance with, the provisions of Article II of these Bylaws, with such changes in the context of those Bylaws as are necessary to substitute the committee and the committee members for the Board of Directors, except that the time of regular meetings of committees may be determined either by resolution of the Board of Directors or by resolution of the committee; special meetings of committees may also be called by resolution of the Board of Directors; and notice of special meetings of committees shall also be given to all alternate committee members, who shall have the right to attend all meetings of the committee. The Board of Directors may adopt rules for the governance of any committee not inconsistent with the provisions of these Bylaws.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS

Section 1. OFFICERS. The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chair, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. The Corporation may also have, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, a Vice Chair of the Board, one or more Assistant Secretaries, one or more Assistant Treasurers, and such other officers as may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of this Article IV. Any number of offices may be held by the same person.

Section 2. ELECTION OF OFFICERS. The officers of the Corporation, except such officers as may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 or Section 5 of this Article IV, shall be chosen by the Board of Directors, and each shall serve at the pleasure of the Board, subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment.

Section 3. SUBORDINATE OFFICERS. The Board of Directors may appoint, and may empower the Chair to appoint, such other officers as the business of the Corporation may require, each of whom shall hold office for such period, have such authority and perform such duties as are provided in the Bylaws or as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

Section 4. REMOVAL AND RESIGNATION OF OFFICERS. Subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment, any officer may be removed, either with or without cause, by the Board of Directors, at any regular or special meeting of the Board, or, except in case of an officer chosen by the Board of Directors, by any officer upon whom such power of removal may be conferred by the Board of Directors.

Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Corporation. Any resignation shall take effect on the date of receipt of that notice or at any later time specified in that notice; and, unless otherwise specified in that notice, the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. Any resignation is without prejudice to the rights, if any, of the Corporation under any contract to which the officer is a party.

Section 5. VACANCIES IN OFFICES. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or any other cause shall be filled in the manner prescribed in these Bylaws for regular appointments to that office.

Section 6. CHAIR OF THE BOARD. The Chair of the Board, shall, if present, preside at meetings of the Board of Directors and exercise and perform such other powers and duties as may be from time to time assigned to him by the Board of Directors or prescribed by the Bylaws. The Chair of the Board shall in addition be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and shall, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, have general supervision, direction, and control of the business and the affairs of the Corporation. He shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of President of a Corporation, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be presented by the Board of Directors of the Bylaws.

Section 7. VICE CHAIR OF THE BOARD. In the absence or disability of the Chair of the Board, the Vice-Chair designated by the Board of Directors, if any, shall perform all the

duties of the Chair, and when so acting shall have all the powers of, and be subject to all the restrictions upon, the Chair. The Vice-Chair shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as from time to time may be prescribed for him or her respectively by the Board of Directors or the Bylaws, or the Chair of the Board.

Section 8. SECRETARY. The secretary shall keep or cause to be kept, at the principal executive office or such other place as the Board of Directors may direct, a book of minutes of all meetings and actions of Directors and/or committees of Directors, with the time and place of holding such meeting, whether regular or special, and, if special, how authorized, the notice given, the names of those present.

The secretary shall give, or cause to be given, notice of all meetings of the Board of Directors required by the Bylaws or by law to be given, and shall keep the seal of the Corporation, if one be adopted, in safe custody, and shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or by the Bylaws.

Section 9. TREASURER. The Treasurer shall keep and maintain, or cause to be kept and maintained, adequate and correct books and records of accounts of the properties and business transactions of the Corporation, including accounts of its assets, liabilities, receipts, disbursements, gains, and losses. The books of account shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by any Director.

The Treasurer shall deposit all moneys and other valuables in the name and to the credit of the Corporation with such depositories as may be designated by the Board of Directors. He shall disburse the funds of the Corporation as may be ordered by the Board of Directors, shall render to the President and Directors, whenever they request it, an account of all of his transactions as Treasurer and of the financial condition of the Corporation, and shall have other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or the Bylaws.

ARTICLE V

INDEMNIFICATION OF DIRECTORS, OFFICERS, EMPLOYEES AND OTHER AGENTS

The Corporation shall, to the maximum extent permitted by the California Non-Profit Corporation Law, indemnify each of its agents against expenses, judgments, fines, settlements and other amounts actually and reasonably incurred in connection with any proceeding arising by reason of the fact any such person is or was an agent of the Corporation. For purposes of this Section, an "agent" of the Corporation includes any person who is or was a Director, officer, employee, or other agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a Director, officer, employee, or agent of another Corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, or was a Director, officer, employee, or agent of a corporation which was a predecessor corporation of the Corporation or of another enterprise at the request of such predecessor corporation.

ARTICLE VI

RECORDS AND REPORTS

Section 1. MAINTENANCE AND INSPECTION OF BYLAWS. The Corporation shall keep at its principal executive office, or if its principal executive office is not in the State of California, at its principal business office in this state, the original or a copy of the Bylaws as amended to date.

Section 2. MAINTENANCE AND INSPECTION OF OTHER CORPORATE RECORDS. The accounting books and records and minutes of proceedings of the members of the Board of Directors and any committee or committees of the Board of Directors shall be kept at such place or places designated by the Board of Directors, or, in the absence of such designation, at the principal executive office of the Corporation. The minutes shall be kept in written form and the accounting books and records shall be kept either in written form or in any other form capable of being converted into written form.

Section 3. INSPECTION BY DIRECTORS. Every Director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect all books, records, and documents of every kind and the physical properties of the Corporation and each of its subsidiary Corporations. This inspection by a Director may be made in person or by an agent or attorney and the right of inspection includes the right to copy and make extracts of documents.

Section 4. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS. A copy of any annual financial statement and any income statement of the Corporation for each quarterly period of each fiscal year, and any accompanying balance sheet of the Corporation as of the end of each such period, that has been prepared by the Corporation shall be kept on file in the principal executive office of the Corporation.

Section 5. ANNUAL REPORT. An annual report shall be prepared. The annual report shall be presented within four (4) months of the end of each fiscal year to the publicly-supported organization that this Corporation supported during the most recent fiscal year. The purpose of the annual report shall be to assist the beneficiary organization in ensuring that this Corporation has invested its endowment in assets productive of a reasonable rate of return (taking appreciation into account).

ARTICLE VII

GENERAL CORPORATE MATTERS

Section 1. CHECKS, DRAFTS, EVIDENCES OF INDEBTEDNESS. All checks, drafts, or other orders for payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness, issued in the name of or payable to the Corporation, shall be signed or endorsed by such person or persons and in such manner as, from time to time, shall be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. CORPORATE CONTRACTS AND INSTRUMENTS; HOW EXECUTED. The Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and this authority may be general or confined to specific instances; and, unless so authorized or ratified by the Board of Directors or within the agency power of an officer, no officer, agent, or employee shall have any power or authority to bind the Corporation by any contract or engagement or to pledge its credit or to render it liable for any purpose or for any amount.

Section 3. CONSTRUCTION AND DEFINITIONS. Unless the context requires otherwise, the general provisions, rules of construction, and definitions in the California Non-Profit Corporation Law shall govern the construction of these Bylaws. The Corporation shall, however, be governed by a Board of Directors and any reference in said laws to "Directors" or to the "Board of Directors" shall be deemed to refer to said Board of Directors. Without limiting the generality of this provision, the singular number includes the plural, the plural number includes the singular, and the term "person" includes both a Corporation and a natural person.

ARTICLE VIII

SUPPORTED ORGANIZATION

Section 1. SUPPORT FOR SUPPORTED ORGANIZATION. A majority of The Board of Trustees shall annually determine the amount of support it shall contribute to the publicly-supported organization designated in the Articles of Incorporation of this organization.

ARTICLE IX

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. AMENDMENT BY TRUSTEES. New Bylaws may be adopted or these Bylaws may be amended or repealed by the vote of a majority of a quorum of Trustees, except that new or amended Bylaws may not change the authorized number of Trustees unless such change is approved by at least eighty percent (80%) of the Trustees.
