GRANTS PASS HIGH SCHOOL FOUNDATION, INC. AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLE 1

The name of this corporation is Josephine County Educational Fund, Inc.

ARTICLE II

The purpose, or purposes, for which this Corporation is organized are to receive, hold, care for, invest in, and operate real and personal property, and to use, and distribute, from time to time, all the income and principal as well, which shall be received through charitable gifts, to be applied consistently with existing laws for the benefit of an indefinite number of persons, by providing educational and vocational scholarships, grants, travel expenses, and any other miscellaneous expenses which in the opinion of the Board of Directors of the Corporation will tend to further the educational and cultural achievements of residents of the State of Oregon with an emphasis on Josephine County, Oregon, residents, and by erecting or maintaining public buildings or works; or by otherwise lessening the burden of government. Such funds may be used and distributed for such purposes, or for one or more, within or without the County of Josephine, State of Oregon. It is the intent and purpose that the said Corporation shall be organized and operated exclusively for charitable, cultural, or educational purposes, within the classification of legal charities, and no part of the net earnings nor of the principal shall inure to the benefit of any private individual and no substantial part of the activities of such Corporation, or of any recipient of its funds shall be to carry on propaganda or otherwise to attempt to influence legislation. In the event of dissolution of the Corporation, any and all funds and property in its possession shall be distributed to School District No.7 in Josephine County, Oregon, in Trust, for educational or charitable purposes recognized as being tax exempt under the Income and Inheritance Tax Laws of the State of Oregon then in effect.

BYLAWS OF JOSEPHINE COUNTY EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC.

ARTICLE I A NONPOROFIT ENTITY; MEMBERS

The corporation is a nonprofit, public benefit corporation, and it has no members.

ARTICLE II PURPOSES

The purpose or purposes for which this corporation is organized are to receive. hold, care for, invest in and operate real and personal property, and to use and distribute from time to time all the income and all principal as well, which shall be received through charitable gifts, to be consistently with existing laws for the benefit or an indefinite number of persons, by providing educational and vocational scholarships. grants, travel expenses, and any other miscellaneous expenses which in the opinion of the Board of Directors of the Corporation will tend to further the educational and cultural achievements of residents of the State of Oregon; and by erecting or maintaining public buildings or works; or by otherwise lessening the burden of government. Such funds may be used and distributed for such purposes, or for one or more, within the State of Oregon. It is the intent and purpose that the said corporation shall be organized and operated exclusively for charitable, cultural, or educational purposes, within the classification of legal charities, and no part of the net earnings nor of the principal shall inure to the benefit of any private individual and no substantial part of the activities of such corporation, or of any recipient of its funds shall be to carry on propaganda or otherwise to attempt to influence legislation.

ARTICLE III DIRECTORS; MANAGEMENT

Section 1. POWERS

The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors which shall exercise or direct the exercise of all corporate powers. The Corporation Board shall have all power necessary to carry our the Corporation's purposes and activities incidental to those purposes, but shall have no power to do anything not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

Section 2. NUMBER

The Board of Directors shall consist of at least seven Directors and may consist of as many as fifteen Directors. The exact number within such range shall be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors until the minimum and maximum numbers in such range are changed by amendment of these Bylaws. No reduction of

the number of Directors shall have the effect of removing any director from office prior to the expiration of his or her term of office.

Section 3. ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND TERMS

Directors shall be elected to the Board on a staggered basis by a majority of those Directors present at the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation at which a quorum is present. Each year at the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors, the newly-constituted Board will meet and elect from its members the Corporation's officers.

Directors shall be divided into three Classes (Classes A, B and C) with each Class including up to five directorships. The composition of each Class need not be uniform. Within each Class, the term of office for an elected Director shall be three years to begin on the 1st day of July next ensuing after his or her election, except such elections as are made to fill vacancies or unexpired terms. Each member of the Board of Directors shall serve for the term of his or her office and until his or her successor is elected and qualified. Directors may be elected for successive terms without limitation.

Section 4. VACANCIES

- (a) A vacancy in the Board of Directors shall exist upon the death, resignation or removal of any director, or upon any increase in the number of directorships or authorized Directors.
- (b) Vacancies in the Board of Directors may be filled by a majority of the Remaining Directors though less than a quorum, or by a sole remaining director. Each director elected shall hold office for the balance of the unexpired term of his predecessor and until his or her qualified successor is elected and accepts office.
- (c) If the Board of Directors accepts the resignation of a director tendered to take effect at a future time, a successor may be elected to take office when the resignation becomes effective.

Section 5. MEETINGS

- (a) Special meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at such place and at such times as may be designated from time to time by the President or any three Directors. Any demand made by Directors for the call of a special meeting must be presented in writing to the President of the Corporation at least ten (10) days prior to the desired date of such meeting and must specify the purpose or purposes of such meeting.
- (b) The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held each year in the month of June at such time and at such place as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

(c) Meetings of the Board of Directors may be held by conference telephone or similar communication equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and participation in such meeting such constitute presence at the meeting.

Section 6. NOTICE OF MEETINGS

- (a) Notice of the time and place of meetings shall be given orally or delivered in writing personally or by mail or by email or by facsimile transmission at least five (5) days before the meeting. Notice mailed or emailed shall be directed to the address shown on the corporate records or to the director's actual address ascertained by the person giving the notice. All notices of special meetings shall describe the matters to be presented to the Board.
- (b) Notice of the time and place of holding an adjourned meeting need not be given if such time and place be fixed at the meeting adjourned.
- (c) Attendance of a director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting except where a director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened and such director does not thereafter vote or assent to any action taken at the meeting.

Section 7. QUORUM AND VOTE

A majority of the number of directors fixed by Section 2 of this Article III shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business are any meeting of the Board of Directors, but if less than a quorum is present ar a meeting, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

Section 8. MANNER OF ACTING

The act of the majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors.

Section 9. VACANCIES

Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining directors though less than a quorum of the Board of Directors. A director elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

Section 10. REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS

Directors may be removed without cause by a vote of two-thirds of the Directors then in office.

Section 11. PRESUMPTION OF ASSENT.

A Director of the corporation who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors at which action on any corporate matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting or unless he shall file his written dissent to such action with the person acting as the secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof or shall forward such dissent by registered mail to the Secretary of the corporation immediately after the adjournment of the meeting. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a Director who voted in favor of such action.

Section 12. Any action required to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors, or any other action which may be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the Directors.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS

Section 1. NUMBER

The officers of the corporation shall be a President, one or more Vice-Presidents (the number thereof to be determined by the Board of Directors). A Secretary, and a Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Directors. Such other officers and assistant officers as may be deemed necessary may be elected or appointed by the Board of Directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of President and Secretary.

Section 2. ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE

The officers of the corporation to be elected by the Board of Directors shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at its regular June Meeting. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. Each officer shall hold office until his successor have been duly elected and shall have qualified or until his death or until he shall resign or shall have been removed in the manner hereinafter provided.

Section 3, REMOVAL

Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the corporation would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.

Section 4. VACANCIES

A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

Section 5. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Board of Directors shall have the authority to appoint an Executive Director, who shall, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, have such duties, powers and authority as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Executive Director may be paid a salary as established by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. PRESIDENT

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and will be the chief executive officer of the Corporation. The President will have authority to execute agreements and other instruments on behalf of the Corporation and the power to authenticate the records of the Corporation, will have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the chief executive officer of a corporation and will have such other powers and duties as the Board of Directors shall prescribe.

Section 7. VICE PRESIDENTS

In the absence of the President or in the event of his death, inability or refusal to act, the Vice-President (or in the event there be more than one Vice-President, the Vice-Presidents in the order designated at the time of their election, or in the absence of any designation, then in the order of their election) shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. Any Vice-President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the President or by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. SECRETARY

The Secretary shall prepare the minutes of each meeting or Directors and shall keep or cause to be kept at the registered office, or such other place as the Board of Directors may order, a book of minutes of all meetings of Directors showing time and place of the meeting, whether it was regular or special, and if special, how authorized, the notice given, the names of those present and the proceedings thereof. The Secretary or the Executive Director, if any, shall give or cause to be given such notice of the meetings of the Board of Directors as is required by the Bylaws. The Secretary shall have such other powers and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or these Bylaws. In the absence of the Secretary, the Board of Directors shall designate the person attending each meeting of the Directors to prepare the minutes for such meeting. In addition, the Secretary shall have the power to authenticate all records of the Corporation and, in the absence of the President, the power to execute agreements and other instruments on behalf of the Corporation.

Section 9. TREASURER

The Treasurer shall: (a) have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Corporation; receive and give receipts for moneys due and payable to the corporation from any source whatsoever, and deposit all such moneys in

the name of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositaries as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws; and (b) in general perform all of the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the President of by the Board of Directors.

Section 10. ASSISTANTS

The Board of Directors may appoint or authorize the appointment of assistants to the Secretary or Treasurer or both. Such assistants need not be Directors and may exercise the power of Secretary or Treasurer, as the case may be in the absence or disability of those persons, and shall perform such duties as are prescribed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V COMMITTEES

Section 1. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Subject to law, the provisions of the articles of incorporation and these Bylaws, the Board of Directors may appoint an Executive Committee, consisting of the officers of the Corporation and at least one other Director, and having the power to conduct the business of the Corporation between meetings of the Board of Directors and having such other powers as permitted by law. The Executive Committee members shall hold office at the pleasure of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. COMMITTEES

Subject to law, the provisions of the articles of incorporation and these Bylaws, the Board of Directors may appoint such other committees as may be necessary from time to time, having such powers as designated by the Board of Directors. Such committee members shall hold office at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. Such committees may be standing in nature and shall be advisory only and not exercise powers vested in the Board of Directors by law. Members of such committees need not be Directors of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VI CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Section 1. DEFINITION

Conflict of interest is defined as the taking of an official Corporation action that may result in financial benefit or avoiding a negative financial effect on the Director, the Director's relative, or a business or endeavor with which the Director or the Director's relative is associated.

Section 2. DECLARATION OF CONFLICT OF INTEREST

If a Director of the Corporation is met with a potential or actual conflict of interest involving a Board deliberation, that Director shall fully disclose to the Board the nature of the conflict and declare the conflict prior to discussion, recommendation, vote or any action taken thereon by the Board, acting in his or her capacity as a Director of the Corporation. Such conflict shall be recorded in the minutes of the Corporation.

Section 3. POTENTIAL AND ACTUAL CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Individual Corporation Directors who have declared a potential conflict of interest may participate in official action after declaring such conflict, if the Board concurs that it is a potential conflict. Individual Corporation Directors who declared an actual conflict of interest (or who have not convinced the Board that is a potential conflict) must refrain from taking any official action on the issue.

Section 4. SUPPLEMENTS TO THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

The above three Sections in this Article VI may, from time to time, be supplemented by the Board of Directors in developing a more comprehensive conflict of interest policy as the same may be deemed necessary or appropriate in the course of the Corporation's dealings with others.

ARTICLE VII CONTRACTS, LOANS, CHECKS AND DEPOSITS

Section 1. CONTRACTS

The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. LOANS

No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the corporation and no evidence of indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the Board of Directors. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 3. CHECKS, DRAFTS, ETC.

All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. DEPOSITS

All funds of the Corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositaries as the Board of Directors may select.

ARTICLE VIII FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the corporation shall begin on the first day of March and end on the last day of February in each year.

ARTICLE IX AMENDMENTS

These By-Laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new By-Laws may be adopted by the Board of Directors at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution of the Corporation any and all funds and property in its possession shall be distributed to School District No. 7 and to Three Rivers School District in Josephine County, Oregon, in trust, for educational or charitable purposes recognized as being tax exempt under the income and inheritance tax laws of the State of Oregon then in effect. The amount to be distributed to School District No. 7 and to Three Rivers School shall be made in the sole discretion of the Board of Directors.
