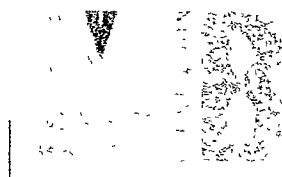

1. Nature of the Business and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of the Business

The Mario Batali Foundation (the "Foundation") was established on April 7, 2008, to advance the well being of children. To accomplish this goal, the Foundation focuses on areas which can have a deep and lasting impact on children's lives including education, health services, and access to appropriate social services. The Foundation is primarily a grant giving organization supporting these necessary services to nurture and foster healthier children.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and in accordance with the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' Audit and Accounting Guide, *Not-for-Profit Organizations*, and other pronouncements applicable to not-for-profit organizations.

Financial Statement Presentation

The classification of net assets and its support, revenue and expenses is based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. The classification requirement is that the amounts for each of three classes of net assets (e.g. unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted), be displayed in the statements of financial position and that the amounts of change in each of those classes of net assets be displayed in the statement of activities and change in net assets. These classes of net assets are briefly defined as follows:

Unrestricted

Unrestricted net assets are all resources over which the governing board has discretionary control. The governing board of the Foundation may elect to designate such resources for specific purposes. Board designated net assets are presented on the statements of financial position. This designation may be removed at the Board's discretion not externally restricted for identified purposes by donors or grantors.

Temporarily Restricted

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use has been limited by the donors to a specific period or purpose. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reported as net assets released from restrictions.

Permanently restricted

Permanently restricted net assets are endowment resources accumulated through donations or grants that are subject to the restriction in perpetuity that the principal be invested. Investment income may be either an unrestricted or temporarily restricted resource when earned, determined according to the gift instruments.

Contributions received with donor restrictions, where the restriction expires in the period of receipt, are recorded as unrestricted contributions. As of March 31, 2012 and 2011, the Foundation had no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting policies generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of the revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Accordingly, actual results could differ from these estimates. Significant estimates include the allowance for uncollectible contributions receivable and the valuation of certain accrued expenses.

Contributions, Contributions Receivable and Revenue Recognition

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes a cash donation or promise to give to the Foundation that is, in substance, unconditional. According to the professional standards for contributions received, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions. Contributions that are restricted by the donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions expire in the fiscal year in which the contributions are recognized. All other donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets depending on the nature of the restrictions. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets.

Unconditional promises to give are recorded at fair value at the date the promise is received. Unconditional promises to give that are expected to be received after one year are discounted at a risk-free interest rate determined annually and amortization of the discount is included in campaign gifts and pledges. Conditional promises to give are reported at fair value at the date the condition is met.

Special events may be part contribution and part exchange transaction. The portion of a special event payment that is a contribution is recognized as such and the exchange transaction portion is recognized after the special event takes place (that is, after the benefits are provided to the donors). The exchange portion of the payment is classified as deferred revenue in the statement of financial position if the special event has not taken place before the end of the fiscal year. At March 31, 2012 and 2011, deferred revenue was \$0 and \$10,000, respectively.

The Foundation uses the allowance method to determine uncollectible contributions receivable. The allowance is based on prior years experience and management's analysis of specific promises made. There are no allowances related to such receivables as of March 31, 2012 or 2011.

Fund-raising Activities

Revenues from ongoing major fund raising activities are reported as special events revenues. Expenses associated with ongoing fund-raising activities are expensed as incurred and reported as special events expense. Fund-raising activities that are deemed to be one-time or incidental events are reported as net amounts in the Foundation's statement of activities and changes in net assets. Included in special events expense is net fund-raising income of \$7,434 from two incidental events held during the year ended March 31, 2012.

Cash and Concentration of Credit Risk

Cash consists of cash in the bank. The Foundation maintains its operating cash balances in interest bearing accounts with financial institutions insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC") up to \$250,000 per depositor. As of March 31, 2012, balances of cash exceeded the federally insured limit. Management monitors regularly the financial condition of the banking institution, along with their balances of cash and endeavors to keep this potential risk at a minimum. There have been no losses incurred during the year.

Grants

Grants are recorded as expenditures at the time of unconditional approval by the Trustees. Grants authorized with conditions are recorded at the time the related conditions have been fulfilled. At March 31, 2012 and 2011, there were outstanding conditional grants of \$15,000 and \$139,000 respectively, payable when grantees meet specified conditions.

Income Taxes

The Foundation is a tax-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code determined in their letter of approval dated March 30, 2009, and related income is not subject to Federal, state and local income taxes. The Foundation follows the accounting pronouncement dealing with

uncertain tax positions. Tax positions are evaluated for recognition using a more-likely-than-not threshold, and those tax positions requiring recognition are measured at the largest amount of tax benefit that is greater than 50 percent likely of being realized upon ultimate settlement with a taxing authority that has full knowledge of all relevant information. The Foundation had no unrecognized tax benefits at March 31, 2012 and 2011.

The Foundation has evaluated the likelihood of its tax exempt status being challenged as remote. Accordingly, the Foundation has not included any income tax provisions or any potential liabilities for taxes on unrelated business income, including interest and penalties, in the financial statements related to potential violations of their tax exempt status. There are no tax related interest or penalties included in the financial statements presented.

The Foundation files tax returns in the U.S. federal jurisdiction and various states. The Foundation has no open years prior to 2009, the fiscal year of inception.

Functional Expenses

Program, special events and general and administrative expenses were approximately 50%, 22% and 27% for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2012. For the fiscal year ended March 31, 2011, program, special events and general and administrative expenses were approximately 44%, 20% and 35%. The general and administrative expenses ratio for fiscal year ended March 31, 2012 and 2011 includes a significant portion of donated professional services rendered in relation to the operations of the Foundation.

2. Non-Monetary Transactions

Non-monetary transactions should be recorded in a similar manner as monetary transactions. That is, they should be based on fair values of the donated services involved. Certain donated services require recognition as contribution revenue in the period received at fair value. In many instances the contribution revenue would be offset by additional expenses based on the nature of the donated services. Donated services are recognized in the financial statements at their fair value if the following criteria are met:

- The services required specialized skills and the services are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and the services would typically need to be purchased if not donated, or
- The services enhance or create an asset.

For the fiscal years ended March 31, 2012 and 2011, the Foundation received \$44,381 and \$83,943, respectively, of donated professional services which comprised of:

Although the Foundation utilizes the services of many outside volunteers, the fair value of these services is not recognized in the accompanying financial statements since they do not meet the criteria for recognition under generally accepted accounting principles.

3. Related Party Transactions

During 2012, the Foundation recorded contributions from its President in the amount of \$105,508. No such contributions were received by the Foundation in 2011. At March 31, 2012 and 2011, contribution receivable due from the President was \$17,492 and \$0, respectively.

4. Subsequent Events

The Foundation has evaluated subsequent events occurring after the statement of financial position through the date of August 24, 2012, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Based on this evaluation, the Foundation has determined that no subsequent events have occurred which require disclosure in the financial statements.
