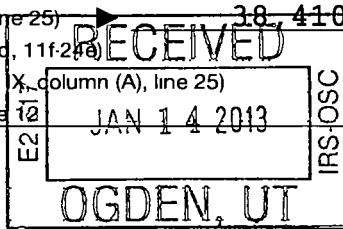

THE PARTICIPANTS PAY UP TO 30% OF THEIR INCOME TOWARDS RENT AND UTILITIES AND THE BALANCE IS PAID DIRECTLY TO THE LANDLORD THROUGH HUD FUNDING. APPROXIMATELY 400 HOUSEHOLDS WERE SERVED.

COMMUNITY SERVICES BLOCK GRANT (CSBG AND MNCA) - MVAC OFFICES IN EACH COUNTY PROVIDES OUT-REACH SERVICES TO THE LOW-INCOME AND ELDERLY. THE OFFICES SERVE AS THE KEY SOCIAL SERVICE PROVIDER FOR CLIENT RECRUITMENT, NEEDS ASSESSMENT, AND REFERRAL FOR ALL MVAC PROGRAMS.
