# Grant Application Information - Program Persons in Need (PIN) Grants

#### **Funding Opportunity**

The Persons in Need (PIN) program provides block grants to community-based service organizations, which in turn distribute these funds in the form of financial assistance for eligible adults and children. Assistance from the Teresa Hughes Trust is intended to provide financial help in areas where other services are unavailable. Grantees may propose an administrative fee (maximum 10% of grant) for administering these funds.

#### **Eligibility Criteria**

The two groups of individuals eligible for assistance are Adults and Children.

#### **ADULTS**

#### Eligible adult means a person who (ALL criteria must be applicable for each adult):

- (1) is at least 70 years of age
- (2) is physically or mentally ill
- (3) is in financial need
- (4) resides in Hawai`i

<u>Assistance for eligible adults include costs of</u>: assistive devices, clothing, day care, dental needs, dietary needs, food, furniture, housekeeping, housing, medical expenses for health care, prescriptions, private hire, professional fees, recreation, respite care, therapy, transportation & utilities.

#### **CHILDREN**

#### Eligible child means a person who (ALL criteria must be applicable for each child):

- (1) is under the age of 18
- (2) has been abused, neglected or abandoned, or resides in a household where abuse has occurred
- (3) is in financial need
- (4) resides in Hawai'i

#### Examples\* of assistance to children:

- (1) Extracurricular school expenses (e.g., athletic uniforms, field trip fees)
- (2) Social activity expenses (e.g., prom or graduation attire)
- (3) After-school activities, hobbies, sports (e.g., hula lessons, soccer registration)
- (4) Intersession school activities (e.g., summer camp)
- (5) Facilitation of transition into adulthood (e.g., driver's education, copy of birth certificate)
- (6) Other quality of life enhancements (e.g., birthday/Christmas gifts -\$50 maximum, books, toys)
- (7) School-related expenses (e.g., tuition, books, fees, tutoring, pre-school)
- (8) Health-related expenses (e.g., medical, dental, therapy, counseling)
- (9) Basic needs (e.g., clothing, baby furniture) Expenditures in this category require explanation.

# \*NOTE: ANY OTHER ASSISTANCE, INCLUDING OUT-OF-STATE TRAVEL, REQUIRES PRIOR APPROVAL FROM THE TRUST.

#### THE FOLLOWING RESTRICTIONS APPLY TO ADULTS AND CHILDREN:

- (1) Each expenditure must respond to a specific request made by an eligible individual's foster caregiver, social worker, therapist, school counselor, guardian ad litem, or similar professional service provider for a specific item or service that will enhance the individual's quality of life.
- (2) Payments must be made to vendors for the benefit of eligible individuals. Payments must NOT be made directly to individuals or their foster caregivers. Gift Cards may be provided to individuals or foster caregivers ONLY in cases where a vendor declines to accept a grantee's check.
- (3) Grantees may not expend more than \$500 per eligible individual unless prior approval is obtained from Bank of Hawaii Foundation Administration.
- (4) Grantees must return all unexpended funds by the report due date, or request an extension on the use of the funds.
- (5) Grantees must submit a Final Report by April 30 of the year following the date of the award. The Trustees may require interim reports. The Trust does not accept proposals from organizations with overdue reports.

#### **APPLICATION PROCEDURE**

#### Submit three (3) completed sets of the proposal containing:

- (A) Funding Request cover sheet, which can be copied from the sample provided on Page 4.
- (B) Proposal Narrative <u>Use these 7 headings as listed</u> (Maximum 3 double-spaced pages, 12-point font.)
  - 1) Organization: Briefly describe your organization's mission and programs.
  - 2) <u>Population to be Served</u>: Provide an estimated UNDUPLICATED number and age range of the eligible individuals you propose to serve.
  - 3) <u>PIN Funds</u>: Describe any programs your organization currently offers that will be complemented by the PIN program.
  - 4) Outreach: Describe how your organization will market the availability of the PIN program to the community you propose to serve. Provide an estimated UNDUPLICATED number and percentage of individuals served who will be clients of your organization and those who will be referrals from outside of your organization's client base.
  - 5) <u>Staff</u>: Describe the qualifications of the staff or volunteers who will oversee and coordinate the PIN program.
  - 6) Evaluation: Describe how your organization will evaluate the impact of the PIN program.
  - 7) Administrative Fee: Disclose any fee if applicable. Fee is limited to 10% of grant amount. STATEMENT GUIDE-1

#### Attach the following 7 items in the order listed to each of the 3 sets of the proposal:

- 1. PIN Program Budget (with timeline) provide the following information:
  - a. Income include sources, amounts, restrictions, and whether secured or unsecured; and
  - b. Expenses including proposed administration fee, if any.
- 2. Organization's current operating budget (indicate start and end date of fiscal year).
- 3. Organization's current balance sheet (dated and not older than three months).
- 4. Organization's income statement (or profit/loss statement) for the most recently completed fiscal year (indicate start and end date of fiscal year).
- 5. Current list of governing board members, including their professional or community affiliation.
- 6. IRS 501(c) (3) determination letter. (First time applicants only)
- 7. If applicable, a final or interim report for Teresa Hughes Trust PIN funds received during the prior year.

### Deadline: Applications must be postmarked by April 30.

Notification of award decisions will be made approximately 60 days after deadline.
