

## Noncash transactions

In 2011, the Hospital entered into capital lease obligations, acquiring assets with a value of \$278,000. The lease commitments and capital assets have been treated as noncash transactions.

During 2011, the Hospital refinanced its Series 1998A and 2001A Bonds (\$8,347,822) by issuing Series 2010B Bonds (\$9,069,522) The Series 2010B Bonds and the retirement of the Series 1998A and 2001A Bonds have been treated as noncash transactions

## 1. Nature of Operations

Mount Desert Island Hospital (the Hospital) is a not-for-profit health care facility designated as a critical access hospital located in Bar Harbor, Maine. Birch Bay Retirement Village (BBRV or the Community) operates a facility (the Inn) consisting of 32 assisted living and 23 independent living units. Mount Desert Management Company (MDMC) is a for-profit entity (owned by BBRV) established to develop cottages, which are part of the Community and are located in close proximity to the Inn. Once the cottages are completed and sold, ownership of the cottages is transferred from MDMC to Birch Bay Village Association (BBVA or Association). The Association is a separate entity owned by the shareholders/cottage owners. Its assets, liabilities and operations are not included in these financial statements.

## 2. Summary of Accounting Policies

## **Principles of Consolidation**

The accompanying financial statements include the accounts of the Hospital and its wholly-owned subsidiaries, BBRV and its subsidiary MDMC. Intercompany balances and transactions have been eliminated from the consolidated financial statements.

#### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

## **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Highly liquid savings deposits and investments with maturities of three months or less when purchased are considered cash equivalents.

The Hospital maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. It has experienced no losses in such accounts, and management believes it is not exposed to any significant risk on cash and cash equivalents.

#### **Accounts Receivable**

Accounts receivable are stated at the amount management expects to collect from outstanding balances. Management provides for probable uncollectible amounts through a charge to operations and a credit to a valuation allowance based on its assessment of individual accounts and historical adjustments. Balances that are still outstanding after management has used reasonable collection efforts are written off through a charge to the valuation allowance and a credit to patient accounts receivable.

#### **Notes to Consolidated Financial Statements**

#### **Investments**

Investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are measured at fair value in the consolidated balance sheets. Investment income or loss (including realized gains and losses on investments, amortization of premiums and discounts, interest and dividends) is included in other income, unless the income or loss is restricted by donor or law. Gains and losses on sales of investments are computed based on specific identification of the investment sold. Unrealized gains and losses on investments are excluded from the deficiency of revenues, gains and other support over expenses. On a periodic basis, the Hospital evaluates its investments to determine if declines in market value below cost are other than temporary. If such declines are determined to be other than temporary, an impairment charge is recognized and included in the deficiency of revenues, gains and other support over expenses.

Investments in general are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. As such, it is reasonably possible that changes in the value of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the balance sheets and statements of operations.

## **Inventoried Supplies**

Inventoried supplies and pharmaceuticals are carried at the lower of cost (determined by the first-in, first-out method) or market.

#### Assets Limited as to Use

In connection with its bonds payable to Maine Health and Higher Educational Facilities Authority (MHHEFA), the Hospital is required to maintain certain funds which are held by bond trustees. In addition, the Board of Trustees periodically segregates certain general fund assets as internally designated assets in order to provide for the future replacement of property and equipment and other uses.

#### Temporarily and Permanently Restricted Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets are those whose use by the Hospital has been limited by donors to a specific time period or purpose. Permanently restricted net assets represent assets held in trust on behalf of the Hospital restricted by donors to be maintained in perpetuity.

#### **Deferred Financing Costs**

Deferred financing costs represent costs incurred in connection with the outstanding bonds payable to MHHEFA and are being amortized on a straight-line basis over the term of the respective debt.

#### **Property and Equipment**

Property and equipment is stated at cost or at fair value at the date of donation for assets contributed to the Hospital. The provision for amortization and depreciation of property and equipment has been determined on the straight-line method in a manner which is intended to amortize the cost of assets over their estimated useful lives. Assets which have been purchased but not yet placed in service are included in construction in progress and no depreciation expense is recorded on such assets.

Gifts of long-lived assets such as land, buildings, or equipment are reported as unrestricted support, and excluded from the deficiency of revenues, gains, and other support over expenses, unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long those long-lived assets must be maintained, expirations of donor restrictions are reported when the donated or acquired long-lived assets are placed in service.

## Net Patient Service Revenue

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments to the Hospital at amounts different from its established rates. Payment arrangements include prospectively determined rates per discharge, reimbursed costs, discounted charges and per diem payments. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payors, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payors. Retroactive adjustments are accrued on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered and adjusted in future periods as final settlements are determined and may be materially different from these estimates. Changes in these estimates are reflected in the consolidated statements in the year in which they occur. Patient services rendered from which payment is expected but ultimately is not received are written off and included as part of the provision for bad debts.

## **Donor-Restricted Gifts**

Unconditional promises to give cash and other assets to the Hospital are reported at fair value at the date the promise is received. The gifts are reported as either temporarily or permanently restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified as unrestricted net assets and reported in the consolidated statements of operations as net assets released from restrictions.

## **Free and Discounted Care**

The Hospital provides care to patients who meet certain criteria under its free and discounted care policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because the Hospital does not

pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as free and discounted care, they are not reported as revenue. The Hospital maintains records to identify the amount of charges foregone for services and supplies furnished under its free and discounted care policy, as well as the estimated cost of those services and supplies and equivalent service statistics. The following information measures the level of free and discounted care provided during the year ended April 30:

Cost of providing free and discounted care services has been estimated based on an overall financial statement ratio of costs to charges applied to free and discounted care charges forgone.

## Deficiency of Revenues, Gains, and Other Support Over Expenses

The consolidated statements of operations and changes in net assets include deficiency of revenues, gains, and other support over expenses. Changes in unrestricted net assets which are excluded from this measure, consistent with industry practice, include changes in unrealized gains on investments and net assets released from restrictions used for purchase of property and equipment

#### **Retirement Plan**

The Hospital sponsors the Mount Desert Island Hospital Retirement Contribution Plan (the Plan), a defined contribution plan which provides retirement benefits to eligible employees. It is the Hospital's policy to fund the costs of the Plan on an annual basis.

## **Income Taxes**

The Hospital and BBRV are exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. MDMC is a for-profit entity and is, therefore, subject to income taxes. Income taxes are recorded based upon the asset and liability method as prescribed by Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 740, *Income Taxes*. At April 30, 2012 and 2011, MDMC has certain net operating loss carryforwards which have been reduced by a valuation allowance of an equal amount as it is not presently considered likely that the deferred tax assets will be realized.

#### **New Accounting Pronouncement**

In August 2010, the FASB issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) No. 2010-23, "Health Care Entities (Topic 954): Measuring Charity Care for Disclosure", which requires that cost be used as a measurement for charity care disclosure purposes and that cost be identified as the direct and indirect cost of providing the charity care. It also requires disclosure of the method used to identify or determine such costs. The Hospital adopted ASU 2010-23 effective for the year ended April 30, 2012. Since ASU 2010-23 amends disclosure requirements only, its adoption did not impact the Hospital's consolidated balance sheets, statements of operations and changes in net assets, or statements of cash flows.

## **Reclassification**

Certain amounts in the 2011 financial statements have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation.

#### **Subsequent Events**

For purposes of the preparation of these financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, the Hospital has considered transactions or events occurring through August 1, 2012, which was the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

In June 2012, BBRV refinanced their outstanding Series 2002A MHHEFA Revenue Bonds, \$1,858,988 at April 30, 2012, by issuing Series 2012A MHHEFA Revenue Bonds.

#### 3. Net Patient Service Revenue

The Hospital has agreements with third-party payors that provide for payments at amounts different from its established rates. A summary of the payment arrangements with major third-party payors follows:

Medicare - The Hospital is designated as a Critical Access Hospital (CAH). Under that designation, the Hospital is reimbursed 101% of allowable cost for its inpatient and outpatient services provided to Medicare patients. The Hospital is reimbursed for cost reimbursable items at tentative interim rates with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and audits thereof by the Medicare fiscal intermediary. The Hospital's Medicare cost reports have been audited by the Medicare fiscal intermediary through April 30, 2005.

- MaineCare The Hospital's approval for CAH status also impacts reimbursement under the MaineCare program, whereby the Hospital is reimbursed 109% of allowable cost for inpatient and outpatient services. Other items not classified as inpatient or outpatient by MaineCare are reimbursed at cost or some specified discount from cost. The Hospital is reimbursed at a tentative rate with final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and audits thereof by the fiscal intermediary. Final settle-ments have been issued through April 30, 2005.
- Anthem Services provided to Anthem subscribers were reimbursed at a discount from established charges and settlements are done through a prospective review. Anthem settlements have not been finalized for 2012.
- Other The Hospital has entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers and health maintenance organizations. The basis for payment to the Hospital under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges and prospectively determined daily rates.

Revenue from the Medicare and MaineCare programs accounted for approximately 44% and 10%, respectively, of the Hospital's gross patient service revenue for the year ended April 30, 2012, and 44% and 11%, respectively, for the year ended April 30, 2011. Laws and regulations governing the Medicare and MaineCare programs are complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term. Net patient service revenue increased by approximately \$60,000 in 2012 and decreased by approximately \$200,000 in 2011 as a result of changes to prior year estimated third-party payor settlements.

For several years, interim payments from the MaineCare program have been significantly below the amounts due to the Hospital based upon the reimbursement statutes in effect. In fiscal year 2011, the Hospital paid and received interim settlements for 2007 and 2008, respectively, and paid a tentative settlement for 2009. However, the remaining net outstanding cost settlements due from the MaineCare program (2006 - 2012) have been reported as noncurrent assets because the State of Maine's current budget does not provide for any further settlements. Therefore, they are not reasonably expected to be received within one year of the balance sheet date.

The Hospital's primary responsibility is to provide health care services to the communities within its service area. In order to accomplish this goal, the Hospital maintains resources to assure monies are available to provide for future retirement of debt, replacement of capital equipment, and a return on investment in order to accommodate inflationary increases in equipment costs and to remain technologically current.

In accordance with the State of Maine's Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act, the Hospital treats earnings on permanently restricted funds as temporarily restricted until appropriated for expenditure by proper governing Board action.

The basic objectives of the Hospital's investment policy are to emphasize long-term growth of principal while avoiding excessive risk and to achieve returns in excess of spending plus the rate of inflation over the investment horizon in order to preserve the purchasing power of Plan assets to fund new programs and capital purchases The long-term asset mix of investments is based on the following allocation guidelines.

The Hospital is the beneficiary of three trusts at April 30, 2012 and 2011, a portion of the income from which is to be paid to the Hospital in perpetuity. The Hospital's interest in the trusts is recognized as an asset at the fair market value of the underlying assets, which totaled \$1,548,520 and \$1,657,528 as of April 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively. ## 8. Real Estate Development Costs/Birch Bay Retirement Village

Birch Bay Retirement Village is a retirement community located in Hulls Cove, Maine, which consists of several different components located on the same campus. One component of the Community is a 55-unit facility referred to as the Inn, which consists of 32 assisted living suites and 23 independent living apartments.

The other component of the Community is the development of 20 separate cottage units. The construction costs related to the development of the cottages are carried by MDMC. As of April 30, 2012, construction of 17 of the 20 units is complete. A total of 16 and 15 of the 17 units were sold as of April 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively. The cost of the remaining unsold unit(s) of \$377,588 and \$702,588 is shown as cottages held for sale at April 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively, and the carrying amounts of the cottages approximate their fair values. The remaining real estate development costs of \$243,469 in the consolidated balance sheet at April 30, 2012 and 2011, represent the pro rata common costs related to the development of the three unbuilt cottages. Once the cottages are completed and sold, ownership of the cottages transfers to BBVA and occupancy of the units at BBVA is made available to shareholders of BBVA through residency agreements. The cost of these cottages and operating results of BBVA are not reflected in the Hospital's consolidated financial statements.

The land the cottages are situated on is leased from BBRV to BBVA and is managed by MDMC The land lease requires monthly rental payments for a period of 99 years. The initial base rent is \$600 per completed cottage per year. Lease payments were \$12,000 in both 2012 and 2011, and management fees were approximately \$125,000 in 2012 and \$117,000 in 2011. Due from BBVA of \$158,333 and \$87,984 at April 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively, represents land lease and cooperative fees.

As of April 30, 2012 and 2011, the Hospital maintained priority deposits to reserve units in the Inn, as well as security deposits for residents, totaling \$134,396 and \$125,222, respectively. These funds are held separately. The priority deposits are noninterest bearing and are refundable.

### 9. Construction in Progress and Pledges Receivable

During 2008, the Hospital purchased a nearby property and building for approximately \$2.6 million. The purchase was funded in part through the proceeds of the 2007B MHHEFA Revenue Bonds, with the remainder of the funding provided by a mortgage. The Hospital intends to renovate the existing building to provide additional clinic and administrative office space. At April 30, 2012 and 2011, the Hospital has approximately \$3.2 million and \$3.1 million, respectively, of costs in construction in progress related to the project. The expected costs for completion have not yet been determined.

During 2011, the Hospital began the installation and implementation of an Electronic Health Record system. At April 30, 2012 and 2011, the Hospital has approximately \$935,000 and \$674,000, respectively, of costs in construction in progress related to this project. Total estimated costs for completion are approximately \$1.5 million.

At April 30, 2012 and 2011, approximately \$565,000 and \$390,000, respectively, of capitalized interest costs are included in construction in progress.

#### 10. Lines of Credit

The Hospital has an available commercial line of credit with interest at the prime lending rate (3.25% at April 30, 2012) Maximum borrowings under the agreement are \$3,000,000. The line is subject to renewal November 1, 2012.

The Hospital has a second available commercial line of credit with interest at the prime lending rate plus .25% (3.5% at April 30, 2012). Maximum borrowings under the agreement are \$1,000,000. The line is subject to renewal November 1, 2012.

The Hospital has a third available commercial line of credit with interest at the prime lending rate (3.25% at April 30, 2012). Maximum borrowings under the agreement are \$1,000,000. The line is subject to renewal September 14, 2012.

Amounts outstanding on these lines at April 30, 2012 and 2011 were \$3,367,540 and \$3,505,248, respectively. Advances are collateralized by the Hospital's unrestricted investments.

In 2003, BBRV and the Hospital entered into an Assumption and Co-Obligor Agreement (the Agreement) under which BBRV assumed all of the obligations under the Series 2002A and Series 2001A bonds and became co-obligated on a joint and several basis with the Hospital under the bonds. The Hospital was not released or discharged in any way from its obligations under the bonds. In conjunction with the Agreement, the Hospital also transferred the assets related to the Inn, as well as the Series 2002A and 2001A bonds, to BBRV. The 2001A bonds were refunded in full in 2011.

The Hospital and BBRV are required to make monthly deposits with the trustee to fund principal and interest payments on the bonds as they come due. The Hospital's 2010, 2007, 2006, and 1992 bonds are collateralized by a security interest in all gross receipts of the Hospital, its equipment and a mortgage lien on the Hospital. BBRV's 2002 bonds are collateralized by the gross receipts of the Hospital, gross receipts of BBRV and the BBRV facility under a mortgage agreement. The 2010 BBRV bonds are collateralized by the gross receipts of BBRV, its equipment and fixtures, and a mortgage lien on BBRV.

Under its agreements with MHHEFA, the Hospital and BBRV must meet certain restrictive loan covenants. They are not in compliance with certain of these requirements at April 30, 2012.

MDMC has a loan to finance the construction of the cottages for an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000 During 2011, under an allonge dated April 29, 2011, payment terms were amended such that principal and interest are paid monthly through December 1, 2012. Outstanding balances under the note were \$0 and \$167,228 at April 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively. Advances under the loan bear interest at the greater of the prime rate plus 1% (4.25% at April 30, 2012) or 5%, with monthly payments, including interest. The loan is collateralized by the land and cottages to be constructed, as well as an assignment of the purchase and sale contracts entered into and construction deposits held by MDMC. Advances are available for up to 75% of the construction cost of each unit and the bank will advance for construction of two unsold cottages. Advances are to be repaid with 70% of the proceeds from cottage sales and any remaining outstanding principal and interest is due in full on December 31, 2012.

Assets recorded under capital leases totaled \$2,177,951 at April 30, 2012 and 2011. Accumulated amortization associated with these assets totaled \$1,675,237 and \$1,481,830 in 2012 and 2011, respectively. The cost of these assets have been included with property and equipment. Because the Hospital has the right to purchase the leased assets for nominal amounts at the end of the lease terms, such assets are amortized over their useful lives, which exceeds the lease terms. Amortization expense for assets under capital leases was approximately \$193,000 in 2012 and 2011, and has been included with depreciation and amortization expense in the consolidated financial statements.

## 12. Deferred Compensation

The Hospital has established a deferred compensation plan that permits management and highly compensated employees to defer portions of their compensation based on Internal Revenue Service guidelines. The Hospital has recorded \$1,420,011 at April 30, 2012, to reflect its liability under this plan. The Hospital has established a Trust to finance obligations under the plan. The Hospital has recorded a corresponding asset of \$1,420,011 (assets consist entirely of mutual funds) at April 30, 2012. Under the plan, all gains and losses in trust fund investments increase or decrease the deferred compensation liability.

#### 13. Retirement Plan

The Hospital has a defined contribution retirement plan which allows employees to defer certain amounts into the plan and also provides for employer contributions into the plan on behalf of an employee up to 3 5% of employee earnings. Participation in the plan is subject to certain eligibility requirements. Pension expense was \$634,399 and \$761,793 for 2012 and 2011, respectively.

#### 14. Concentration of Credit Risk

The Hospital grants credit without collateral to its patients, most of whom are local residents and are insured under third-party payor agreements. The mix of receivables from patients and third-party payors was as follows:

#### 15. Contingencies

#### **Medical Malpractice Insurance**

The Hospital maintains malpractice insurance coverage on a claims made basis. The Hospital is subject to complaints, claims and litigation due to potential claims which arise in the normal course of business. GAAP requires the Hospital to accrue the ultimate cost of malpractice claims when the incident that gives rise to the claim occurs, without consideration of insurance recoveries. Expected recoveries are presented as a seperate asset. The Hospital has evaluated its exposure to losses arising from potential claims and determined no such accrual is necessary for the year ended April 30, 2012. The Hospital intends to renew coverage on a claims made basis and anticipates that such coverage will be available.

#### Self-Insurance Program

The Hospital self-insures its employee health benefits and has estimated and recorded amounts to meet its expected obligations under the program. Total expense for health benefits was \$6,456,828 and \$4,947,813, in 2012 and 2011, respectively. The Hospital provided services totaling \$3,484,518 and \$2,654,554 in 2012 and 2011, respectively, which represents services rendered for Hospital employees for which the Hospital recorded revenue Stop loss insurance coverage is in effect which mitigates the Hospital's exposure to loss on an individual and aggregate basis.

The Hospital also participates in a self-insured workers' compensation insurance plan through an industry cooperative. Current funding levels by the Hospital and other participants in the cooperative are expected to be adequate to meet future claims. Excess insurance has been purchased to mitigate the cooperative's exposure to loss on large aggregate claims over a certain level.

#### 16. Operating Leases

The Hospital maintained a building and land lease for office and parking space in Bar Harbor, Maine. The lease consisted of rent of the first and second floor, including parking space, for a period of ten years commencing on June 1, 2005 and ending May 31, 2015, and rent of the third floor for a period of five years commencing on June 1, 2005 and ending May 31, 2010. Rent expense related to this lease was approximately in \$247,500 in 2011. This lease was terminated in January 2011 due to the purchase of the land and building by the Hospital.

The Hospital also leases medical buildings and equipment under operating leases with varying terms and expiration dates. Rent expense, under these leases, for the years ended April 30, 2012 and 2011, was \$192,602 and \$187,365, respectively. At April 30, 2012, future minimum payments are approximately as follows:

## 19. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820 defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. FASB ASC 820 also establishes a fair value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value.
