PEARL HARBOR SUBMARINE OFFICERS SPOUSES ASSOCIATION ARTICLES

ARTICLE I – NAME

The organization formerly called Pearl Harbor Submarine Officers Wives Club shall be called the "Pearl Harbor Submarine Officers Spouses Association", hereinafter referred to as "PHSOSA".

ARTICLE II – PURPOSE

The purpose of the PHSOSA is to operate as a 501(c) (7), non-profit, tax exempt social club. PHSOSA is organized for the pleasure and recreation of its members. PHSOSA shall foster friendships and provide mutual support for its members, thus benefiting the families of submarine officers and the submarine community in the Pearl Harbor area.

No part of the activities of the PHSOSA shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. The PHSOSA shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign, on behalf of or in opposition of any political candidate.

The PHSOSA shall not carry on any other activities that are not permitted to be carried on (a) by an association exempt from Federal Income Tax under Section 501 (c) (7) of the Internal Revenue Code.


No part of any PHSOSA funds shall be distributed for the benefit of its members, officers, advisors, or other private persons. The PHSOSA shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP

The following shall be eligible for PHSOSA membership: Spouses of all active, retired or deceased submarine officers; spouses of officers who are now or have been in the past associated with the submarine force; spouses of Government Service Employees (GS-7 and above) who are associated with the submarine force; or others showing special interest in this club, as recognized by the Executive Board and with approval of the General Membership.


ARTICLE IV – OFFICERS




