

4. **Community Habilitation Services (CHS)** is provided to Individuals with developmental disabilities
 - The purpose of CHS is to provide independent living skills training, socialization skills, and integration into the community. CHS assists individuals in acquiring retaining, improving adaptive skills and self-help skills to reside in home and community based settings.
 - CHS fosters independence, integration, individuality, and productivity to the community.
 - CHS includes provisions for self-directed and family directed community habilitation services, which will enhance flexibility and freedom of choice.
