After School Academic Enrichment

The Tutoring Centers at Marshall and Bryant Elementary Schools focus on positive youth development outcomes and helping under-resourced children excel academically. The TC serves 215 children across both sites, spanning K-5th grades. The TC has five central program components: 1) Academic enrichment and guided reading interventions; 2) Project-based "elective" activities that incorporate literacy-building opportunities throughout each project cycle; 3) Sports and Recreation; 4) Community-building activities that help to foster group cohesion, build social skills, and model resiliency; and 5) College Connect, our early college awareness program that aims to prepare and motivate children to plan for college. College Connect identifies high school juniors who would be the first in their family to attend college, surround them with caring adult experts in college admissions as well as a cohort of peers who are just as committed to attending college, and supports them and their families all the way through college graduation. While participating in our program, students are provided training on college entrance exams, coaching in developing a personal statement, support in navigating the world of financial aid and scholarships, and suggestions on colleges and universities that will best meet their needs. We ensure that students are not only accepted into college, but that they acquire the financial means to attend, and the support to ensure they receive their diploma. Con't on Schedule O.

The Parent Partner Program is designed to increase the academic success and college prospects of Mission youth by nurturing a strong culture of parent engagement across Mission schools. This is done through school-based organizing and training, developing a team of parent leaders, and educating on the benefits of a college education. A core component of the program is the Believing the College Dream curriculum, a partnership of Mission Graduates and the U.C. Berkeley Center for Educational Partnerships, where parents are trained as facilitators (promotores) to begin building college-going expectations and culture with other parents. This year, our promotores led 38 workshops with a total of 793 parent participants.

In some cases, students that were awarded scholarships in their first year of college may not be awarded a scholarship the following year due to a change in their financial aid package. Changes in financial aid packages can be due to a student receiving a scholarship, more or less aid from their college or university. Having the flexibility to award students with the biggest financial needs helps us manage the amount of debt students will be responsible for after college graduation. Students with the highest financial needs have the highest priority to receive scholarships. The committee also considers program participation and citizenship

status as critical factors in recipient selection. Students must demonstrate a commitment to the program while still in high school in order to be selected.

College Connect participation and attendance is a strong indicator of the student's ability to maintain communication while in college. A student with poor communication and low attendance will likely demonstrate this while in college, and is at risk for low academic performance and dropping out. Citizenship is also a factor because of the limited options for financial aid, educational grants, and scholarships for students that are not citizens. Recipients are then selected based on their outstanding financial need (after other financial aid sources are included) and program involvement.

An integral aspect of the Tutoring Centers is academic alignment with the daytime curricula. This is accomplished through both academic classes designed to re-enforce and enhance skills as well as an everyday homework-tutoring block. Parent involvement is a key strategy to our success and over 200 parents regularly attend math, literacy and science nights.

The Afterschool program at Mission High School focuses on positive youth development outcomes and helping under-resourced youth excel academically. The afterschool program focuses on academic support, which includes tutoring, homework help, and college preparation. Through a partnership with City College of San Francisco, students were able to enroll and start taking college courses. 142 students were a part of the program this year.

College Connect launched in 2008 with just nine youth in the inaugural cohort. This year, 81 students participated in the program spread across five cohorts; 36 are college students, 20 are high school seniors, and 25 high school juniors. Our fourth, and most recent cohort of 20 students, raised \$408,229 in scholarships, or \$20,412 per student. 92% of College Connect students attended four-year colleges after high school graduation. 98% of participants remain enrolled in college.
