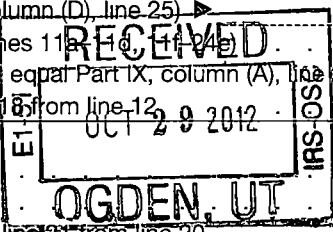

1 - GOVERNING STATUTES AND PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

The Bishop's University Foundation (hereafter the "Foundation") was incorporated in 1971 under Part III of the Companies Act (Québec) for the purpose of receiving and maintaining funds which are to be disbursed for charitable or educational purposes for the benefit of Bishop's University. It is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act.

2 - ACCOUNTING CHANGE

During the year, the Foundation retroactively changed the classification of investment income and expenses in the different funds. This change led to an increase of \$7,674 in the unrestricted non-trust funds balance, a decrease of \$7,674 in the unrestricted trust funds balance, an increase of \$925,570 in the restricted non-trust funds balance and a decrease of \$925,570 in the restricted trust funds balance as at July 1st, 2011.

3 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of presentation

The financial statements are prepared using the historical cost method, except for certain financial instruments that are recognized at fair value. No information on fair value is presented when the carrying amount corresponds to a reasonable approximation of the fair value.

Fund accounting

The Foundation follows the restricted fund method of accounting for revenues.

Unrestricted non-trust funds

The Unrestricted non-trust funds represent contributions not received for endowment and net investment income, neither of which is subject to restrictions as to usage.

Unrestricted trust funds

The Unrestricted trust funds represent contributions received for endowment. These contributions are to be invested and held in perpetuity. The investment income earned thereon, which is not subject to restrictions as to usage, is accounted for in the unrestricted non-trust fund and is to be used to fund the priorities of Bishop's University.

Restricted non-trust funds

The Restricted non-trust funds represent contributions not received for endowment and net investment income, both of which are subject to restrictions as to usage.

3 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Restricted trust funds

The Restricted trust funds represent contributions received for endowment. These amounts are to be invested and held in perpetuity. The investment income earned thereon, which is subject to restrictions as to usage, is accounted for in the restricted non-trust fund and is to be used to fund scholarships, research and various initiatives of Bishop's University.

Capital campaign funds

The Capital campaign funds represent contributions received for current or future endowment, as well as contributions received but not yet disbursed to Bishop's University over the course of the capital campaign.

Accounting estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts recorded in the financial statements and notes to financial statements. These estimates are based on management's best knowledge of current events and actions that the Foundation may undertake in the future. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Financial assets and liabilities

The Foundation has chosen to apply the recommendations of Section 3861, "Financial Instruments – Disclosure and Presentation", of the *Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants' Handbook* with respect to the presentation and disclosure of financial instruments.

On initial recognition, all financial assets and liabilities are measured and recognized at their fair value, except for financial assets and liabilities resulting from certain related party transactions.

Transaction costs from available-for-sale financial assets increase the carrying amount of the related financial assets. Transaction costs from other financial liabilities reduce the carrying amount of the related financial liabilities. Regular-way purchases or disposals of financial assets are recognized at the transaction date.

Subsequently, financial assets and liabilities are measured and recognized as follows:

Held-for-trading financial assets

Cash is classified as a held-for-trading financial asset.

Available-for-sale financial assets

Investments in balanced pooled funds and the MSBi/iNovia Investment Funds are classified as available-for-sale financial assets and are measured at their fair value, except for the MSBi/iNovia Investment Funds which are measured using the equity method.

Unrealized gains or losses relating to available-for-sale financial assets are recognized in the statement of changes in fund balances until these gains or losses are realized or a decline in value of the financial asset is other than temporary. When investments are sold or sustain a decline in value that is other than temporary, the related accumulated gains or losses, which are presented in the statement of changes in fund balances, are then reclassified in the statement of revenues and expenses under Net investment income.

Other financial liabilities

Due to Bishop's University is classified as other financial liabilities. It is measured at amortized cost using the effective interest method.

Revenue recognition

The Foundation follows the restricted fund method in which restricted contributions are recognized upon receipt in the fund corresponding to the purpose for which they were contributed.

Contributed supplies and services

The Foundation recognizes contributed supplies and services when the fair value of these contributions can be reasonably estimated and if it would have had to otherwise acquire these supplies and services for its normal operations.

MSBi/iNovia Investment Fund Limited Partnerships was created to promote the commercialization of discoveries and inventions in various domains of science and technology. These projects are also supported financially by, among others, McGill University, Université de Sherbrooke, certain hospitals, and by the Gouvernement du Québec. As part of the partnership agreement, units are priced at \$110,000 (Fund I) and \$50,000 (Fund II) with capital calls spread out over a period of several years. There are total commitments of \$62,500 to fund the remaining capital calls of \$37,500 for 2013 and of \$25,000 for 2014.

The fair value of the MSBi/iNovia Investment Fund Limited Partnerships was not determined because it is not practical within the constraints of time or cost to establish such value with sufficient reliability, in particular because the entities' equity securities are not publicly traded.

6 - FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES, AND FINANCIAL RISKS

Financial risk management objectives and policies

The Foundation is exposed to various financial risks resulting from both its operations and investment activities. These financial risks are mitigated by the Foundation's management.

The Foundation does not enter into financial instrument agreements, including derivative financial instruments, for speculative purposes.

Financial risks

The Foundation's main financial risk exposure and financial risk management policies are as follows:

Credit risk

Generally, the carrying amount on the balance sheet of the Foundation's financial assets exposed to credit risk, net of any applicable provisions for losses, represents the maximum amount exposed to credit risk. The investments in mutual fund units in bonds is exposing the Foundation indirectly to credit risk.

Cash is held by recognized financial institutions. The Foundation's management estimates that this financial asset is at low risk of loss.

Market risk

– Interest rate risk

The investments in mutual fund units in bonds are exposing the Foundation indirectly to interest rate risk.

– Foreign exchange risk

The Foundation is exposed to foreign exchange risk due to investments denominated in U.S. dollars and other foreign currencies. Note 4 presents these amounts in details.

– Other price risk

Market risk is also the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial asset will fluctuate due to changes in market prices. Investments in mutual funds are exposed to normal market fluctuations and inherent risks associated with investments in financial markets. The carrying amount on the balance sheet of these investments, net of any applicable provision for permanent decline in value, represents the maximum amount exposed to market risk.

The Foundation manages risk by diversifying its investments and by adhering to the Investment Policy developed by the Board of Directors through its investment committee. The risk management strategy of the plan did not change during the year ended June 30, 2012.

Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk management aims to maintain a sufficient amount of cash and cash equivalents. The Foundation establishes budget and cash estimates to ensure it has the necessary funds to fulfil its obligations.

7 - CAPITAL MANAGEMENT

The Foundation's capital management objectives are as follows:

- Maintain its ability to continue its activities,
- Fulfil its financial obligations.

The Foundation defines its capital as its fund balances.

The Foundation manages its capital primarily through fund-raising campaigns targeting public donations and by ensuring sufficient income generation from its investments.

To maintain or adjust its capital structure, the Foundation may, from time to time, modify its forecasted expenditures.

The Foundation is subject to externally imposed capital requirements. These requirements are set out in certain agreements with fund contributors and relate to contributions restricted for specific purposes. The Foundation continually monitors these requirements. During the year, the Foundation complied with these requirements.
