Organization's Mission: The Women's Law Project creates a more just and equitable society by advancing the rights and status of all women throughout their lives. To this end, we engage in high-impact litigation, advocacy and education. The core values of the Women's Law Project are a belief in the right of all women to bodily integrity and personal autonomy; dedication to listening to women and being guided by their experiences; and commitment to fairness, equality and justice.

LITIGATION

REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS

- Susan Frietsche, Sr. Staff Attorney in our Pittsburgh office, successfully represented the Allentown Women's Center in *Kuhns v. Allentown Women's Center*, a case brought by anti-abortion protesters alleging First Amendment violations.
- WLP has continued to work with the freestanding reproductive health care providers to ensure that they survive the implementation of Act 122. Our work involves (1) the legal analysis of a complex body of 143 regulations that are being newly applied to our providers, together with hundreds of pages of incorporated construction guidelines; (2) extensive administrative advocacy with the Departments of Health and State; (3) consultation with architects, fire safety experts, and engineers; (4) drafting and submission of exceptions applications; (5) administrative appeals of denials of exceptions applications; and (6) extensive client counseling. This activity is highly likely to remain necessary, even if the providers engage in litigation over a subset of the requirements in the new law.
- WLP attorneys assisted clinics across the state as the Pennsylvania Department of Health conducted intrusive inspections their facilities.

DISCRIMINATION AND GENDER BIAS

- Monitored compliance in two cases involving equitable treatment of women in college sports, one at Slippery Rock State University and the other at Delaware State University.
- Assisted individuals seeking increased opportunities and improved treatment of female students to address inequities in athletic programs in Pennsylvania schools.
 This includes assistance to a sixth grade student who successfully advocated for the reinstatement of her Pittsburgh elementary school basketball team; as a result of her efforts, the Pittsburgh School District established a K-5 basketball league that will be gender-balanced and equitable.
- Continued to monitor compliance in WLP v. New Hope-Solebury School District, in which we had filed a complaint against New Hope Solebury School District with the

- U.S. Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights (OCR).
- In WLP v. Northern York School District, entered into a voluntary agreement with the Northern York School District after filing a complaint with OCR in 2011 relating to disparities between the softball field and the baseball field and insufficient athletic opportunities for female students.
- Filed an amicus brief in E.H. v. Easton Area School District on behalf of high school girls who were prohibited from and punished for wearing "I love boobies" bracelets in support of breast cancer awareness.
- Working with the ACLU's Women's Rights Project, WLP settled an administrative complaint against Pittsburgh Public Schools for illegally and involuntarily segregating Westinghouse Academy students by gender without sufficient educational justification and without providing a substantially equal coed alternative.
- This past year WLP received and evaluated a number of requests for assistance in a variety of areas, including in particular family responsibilities, pregnancy discrimination, sexual harassment, and athletic equity. These cases are referred to WLP lawyers from our Telephone Counseling Service, the Center for WorkLife Law at UC Hastings College of Law, former clients and other sources. Some are resolved without litigation, some do not raise viable legal claims justifying litigation, and some are referred to our legal advocacy committee for approval.
- WLP is working on an employment discrimination case alleging sex discrimination due to WorkLife conflict (familial responsibilities).
- WLP has filed a complaint against the University of Pittsburgh challenging the University's application of gendered facilities policy to transgendered students.

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

• In a case before the Pennsylvania Supreme Court, the WLP authored an amicus curiae brief on behalf of 42 state and national organizations. In Commonwealth v. Claybrook, the Superior Court had overturned the convictions of three men for sexual assault and indecent assault. The WLP brief, submitted to the high court, argued that the Superior Court had relied on a number of myths about sexual assault, all of which have been discredited by social science research and are no longer included in Pennsylvania's sexual assault statute. They include the myths that primarily strangers perpetrate sexual assault and that social interaction, absence of physical resistance, absence of severe physical injuries, and certain post-assault behaviors imply consent.

WOMEN'S HEALTH

• In *Blades v. Commonwealth*, WLP was co-counsel with Institutional Law Project in this civil rights action on behalf of an incarcerated woman who was denied timely obstetric care and who was shackled during labor and child birth. We settled this case. Ongoing discussions about the treatment of pregnant women in the state system are taking place with the Pennsylvania Department of Corrections as part of the settlement of this case.

ADVOCACY

REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS

- The WLP spent a year coordinating an intensive advocacy campaign to counter the Pennsylvania General Assembly's disproportionate focus on anti-abortion efforts. WLP convened a statewide coalition of pro-choice organizations in which we held weekly strategy phone calls with about 25 advocates, developed fact sheets and talking points, and organized a rally and numerous legislative initiatives. Unfortunately, we were unable to stop one of the most dangerous bills from passing. In December 2011, Governor Tom Corbett signed into law Act 122, legislation to confine the performance of even very early and very simple abortion procedures to facilities that meet the costly and inappropriately sophisticated standards of ambulatory surgical facilities. WLP's attorney's participated, with the National Women's Law Center and the Pennsylvania Health Action Network (PHAN), in advocacy efforts related to implementation of the Affordable Care Act.
- WLP legal staff wrote op-ed articles explaining implications of the Gosnell grand jury findings
- WLP's Sr. Staff Attorney convenes Pennsylvanians for Choice, a statewide coalition

DISCRIMINATION AND GENDER BIAS

- Worked to achieve adoption of state legislation to mandate reporting of athletic information by secondary schools.
- The Civil Rights Division of the Department of Justice, which is investigating gender bias in police practice, invited the WLP to conduct a training program for its staff.
- WLP organized a request to the Office of Civil Rights of the US Department of Justice, on

behalf of advocates from nine organizations working on Title IX issues, to review Penn State's handling of sexual harassment cases.

VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

- The WLP <u>changed federal policy</u> when the FBI, as a result of our aggressive advocacy, announced it would change how it defines, collects, and analyzes data on rape in its Uniform Crime Report. As a result, over 17,000 police departments across the country will adopt the new definition, improving both practice and reporting. Working closely with the White House Advisor on Violence Against Women and the Department of Justice Office of Violence Against Women, the WLP participated in FBI advisory meetings in Pittsburgh, Baltimore and Albuquerque. Begun by the WLP 11 years ago in Philadelphia, the call to change the definition was revived by the WLP's testimony on this subject in 2010 before the U.S. Senate Judiciary Subcommittee on Crime and Drugs.
- Organized a request to the Office of Civil Rights of the US Department of Justice, on behalf of advocates from nine organizations working on Title IX issues, to review Penn State's handling of sexual harassment cases.
- The WLP played a leadership role in a Police Executive Research Forum (PERF) Summit, held in Washington, D.C., in September, 2011. The PERF Summit focused on Improving Police Response to Sexual Assault. Police chiefs, WLP staff, representatives of other crime victims' advocacy and women's organizations, FBI officials, and others came together at this meeting to launch a comprehensive review of police practices, with the goal of making "cultural" changes in how police officers and investigators think about sexual assaults (e.g., ensuring that police officers understand the severe impact of sexual assault on victims, whose responses to being assaulted may at times appear counterintuitive to police expectations.)
- The WLP has been invited to participate in two major new initiatives to improve data collection and law enforcement response to sexual assault: (1) The National Academy of Sciences has invited the WLP to participate in a new initiative to advise the Bureau of Justice Statistics on changes to its National Crime Victimization Survey to improve the accuracy of its data; and (2) the American Law Institute has invited the WLP to participate in a forum on the modernization of its Model Penal Code provisions relating to sexual assault crimes.
- PERF has requested WLP partner with it on a review of the Cleveland Police
 Department's response to sexual assault and is covering expenses for WLP for this work.
- WLP secured the third Department of Justice Office of Violence against Women

(DOJOVW) grant in the amount of \$950,000 for the City of Philadelphia (for a total of \$3million) to improve law enforcement's response to domestic violence.

- WLP's Executive Director, Carol Tracy, continues to co-chair the Domestic Violence Law Enforcement Committee, which oversees the implementation of DOJOVW grants, and worked with the Philadelphia Police Department on a complete reorganization of PPD's response to domestic violence.
- The WLP continues its annual review of case files at the PPD's Special Victims Unit.
- WLP's Managing Attorney serves on the Executive Committee of the Family Law Section, on the PBA's Family Law Gideon Subcommittee, and on the Pennsylvania Department of Public Welfare's Domestic Violence Task Force.
- WLP continues its efforts with the Department of Human Services to develop protocols related to domestic violence in child welfare cases.

WOMEN'S HEALTH

- In May, WLP published *Through the Lens of Equality: Eliminating Sex Bias to Improve the Health of Pennsylvania's Women*, an extensively researched book-length report that examines four realms of women's lives. *Through the Lens* addresses 10 different, yet overlapping subject areas in which profound connections between sex bias and health exist and in which legislative and policy improvements are needed. This comprehensive analysis explores Home and Community (with sections on Sexual Assault, Intimate Partner Violence, Poverty, and Caretaking); Workplace; School (with sections on Athletic Opportunities and Treatment and on Sexual Victimization) and Health Care Systems (with sections on Reproductive Health, Insurance, and Drug Treatment Trials). Each section contains a series of legislative and policy recommendations.
- WLP submitted comments to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and to the Pennsylvania Insurance Department on implementation of insurance exchanges (marketplaces for purchase of insurance) which the Affordable Care Act requires states to implement. (Rulemaking on the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; Establishment of Exchanges and Qualified Health Plans (September 26, 2011); Written Testimony of WLP to PA Insurance Department on Implementation of Health Insurance Exchanges (August 26, 2011).
- WLP's attorneys testified at a "Listening session" by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) on the need to broadly define essential benefits, focusing

specifically on maternity and behavioral health benefits, emphasizing the importance of defining maternity and newborn benefits to include prenatal, delivery, and postpartum care, elements of insurance coverage often unavailable to women.

- WLP participated in drafting legislation that would require insurance companies to provide comprehensive coverage for maternity care.
- WLP continues to work to develop third-party payment for case management of domestic violence and sexual assault cases in primary health care settings and emergency rooms.
- Participated in the Coalition for Healthy Families and Workplaces and provided testimony to Philadelphia City Council on the proposed Sick Leave Bill.
- With respect to Health Care Reform, WLP works with the Pennsylvania Health Action Network and the National Women's Law Center on implementation of the Affordable Care Act. WLP participates in the Women's Way Coalition for Healthy Families and Workplaces.
- Our advocacy with the Philadelphia Deputy Mayor for Health and Opportunity has resulted in a decrease in the census of incarcerated pregnant women in the city.

FAMILY COURT REFORM

- WLP's Executive Director participates in Philadelphia Bar Association Delivery of Legal Services Committee and co-convene meetings of family law public interest organizations to provide input into the new Family Court; she has also made presentations to the PBA Women's Rights Committee.
- WLP convened public interest lawyers working in Family Court to develop an advocacy agenda to improve litigants' experience in Family Court proceedings in the new courthouse, which will house both the juvenile and domestic relations branches.

EDUCATION

 In May, WLP published Through the Lens of Equality: Eliminating Sex Bias to Improve the Health of Pennsylvania's Women. See the full description under "Advocacy— Women's Health.

- 2. We responded to 4,127 problems presented to our Telephone Counseling Service. Our web-based resource page was utilized an additional 5,725 times.
- 3. The WLP undertook extensive new outreach to provide information to individuals who might benefit from using our Telephone Counseling Service, but who may not have known of its availability. This past summer, we developed a flyer and interns went doorto-door, distributing it to businesses in South Philadelphia and every branch of the Free Library. In addition, we mailed flyers to every public high school in Philadelphia.
- 4. Counselor materials were completely overhauled and almost entirely converted from paper to online to facilitate access, and, by linking to primary sources, make updates automatic and transparent.
- 5. We updated materials on Pennsylvania's new child custody law, creating new forms for unrepresented litigants to use and publishing written materials for consumers.
- 6. With Philadelphia Legal Assistance, WLP's attorneys trained and supervised volunteers at Family Court to distribute our written materials and answer questions from victims of domestic violence outside the Protection From Abuse Filing Unit at Family Court. The WLP also offered extensive telephone follow-up through our Counseling Service.
- 7. We are drafting re-entry manuals about the civil legal needs of incarcerated women upon release.
