1. ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Purpose and Organization

The Sovereign Military Hospitaller of St. John of Jerusalem of Rhodes and of Malta, often called the Order of Malta, the Knights of Malta, or simply the Order, is a lay religious order of the Roman Catholic Church dating back to the Middle of the eleventh century and is currently based in Rome. There are many associations worldwide and the Order of Malta, Western Association is one of them.

The SOVEREIGN MILITARY ORDER OF MALTA, WESTERN ASSOCIATION - THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA (the ORDER) was organized to promote the spiritual and physical welfare of the sick and disabled, the poor, and the elderly, to aid and protect them and contribute to their material and moral support and to establish institutions of Christian charity to attend to their needs.

The ORDER's mission statement is as follows:

To promote the glory of God, through assisting with the spiritual development of its members and carrying out its charitable works for the sick, the needy, and refugees, without distinction of religion, race, origin, and age.

The ORDER's programs include the Hospitaller grants and the Lourdes Pilgrimage. The Hospitaller grants are provided to other not-for-profit organizations who offer programs to assist the sick and disabled, the poor, and the elderly. The Lourdes Pilgrimage program is a pilgrimage to Lourdes, France and it is held every year.

Basis of Accounting

The ORDER prepares its financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, which involves the application of accrual accounting; consequently, revenues and gains are recognized when earned, and expenses and losses are recognized when incurred.

Basis of Presentation

Classification of Net Assets

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that the ORDER report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. Accordingly, the net assets of the ORDER are classified and reported as described below:

Unrestricted: Those net assets and activities which represent the portion of expendable funds that are available to support the ORDER's operations. A portion of these net assets may be designated by the Board of Directors for specific purposes.

Classification of Net Assets (continued)

Temporarily Restricted: Those net assets and activities which are donor-restricted for (a) support of specific operating activities; (b) investment for a specified term; (c) use in a specified future period; or (d) acquisition of long-lived assets.

Permanently Restricted: Those net assets and activities which are permanently donor-restricted for holdings of (a) assets donated with stipulations that they be used for a specified purpose, be preserved, and not be sold; or (b) assets donated with stipulations that they be invested to provide a permanent source of income.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Estimates subject to change are the depreciable lives of property and equipment, and the estimated fair values of certain investments.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The ORDER considers all highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents. Cash and cash equivalents restricted as to their use are not included as cash equivalents, regardless of liquidity. Cash and cash equivalents held in money market funds are intended for investment purposes and are classified separately under investments.

Investments

Marketable investments in equity and debt securities are carried at fair value based upon quoted market prices.

Revenue Recognition (continued)

Contributed Services

Contributed services are recorded as contributions at their estimated value on the date of receipt. The contributed services are for the overall management of the ORDER.

The ORDER records contribution revenue for certain services received at the fair value of those services, if the services (a) create or enhance nonfinancial assets, or (b) require specialized skills, are provided by individuals possessing those skills, and would be purchased if not donated.

For the year ended June 30, 2012, the ORDER received donated services totaling \$275,750.

Investment Income

Realized and unrealized gains and losses and investment income (losses) derived from investment transactions are included as income in the year earned.

Miscellaneous Income

Miscellaneous income includes \$142,622 in net assets of Locations.

Income Taxes

The ORDER is a qualified organization exempt from federal income taxes under §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and California franchise taxes under §23701d of the California Revenue and Taxation Code.

The ORDER has adopted the accounting standard on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, which prescribes a recognition threshold and measurement attribute for the financial statement recognition and measurement of a tax position taken, or expected to be taken, in a tax return and requires the affirmative evaluation that is more-likely-than-not, based on the technical merits of a tax position, that an enterprise is entitled to economic benefits resulting from tax positions taken in income tax returns.

If a tax position does not meet the more-likely-than-not recognition threshold, the benefit of that position is not recognized in the financial statements. This standard also requires organizations to disclose additional quantitative and qualitative information in their financial statements about uncertain tax positions.

The ORDER's evaluation on June 30, 2012 revealed no tax positions that would have a material impact on the financial statements. The 2009 through 2011 tax years remain subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service. In addition, the 2008 through 2011 tax years remain subject to examination by the California Franchise Tax Board. The ORDER does not believe that any reasonably possible changes will occur within the next twelve months that will have a material impact on the financial statements.

Grants

Grant expense is recorded when the Hospitaller Committee approves the grant disbursement.

Concentrations of Risk

Financial instruments which potentially subject the ORDER to concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash, cash equivalents and investments. The ORDER maintains its cash in various bank deposit accounts which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The ORDER has not experienced any losses in such accounts. The ORDER attempts to limit its credit risk associated with cash equivalents and investments by utilizing outside investment managers to place the ORDER's investments with highly rated corporate and financial institutions. Management believes that the ORDER is not exposed to any significant credit risk related to these concentrations.

Recent Accounting Pronouncements

In May 2011, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued Accounting Standards Update (ASU) No. 2011-04, Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820): Amendments to Achieve Common Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure Requirements in U.S. GAAP and IFRS. ASU 2011-04 provides guidance which is expected to result in common fair value measurement and disclosure requirements between U.S. GAAP and International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS). It changes the wording used to describe many of the requirements in U.S. GAAP for measuring fair value and for disclosing information about fair value measurements. For many of the requirements, the FASB does not intend for ASU 2011-04 to result in a change in the application of the requirements in Topic 820. Some of the amendments clarify the FASB's intent about the application of existing fair value measurement requirements. Other amendments change a particular principle or requirement for measuring fair value or for disclosing information about fair value measurements. ASU No. 2011-04 is to be applied prospectively and is effective for annual periods beginning after December 15, 2011. The adoption of this guidance is not expected to have a material impact on the ORDER's financial statements.

In January 2010, the FASB issued guidance that clarifies existing disclosures and requires new disclosures about fair value measurements. The clarifications and the requirement to disclose the amounts and reasons for significant transfers between Level 1 and Level 2 and significant transfers into and out of Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy are effective for periods beginning after December 15, 2009. The new requirement that purchases, sales, issuances, and settlements be presented gross in the Level 3 reconciliation is effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2010 and for interim periods within those years, with early adoption permitted. Since this new guidance only amends the disclosure requirements, the adoption of this pronouncement did not have any impact on the ORDER's financial statements or disclosures.

2. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS AND INVESTMENTS (CONTINUED)

Money Market Mutual Funds: The funds are held in a money market account and the value is readily available.

International Equity Mutual Funds: The funds invest primarily in common stocks and other equity securities of non-U.S. companies (including common stocks, securities convertible into common stocks and warrants to acquire common stocks). Up to 10 percent of the fund can be invested in equity securities of issuers located in emerging markets. The fund is designed to outperform its benchmark, the Morgan Stanley Capital International World ex-U.S. Index, over a full-market cycle, primarily through active stock selection. Portfolio holdings will typically range from 150 to 300 equity securities. Fair values are determined by reference to quoted market prices for similar investments, yield curves, and other relevant information.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the ORDER believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measure at the reporting date.

There have been no substantive changes in the valuation methodologies during the year ended June 30, 2012.

6. ENDOWMENT

The ORDER's endowment consists of two individual funds established for a variety of purposes. Its endowment includes donor-restricted endowment funds. As required by generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP), net assets associated with endowment funds are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

In January 2011, the Board of Directors elected to consolidate four individual endowment funds with the same purpose, to aid the poor, the elderly and the sick, into a single endowment fund, Charitable Fund. The former individual endowment funds were: Endowment Fund for the Aged, Hospitaller Endowment, General Endowment and Defense of Faith.

Interpretation of Relevant Law

The Board of Directors of the ORDER has interpreted California's enacted version of Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act of 2006 (UPMIFA) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the ORDER classifies as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in permanently restricted net assets is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the ORDER in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by UPMIFA. In accordance with UPMIFA, the ORDER considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds:

- (1) The duration and preservation of the fund
- (2) The purposes of the ORDER and the donor-restricted endowment fund
- (3) General economic conditions
- (4) The possible effect of inflation and deflation
- (5) The expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments
- (6) Other resources of the ORDER
- (7) The investment policies of the ORDER

Funds with Deficiencies

From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor or UPMIFA requires the ORDER to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. There were no such deficiencies as of June 30, 2012.

Return Objectives and Risk Parameters

The ORDER has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment while seeking to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets. Endowment fund assets include those assets of donor-restricted funds that the ORDER must hold in perpetuity or for a donor-specified period. Under this policy, as approved by the Board of Directors, the endowment should be constructed to earn a return (after inflation) of at least 5% to protect and enhance the real purchasing power of the endowment fund assets. Actual returns in any given year may vary from this estimate.

Strategies Employed for Achieving Objectives

The endowment fund is managed with a long-term investment horizon under the belief that asset allocation and investment manager expertise are the major determinants of investment performance. The Investment Committee makes portfolio construction decisions in accordance with the investment objectives as described in the ORDER's investment policy. Asset allocations for the purpose of "market timing" are considered inappropriate.

The endowment fund is allocated across a number of investment asset classes with different fundamental characteristics, to provide diversification and reduce risk, in order to achieve the endowment fund's investment objectives. Due to fluctuations in market values, allocations within the specified permitted range constitute compliance with the spending policy below. Depending on the asset class, an extended period of time may be required to fully implement allocation target weightings and potential future target weighting revisions.

Spending Policy and How the Investment Objectives Relate to Spending Policy

The endowment fund is used to support the mission of the ORDER. For spending purposes, the maximum annual payout will be no greater than 5% of the average ending net asset balances of the endowment fund over the trailing twelve fiscal quarters. Actual payout is in accordance with amounts determined by the Board of Directors and the Investment Committee. Any change to the annual maximum payout distribution policy of the endowment fund requires a supermajority (75%) approval of the Board.

7. RETIREMENT PLANS

The ORDER participates in a SIMPLE IRA covering all full time employees. For each year, the ORDER contributes a matching contribution to each eligible employee's SIMPLE IRA equal to the employee's salary reduction contributions up to a limit of 3% of the employee's compensation for the calendar year. For the year ended June 30, 2012, the ORDER contributed \$7,999 to the plan.

8. COMMITMENTS

The Order leases office space in San Francisco, California. The lease expired on June 30, 2012 and was extended for additional five years through June 30, 2017. The ORDER is required to pay a monthly base rent of \$6,123, subject to annual adjustments based on increases in the Consumer Price Index for the San Francisco Bay Area not to exceed 3.00%. In addition, the ORDER pays for 1.22% of the building's real estate taxes and operating expenses incurred by the landlord. For the year ended June 30, 2012, rent expense amounted to \$79,029.

The ORDER is obligated under non-cancelable leases for certain types of office equipment. The leases are accounted for as operating leases and will expire between 2015 and 2017. Minimum rent is payable at \$4,594 per quarter. For the year ended June 30, 2012, equipment rent amounted to \$25,365.
