Big Brothers Big Sisters, Mentoring South Pittsburgh, \$20,000

Since 1965, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Pittsburgh (BBBSPGH) has provided evidence-based and outcomes-oriented one-to-one mentoring programs to tens of thousands of children facing adversity in the Pittsburgh region. Youth in South Pittsburgh are served by two core programs: Community-based and Site-based.

Brashear Association, Holiday Assistance Program, \$15,000

The project will provide food assistance through food vouchers to low income families in the South Pittsburgh communities of: Allentown, Arlington, Arlington Heights, Beltzhoover, Bon Air, Carrick, Knoxville, Mt. Oliver Borough, Mt. Oliver City, South Side Flats, and South Side Slopes.

Brashear Association, Comprehensive Community Services, \$100,000

The Brashear Association proposes to provide comprehensive community services to low income individuals, children, and families in the South Pittsburgh neighborhoods of Allentown, Arlington, Arlington Heights, Beltzhoover, Bon Air, Carrick, Knoxville, Mt. Oliver, South Side Flats, and South Side Slopes with a concentration on the hilltop communities. Services will consist of Children's Education Programs and our Family Assistance Program.

Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh, Hilltop LYNCS, \$20,000

Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh (CLP) Hilltop LYNCS (The Library in Your Neighborhood, Community and School) has implemented an early learning outreach initiative that is focused on linking reading, literacy and learning with social and emotional learning and teaching parents and teachers how to support their child's early learning experiences.

Carrick Community Council(CCC), CCC Outreach and Community Engagement, \$6,000 The Outreach and Community Engagement project seeks to get the word out to Carrick residents that the Carrick Community Council (CCC) exists to help develop and maintain a vibrant and safe neighborhood.

Council of Three Rivers American Indian Center (COTRAIC), COTRAIC Early Head Start Interpretation Project, \$7,500

The interpretation project is designed to effectively communicate with refugee families as well as set up localized English as Second Language classes for families to assimilate and acclimate into the South Pittsburgh Communities.

Focus on Renewal, Hilltop Community Health Center Grant Research Project, \$2,880 Funding for grant research project for the Hilltop community Health Center

Goodwill of SWPA, Goodwill Youth Violence Prevention & Mentoring Program, \$25,000 This program focuses on helping boys and girls ages 12 to 17 with youth violence prevention and intervention strategies. It helps them set goals and explore career options while opening their eyes to the possibilities around them.

Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, Food Assistance, \$50,000

Funding will support grocery & fresh produce lines of credit for food assistance agencies in south neighborhoods of Pittsburgh, as well as to purchase and distribute additional fresh produce into the community through our Produce to People program.

One Vision One Life (OVOL), using street level outreach workers (Community Coordinators), intervenes in and mediates conflicts in order to prevent targeted violence. Funding to complete transitional phase of operations.

Reading is FUNdamental (RIF), Community Literacy Projects in Pittsburgh, \$50,000 Implementation and strengthening of our four core programs in South Pittsburgh: Books for Keeps, Read to Your Family, Everybody Wins! and Storymobile programs.

Saltworks Theater, Bully Prevention in South Side Schools, \$10,000

King of the Mountain is an interactive drama that teaches elementary students to understand the causes of bullying behavior which are too often the result of violent or unhealthy circumstances at home.

The Ready Freddy team works directly with schools and communities to provide technical supports to help schools 1) increase on-time enrollment, 2) build quality transition events that foster crucial early relationships between families and schools, 3) promote excitement for children and families on the first day, and 4) encourage continued regular attendance and parent engagement throughout the year.

UPMC Mercy, Zelda B. Oates Walk-In Clinic, \$250,000

Bequest from Zelda B. Oates Estate will be used renovate and upgrade the UPMC Mercy South Side Walk-In Clinic and Same-Day Surgery Center.

Voices Against Violence/Youthplaces, Voices Against Violence In-School Retention Drop-Out Prevention Program, \$80,000

The program is designed to increase the High School graduation and employment rates of low income community youth attending Brashear/Carrick High Schools.

Voices Against Violence/Youthplaces, Voices Against Violence Restoration Project, \$40,000 The Voices Against Violence Restoration Project is designed to help young men and women, residing in the Hilltop communities, such as ex-offenders, ex-drug dealers and gang members, by assisting individuals who desire to learn a trade and help them obtain their G.E.D and to further their education.

Voices Against Violence Ma'at Summer Camp Experience will provide a free, safe and structured program at McKinley Recreation Center serving 180 youth, ages 6-17 both male and female in the South Pittsburgh Communities of Allentown, Arlington, Arlington Heights, Beltzhoover, Bon Air, Carrick, Knoxville, Lower Mt. Washington and Mt. Oliver. The camp will provide structured programming from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

YouthWorks, Inc, JumpStart Success, \$40,000

JumpStart Success (JSS) career exploration and job readiness training curriculum is a year-long after school program that incorporates YouthWork's previous stand-alone career exploration activities: job tours, job shadowing, and Cool Hot Jobs speaker series into a comprehensive format.

Applying for a Grant

The grant process will now be conducted through the online system on the foundation's website (http://foundationcenter.org/grantmaker/birminghamfdn/apply.html). Grant applicants will first submit a letter of inquiry, and if accepted, will receive email notification to complete a grant application. Grant applicants will be able to copy and paste and/or upload documents straight to the grant application. Applications can also be saved and completed later if not all information is available.

Limitations

Grants are limited to organizations, which qualify as public charity for 501(c)(3) tax exemption.

Grants are not normally made for operating budgets, deficits, fund-raising campaigns, general research, scholarships, political campaigns, or loans.

Grants are not made to individuals, to other private foundations, for sectarian religious activities, or for the efforts to influence legislation unless grant-related.

Grants are awarded for a limited period of time, such as 1-3 years.

Most grant awards will be in the range of \$2,500 to \$50,000.

The neighborhoods in its target area include: Allentown, Arlington, Arlington Heights, Beltzhoover, Bon Air, Carrick, Duquesne Heights, Knoxville, Mt. Oliver, Mt. Washington, and South Side.

The Foundation also hosts meetings for the **Minority Emergency Preparedness Task Force**, which assesses the emergency preparedness needs of Hilltop communities.

Technical assistance is also provided on an ongoing basis to grantees, other nonprofit organizations, local officials and community leaders with the purpose of increasing capacity, networking and leveraging other resources.

The Birmingham Foundation is a private (independent) community-focused foundation dedicated to health-related and human services grantmaking in South Pittsburgh. Our Board of Directors is guided by this vision statement: The Foundation serves as a change agent for improved health and wellness in South Pittsburgh through the dynamic use of resources such as grantmaking, information-sharing, partnering and leveraging of assets.

Founded in 1996 as a private foundation with assets from the sale of South Side Hospital to UPMC, the Birmingham Foundation has awarded over \$14.5 million in grants to over 175 organizations since grantmaking began in 1997. Our target area includes 13 communities, among which are Allentown, Arlington, Beltzhoover, Carrick, Knoxville, Mt. Oliver, Mt Washington, and the South Side (zip codes 15203, 15210 and 15211).

Our priority areas include: improving youth outcomes, improving health care outcomes, and strategies for neighborhood development. Focus areas also include vulnerable populations and health disparities. Letters of interest are accepted year-round with grants awarded in April and November. Visit our website at www.birminghamfoundation.org for grant guidelines and application instructions.

In addition to grantmaking, the Foundation serves as a resource partner to develop and share information and promote collaboration on health-related issues through summits, convening groups, and publications. The latter include, *The Birmingham Directory, a* resource guide to health, human services and community services in South Pittsburgh, *Reweaving the Social Fabric,* a community health assessment, an annual *Summer Fun in the South* youth program guide, and biannual reports. The Foundation has played a role in the formation of several local efforts, including the South Pittsburgh Coalition for Peace and Hilltop Health Ministries Consortium. The Foundation convenes meetings of the Minority Emergency Preparedness Task Force and was previously fiscal agent for the Hilltop Alliance.

The Foundation is ably guided by a very active 11-member Board of Directors which represents the community in making decisions regarding both our grantmaking investments and our financial investments. Board Chair Terry Wirginis, one of five founding members whose commitment continues, leads the Board. Directors include Maurita Bryant, Hugo Churchill, Don Gordon, Carey Harris, Beth Marcello, Mike Marcu, Kenneth McCrory, William Simmons, Eileen Smith, and Biff Swager. Floyd R. Ganassi is an *Emeritus Chair* and Jane Roesch and Roberta Smith are *Emeritus Directors*.

Foundation staff includes Executive Director Mark Bibro and Administrative Assistant, Chris Mason.
