THE BCMW PROGRAM SERVES CHILDREN IN A 9 MONTH PROGRAM AND IN A FULL DAY/FULL YEAR PROGRAM. THE FULL DAY/FULL YEAR PROGRAM SERVES WORKING FAMILIES WHO NEED CHILD CARE. CHILD CARE SERVICES ARE LIMITED TO MARION COUNTY (CENTRALIA) AND WASHINGTON COUNTY (NASHVILLE). BCMW WAS ABLE TO OFFER SLOTS TO PARENTS WHO MIGHT NOT OTHERWISE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO AFFORD IT.
