In order to further Saint Agnes Healthcare's mission of providing quality healthcare and serving the poor, the Saint Agnes Foundation is developing the philanthropic resources needed to help fund and support the Campus Revitalization Project for Saint Agnes Healthcare, which includes constructing a new patient tower, redevelopment of the existing patient tower, the expansion and redesign of the Saint Agnes Cancer Center,

Baltimore Medical Systems (BMS), a full-service health clinic located at Saint Agnes Healthcare provides ambulatory care, plus a range of primary care services, including pediatrics, specialty, OB/GYN, and adult medicine. BMS sees approximately 25,000 patients per year, many of which are uninsured or low income community members in need of healthcare services. Saint Agnes Foundation provided \$240,595 of support

The Respect fund helps fund the costs of continuing education for the staff of Saint Agnes Healthcare. The Oncology funds have helped continue the education and training of the physicians practicing at Saint Agnes Healthcare. The Oncology funds have also funded Cancer Survivors Day, which celebrates the successes of those that have survived cancer and provides additional
