Delinquent International Information Return Submission

STATEMENT OF REASONABLE CAUSE

The University of Virginia Law School Foundation (Foundation) is an IRC §501(c)(3) tax exempt organization whose primary purpose is to receive, manage and expend funds for the benefit of the University of Virginia School of Law. It was formed in 1968 and has grown substantially over the years including building a significant investment fund whose income is used for the benefit of the University of Virginia School of Law. The Foundation reports its audited financial statements and its tax information using a June 30 fiscal year end.

During 2016, it was discovered that the Foundation had not filed IRS Form 926, Return by a U. S. Transferor of Property to a Foreign Corporation for several prior years. The Foundation believes that reasonable cause exists for not timely filing these information returns.

The Foundation wishes to follow the procedures as provided by the IRS in the "delinquent international information return submission process" as a taxpayer who:

- 1) Has not filed one or more required international information returns,
- 2) Has reasonable cause for not timely filing the information returns,
- 3) Is not under civil examination or criminal investigation by the IRS, and
- 4) Has not already been contacted by the IRS about the delinquent information returns.

The Foundation is filing amended Form 990 including the applicable Forms 926 and/or Form 990, Schedule F as follows:

- 1) Tax year ended June 30, 2011
- 2) Tax year ended June 30, 2012
- 3) Tax year ended June 30, 2013

A copy of this document which includes a statement of reasonable cause is attached to each of those amended tax returns. The Foundation was not required to file a Form 926 for tax year ended June 30, 2010 nor was it required to file a Form 926 for tax year ended June 30, 2014 or June 30, 2015. The current year return for June 30, 2016 included the appropriate international information return submissions.

The Foundation has timely filed all Forms 990, has timely filed the appropriate foreign bank account reporting (FBAR) reports, has included and reported all assets invested in foreign

corporations, has included and reported all income from all sources including foreign corporations and believes that it is in full compliance in all respects other than the inadvertent omissions of these international information return Forms 926 for several years.

REASONABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

Over the course of the years of its existence, the Foundation's asset base has grown and, accordingly, its investment structure of such assets has become more complex. A decision was made by the Foundation's Board through its Investment Committee a number of years ago to restructure their investment portfolio and a substantial amount of their assets were transferred to be managed by the University of Virginia Investment Management Company (UVIMCO) which invests assets for other University of Virginia related foundations. Subsequent to such a decision, in order to diversify their investment portfolio, the Investment Committee engaged a nationally recognized outside investment advisor to advise them on the feasibility, practicability and fiduciary responsibilities commensurate with investing in or with international organizations as the world entered a more global economy. A portion of their assets were subsequently invested through this advisor.

The Foundation has for many years employed qualified professionals as its Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and Chief Financial Officer (CFO). The CFO reports to the CEO and was charged with oversight of the reporting responsibilities for the various investments held by and the activities of the Foundation. In addition, the Foundation employed for numerous years a large international accounting firm to conduct an audit of its financial affairs as well as to assist with the annual tax reporting obligations. The CFO in exercising ordinary business care and prudence reasonably relied on the guidance of the outside investment advisor and/or the international accounting firm as they transitioned into new investment vehicles including the international investments.

As stated earlier, as each new type of investment came online, the CFO working with the professional advisors thoroughly investigated what reporting obligations for both audit and tax would be involved and documented those that were one-time compliance requirements and those which were on-going compliance requirements. However, in subsequent years when similar investments were made, the compliance requirements were not re-examined but rather reliance was made on the prior work resulting in the audit and tax reporting being done consistently throughout the years. As with any organization, periodically the person holding the CFO role has changed but again in prudent and business-like manner, the new CFO relied on the process and procedures in place and the consistency of reporting over the years.

Upon the discovery of the omission of the required filing of Form 926 on the occurrence of the investment of funds in excess of \$100,000 into a foreign corporation, the Foundation has taken steps to make sure that they are in full compliance going forward and also to address the

omissions in the prior filings. The Foundation has not been able to ascertain why during the first years of the foreign investments, neither the investment advisors nor the international accounting firm who were experts in such matters did not advise the CFO of the requirement for the filing of the Form 926. Once this omission occurred, the pattern of established policies and procedures were followed in subsequent years. As stated earlier, it would not be prudent or practical for the Foundation to re-examine every filing and reporting responsibility in detail each year for every business matter and, thus, they reasonably relied on the due diligence that had been done in prior years in similar circumstances. Once the omission was discovered, the Foundation has taken steps to correct it through the filing of these amended returns including the omitted Forms 926.

It is important to note that all financial transactions have been fully reported and disclosed, there is no unpaid tax or other consequence but simply the omission of the timely filing of one international information return in the applicable tax year(s). The Foundation has taken the appropriate steps to ensure that the omission of such filings will not recur again in the future. We believe this provides reasonable cause for the omission as provided in the delinquent international information return submission procedures.

Additionally, as required, this is to certify that the Foundation for which the information returns are being filed was not engaged in any tax evasion activity.
