This Form 990 was filled out by an unpaid volunteer who served as last year's Treasurer, filed last year's tax return and was asked to do this again by this year's Board. Since he is no longer an officer and no longer lives in the area, he is not authorized to sign it, even though he has full confidence that it has been correctly prepared.

Form 990, Item G, Gross Receipts.

The Form 990 instructions are now 90 pages long and this does not count the instructions for all of the Schedules which are also required. The entry for this item is described on Page 9 of these instructions. The \$346,765 comes, per the instructions, from adding together lines 8b and 12 from Part VIII of this Form 990.

Form 990, Part I, Line 1.

Attached is a copy of the Plantation Community Foundation's Annual Report for 2012. The Mission Statement can be found here and it states:

“The Foundation supports agencies engaged in social services, health, cultural enrichment, education and the environment. The Foundation accepts grant applications from agencies which serve South Sarasota County residents and which meet IRS Code Section 501(c)(3) requirements.”

All of the Foundation’s activities are clearly shown in the attached Annual Report.

Form 990, Part III. Line1.

Why the Internal Revenue Service is immediately asking us again to describe our Mission a second time is very hard to understand and seems quite dumb. Please refer to the above paragraph.

On Page 2 of the instructions for the Form 990 is a section entitled “Purpose of Form”. It specifically says “how the public perceives an organization...can be determined by information presented on its return.” Likewise, the public’s perception of the Internal Revenue Service can also be perceived by the idiotic rules that they apply to absolutely “plain vanilla” foundations such as ours. It makes no sense that the IRS has changed their rules and now require a foundation such as ours to file the exact returns and schedules as the largest foundations in the country are required to file.

Form 990, Part III, Line 4a.

A copy of the 2012 Annual Report is attached. It shows all 41 of the IRC Section 501(c)(3) organizations that received Grants from us during this fiscal year. As shown, on the Annual Report, the net amount of Grants distributed was \$119,080. The largest of these 41 Grants was for \$7,335 and the smallest was for \$500. The purpose of each Grant is also shown in the Annual Report. As noted, all recipients had been given IRC Section 501(c)(3) status by the Internal Revenue Service.

Before any Grants are approved a member of the Grants Committee personally visits the organization so that the Grants Committee is able to accurately judge the actual need.

Like the Directors, all Grants Committee personnel are retired unpaid volunteers who have absolutely no connection to any of the organizations that they review to judge the worthiness of their needs compared to all of the other areas of need in our community.

The Form 990 instructions on Page 10 are not completely clear. The money to pay these Grants is raised thru various fund raising events as well as annual membership donations of \$125. The three biggest fund raisers for FY 2012 were the Celebrity Gold Classic, the Royal Ride and Something Different. The total income for all of the events is shown in the attached Annual Report. This Annual

Report also lists all of the individuals who paid annual donations of \$125. The many volunteers for the various fund raising events usually come from this membership list.

The various fund raising activities earned \$203,348 of Gross Receipts which were offset by \$105,204 of expenses for a net fund raising income of \$98,144.

Other than two clerical positions which are part time, no salaries or any other kind of payments are given to anyone who is involved in the Foundation. The expenses that are incurred are all of a type that anyone would associate with these kinds of activities.

We have a small office which we rent for \$100 a month, out of which all Foundation functions are carried out. The entire concept of "Program Service Accomplishments" does not relate to a small Foundation such as the Plantation Community Foundation.

Form 990, Part VI, Section A, Lines 1a, 6 and 7a.

The members of the Foundation are those individuals and families who pay the \$125 annual membership donations. All "elected" positions have to put in a lot of time, so there are no real elections. We often have trouble finding volunteers to fill all of our positions, so the concept referred to in this Form is not valid for our organization.

Form 990, Part VI, Section B, Line 11b.

Like the current Treasurer, all of our volunteers are unpaid retirees with basically no background in exempt organization tax law. This return was passed around and all Directors had a chance to look at it and ask any questions they may have had to the volunteer Treasurer. No changes were required.

If the Foundation had paid someone thousands of dollars to make up and file this return we would have had to cut back on the Grants which we distributed in our community. We would rather help the needy in our community than pay large tax preparation fees to fill out bureaucratic forms that do not benefit anyone except those paid to process them.

Form 990, Part VI, Section C, Lines 17 and 19.

Every year the Foundation pays a fee and registers with the Florida Department of State, Division of Corporations. As far as we can determine, a copy of our Form 990 has never been requested by the State of Florida.

All Foundation documents are open for inspection in our office during normal office hours. We do not have our own website.

Form 990, Part VII, Section A.

The average hours per week is a quick guess. Since no one is being paid this statistic has no real meaning in the case of our Foundation.

Form 990, Part VIII.

Attached is a copy of the Foundation's June 30, 2012 Trial Balance, which is the basis for the amounts shown on this return.

So that there are no future questions concerning where the various amounts came from, they will all be reconciled to the Trial Balance.

The “Huggy Bears” should be explained here. They are similar to small teddy bears and are made up by our volunteers who are given the raw materials (paid for by the

Foundation) and turn in finished “Huggy Bears”. These “Huggy Bears” are then given to our local Emergency Room and Ambulances so that if a small child is encountered they can be given something to embrace that is cuddly in their scary situation. These are distributed free - no money is accepted.

The source of the amounts shown on Schedule A, Part III in Column (e) are explained in Schedule A, Part IV, Supplemental Information. The prior year data came from this same schedule on last year's return.

Schedule D.

The amounts shown in Part VI come from Trial Balance Accounts 1640, 1645, 1745 and 1750. The amounts shown in Part IX come from Trial Balance Accounts 1500 and 1950.

Account 1950 is our investments which are managed by the Gulf Coast Community Foundation. They are a very large IRC Section 501(c)(3) organization that manages hundreds of millions of dollars for themselves and other

smaller organizations such as ours. For our reporting purposes, their 50 basis point fee is netted with our investment results.

In Part XIV (Supplemental Information) our Deferred Equity Program is discussed in detail.










