Note 1 - Formation and Operation

The Sturge-Weber Foundation ("Foundation") was formed in 1987 as a nonprofit foundation for parents, professionals and others concerned with the Sturge-Weber syndrome throughout the United States, and operate from rented premises located in Randolph, New Jersey. The Foundation's objectives are to act as a clearing house of information, to offer support, to educate and to provide research funding for the Sturge-Weber syndrome and related vascular conditions. Major sources of support include general contributions and special events related to the mission of the organization.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a. Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been presented on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles general accepted in the United States of America and in accordance with the AICPA's Audit and Accounting Guide, Nonprofit Foundation, and other pronouncements applicable to not-for-profit Foundations.

b. Basis of Presentation

The Foundation presents its financial statements in accordance with Financial Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Paragraphs 958-605-45-3 through 7, Contributions Received, and ASC Paragraphs 958-205-2(a) through (d) establishes standards for external financial reporting by not-for-profit foundations and requires that resources be classified for accounting and reporting purposes into three net asset categories according to externally (donor) imposed restrictions; unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. There were no permanently-restricted net assets in 2012 and 2011.

Paragraphs 958-605-45-3 through 7, *Contributions Received*, requires that unconditional promises to give be recorded as receivables and revenue and requires a foundation to distinguish between contributions received for each net asset category in accordance with donor imposed restrictions.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

b. Basis of Presentation (continued)

Accordingly, net assets of the Foundation and changes therein would be classified and reported as follows:

<u>Unrestricted net assets</u> consist of net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations. This represents the portion of expendable funds available to support the Foundation's programs and activities.

<u>Temporarily restricted net assets</u> consist of net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that may or will be met, either by actions of the Foundation and/or the passage of time. When a restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

c. Revenue and Support Recognition

Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recorded as received. All contributions are available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Conditional promises to give are recognized when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Unconditional promises to give due in the next year are recorded at their net realizable value. Unconditional promises to give due in subsequent years are reported at the present value of their net realizable value, using risk-free interest rates applicable to the years in which the promises are to be received.

The Foundation accounts for fundraising and grant revenue in the statement of activities to the extent that expenses have been incurred for the purpose specified by the grantor or customer during the period. In applying this concept, the legal and contractual requirements of each individual program are used as guidance. All amounts not expended in accordance with the grant are recorded as liability in the financial statements as the Foundation does not maintain any equity in the grant.

Additionally, funds received in advance of their proper usage are accounted for as deferred revenue in the statement of financial position.

d. Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Foundation considers all cash and other highly liquid investments with initial maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

e. Furniture and Equipment

Furniture and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. All expenditures for furniture and equipment in excess of \$1,000 with an estimated life of more than 1 year are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance, repairs, and renewals of minor items are charged to expenses as incurred. Major renewals/improvements are capitalized.

f. Impairments of Long-Lived Assets

The Foundation continually evaluates whether current events or circumstances warrant adjustments to the carrying value or estimated useful lives of fixed assets in accordance with the provisions of ASC 360-10-05, *Impairment or Disposals of Long-Lived Assets*.

g. Investments

Investments in certificates of deposit are measured on fair value based on market t prices in the statement of financial position. Investment income or loss is included in the statement of activities.

h. Fund Raising

Fund-raising includes the direct costs of special events and the allocation of employee's salaries and other costs involved in fund-raising and special events based on methods considered by management to be reasonable.

i. Functional Allocation of Expenses

Expenses are charged to each program based on expenditures incurred. Any program expenditures not directly chargeable are allocated to programs based on units of service and support cost is allocated to programs based on time spent. Program expenses are those related to community impact and mentoring program services. Management and general related to administrative expenses.

i. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and in the amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

k. Total Columns

The financial statements include certain prior-year summarized comparative information in total but not by net asset class. Such information does not include sufficient detail to constitute a presentation in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Accordingly, such information should be read in conjunction with the Foundation's financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2012 from which the summarized information was derived.

l. Income Taxes

The Foundation is a corporation described under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is therefore exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(a) of the Code. The Foundation is also exempt under Title 15 of the State of New Jersey Corporations and Associations Not for Profit Act. Accordingly, no provision of Federal or State income taxes has been presented in the accompanying financial statements. Management has stated that all required tax returns have been filed and taxes have been paid. The returns for the years ending June 30, 2010, 2011 and 2012 are subject to examination by the IRS.

m. Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The Foundation measures recurring assets and liabilities as defined by FASB ASC Topic 820, Fair Value Measurement and Disclosure. This ASC Topic defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, establishes a three-level fair value hierarchy based on quality of inputs used to measure fair value and enhances disclosure requirements for fair value measurements. The three fair value hierarchy levels are defined as follows:

Level 1- Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets.

Level 2- Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices in markets that are not active or model inputs that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3- Inputs to the valuation methodology are based on prices or valuation techniques that are unobservable.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

n. Revenue Recognition

Membership dues are recognized as income upon payment of membership fees. Program services fees are recognized as revenue upon registering for the program.

o. Donated Materials and Services

Certain professional services are sometimes donated to the Foundation. During the years ended June 30, 2012 and 2011, respectively, no material donated materials or services were received by the Foundation.

p. Fundraising costs

Fundraising costs for the years ended June 30, 2012 and 2011 totaled \$6,472 and \$6,984, respectively.

q. Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through November 21, 2012, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

r. Reclassifications

Certain reclassifications have been made to prior year amounts in order to conform to the current year presentation.

Note 3 - Financial Instruments with Off-Balance-Sheet Risk

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Foundation to significant concentrations of credit risk consist principally of cash and cash equivalents and its investments in securities. The Foundation maintains cash and cash equivalents with various New Jersey financial institutions where the balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or the Securities Investor Protection Corporation up to \$250,000. At times such investments may be in excess of the FDIC insurance limits. At June 30, 2012 the Foundation's uninsured cash balances totaled \$63,074. Periodic evaluations of the relative credit standing of these financial institutions are performed so as to minimize the risk.
