THE COMPUTER HISTORY MUSEUM (CHM) IN MOUNTAIN VIEW, CALIF, IS A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION INCORPORATED IN 1999, WITH A 25-YEAR HISTORY AS PART OF THE COMPUTER MUSEUM IN BOSTON, MASS THE MUSEUM IS DEDICATED TO THE PRESERVATION AND CELEBRATION OF COMPUTING HISTORY AND THE EXPLORATION OF ITS SOCIAL IMPACT THE MUSEUM'S PHYSICAL COLLECTION PROVIDES A RICH VARIETY OF INFORMATION, EXHIBITS, RESEARCH AND A VAST LIBRARY OF ONLINE MULTIMEDIA CONTENT THE MUSEUM'S VISITORSHIP IS APPROACHING 125,000 PHYSICAL VISITORS ANNUALLY ON ITS MOUNTAIN VIEW, CALIFORNIA, CAMPUS AND MORE THAN 3 MILLION VISITORS A YEAR TO ITS CYBER MUSEUM (WWW.COMPUTERHISTORY.ORG) AND ITS RICH AND EDUCATIONAL YOUTUBE CHANNEL (WWW.YOUTUBE.COM/COMPUTERHISTORY)

SESSIONS ARE CONDUCTED MONTHLY, TO ENSURE THAT DOCENT SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE ARE KEPT CURRENT THE MUSEUM IS ENGAGED IN AN ONGOING EFFORT TO ASSESS THE LEARNING OUTCOMES OF OUR EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS WE
