WHEREAS, the Fort Belknap College, Inc., hereinafter "College," by and through its Board of Directors, has requested an official name change from Fort Belknap College, Inc. to Aaniih Nakoda College, Inc. for purposes of cultural and historical significance; and

WHEREAS, the College President and Board of Directors support and desire the name change through the issuance and adoption of the attached Restated and Amended Articles of Incorporation; and

WHEREAS, the College President and Board of Directors request the support of the Fort Belknap Indian Community in order to effectuate the name change on its behalf; and

WHEREAS, the Aaniih Nakoda College, Inc. will continue to provide quality post-secondary education programs to the residents of the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation and the surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, by adopting the Restated and Amended Articles of Incorporation, the Council is in no way dissolving or altering the existence of the College but instead only updating the existing Articles of Incorporation to include the name change from Fort Belknap College, Inc. to the culturally significant name Aaniih Nakoda College, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, as provided in the Restated and Amended Articles of Incorporation, the College will continue and retain its autonomy from the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council in order to continue compliance with the accreditation standards set forth by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities, the regional accrediting agency.



EXHIBIT A

Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation of:

Aaniih Nakoda College, Inc. (A Tribal Corporation)

Pursuant to the authority of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Fort Belknap Tribes, approved on the 13th day of December 1935, the governing body of the Fort Belknap Indian Community, the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council hereby issues and adopts the Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation for Aaniih Nakoda College, Inc. as follows:

ARTICLE I (Amended) NAME

The name of the corporation is "Aaniih Nakoda College, Inc.," hereinafter "College." The term for the duration of the existence of the College is perpetual from and after the Council's adoption of these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation and the certification by the Secretary of the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council.

ARTICLE II (Amended) PURPOSES

The College is formed for any lawful purpose, including:

A. To provide post-secondary educational opportunities for individuals and residents of the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation including, but not limited to:

1. Vocational Training.
2. College Transfer Programs.
3. Occupational Training.
4. Community Service.
5. Indian Culture and History.

B. To measure the needs, talents and aspirations of the residents of the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation and to provide a comprehensive program in recognition of the desires of the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation Community.

C. To promote and conduct such research and development activities as deemed necessary to the efficient provision of post secondary educational opportunities on the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation.

ARTICLE III (Amended and Restated) POWERS

The College shall have the following powers:

- A. To have perpetual existence in its corporate name with the power to dissolve reserved to the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council and College Board pursuant to its Bylaws.
- B. To sue and be sued, complain and defend, in its corporate name in courts of competent jurisdiction.
- C. To have a corporate seal which may be altered at its pleasure, pursuant to its Bylaws, and to use the same by causing it, or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed or affixed or in any other matter reproduced.
- D. To purchase, take, receive, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, improve, use and otherwise deal in and with, real property (trust and/or fee), personal property or any interest therein, wherever situated within the boundary of the Fort Belknap Indian Reservation.
- E. To sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease exchange, transfer, and otherwise dispose of all, or any part of its property and asset providing the Community Council has first preference in purchasing the property or asset.
- F. To elect or appoint officers and agents of the College, and define their duties and fix their compensation.
- G. To make and alter Bylaws, not inconsistent with these Restated and Amended Articles of Incorporation, laws of the Fort Belknap Indian Community or United States, for the administration of the affairs of the College.
- H. To engage in any educational endeavor that will further the socio-economic well-being of the College or to undertake any activity of any nature whatsoever, not inconsistent with federal law or the Constitution and ordinances of the Fort Belknap Indian Community.
- I. To make and perform contracts and agreements of every description not inconsistent with federal law or with any provisions of the Constitution and ordinances of the Fort Belknap Indian Community, with any persons, association or corporation, county, municipality, town or with the United States or State of Montana.
- J. To have and exercise all powers necessary or convenient to effect and or all of the purposes for which the College is organized that are not inconsistent with the laws of the Fort Belknap Indian Community or with federal law.
- K. To cooperate with other similar associations in creating central, regional, or national agencies for any of the purposes for which this College is formed, and to become a member of or stockholder of, such agencies as are now or hereinafter may be in existence.

L. To accept and receive any grants of private, state or federal funds to aid in the furtherance of the purposes of the College.

M. To confer certificates, diplomas, and post secondary degrees to students who have satisfactorily completed an approved course or courses of studies.

N. To prescribe courses of study, programs, textbooks, and materials to be used, to charge tuition, board, rent student union fees, building fees or other fees necessary to operate the College.

O. The Sections contained in this Article shall be in no way limited or restricted by reference to, or inference from the terms of any other Section with the exception of Section J, which all Sections in this Article must comply.

ARTICLE IV (Amended and Restated) HEADQUARTERS AND REGISTERED AGENT

The College's headquarters is at the Fort Belknap Agency and the name of its registered agent is President Carole Falcon-Chandler, PO Box 159, Harlem, Montana 59526 or any subsequent College President.

ARTICLE V (Amended and Restated) DISPOSITION OF ASSETS

No asset or earnings of the College shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to, its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the College shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation. No substantial part of the activities of the College shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the College shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing and distribution of statements) and political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Amended and Restated Articles of Incorporation, the College shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax and under Section 510(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code or by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c) of the Internal Revenue Code, as amended.

ARTICLE VI (Amended and Restated) DISSOLUTION

The College may be dissolved by an affirmative action by the College when authorized in the following manner:

A. The Board of Directors must adopt a resolution recommending that the College be dissolved.

B. Upon adoption of the resolution, a statement of intent to dissolve shall be executed in duplicate by the College by its President and certified by its Secretary stating:

1. The name of the College: AANIIH NAKODA COLLEGE, INC.
2. The names and respective addresses of its officers.
3. The names and respective addresses of its directors.
4. A copy of the resolution adopted by the Board of Directors authorizing the dissolution.

C. Duplicate originals of the statement of intention to dissolve shall be delivered to the Secretary of the Community Council.

D. The Fort Belknap Indian Community Council shall consider the Board's resolution and either approve it or deny it by affirmative vote and Council resolution. If dissolved, the College shall dispense with its assets subject to Article V and in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE VII (Restated and Amended) ANNUAL REPORT

The College shall file an annual report no later than April 1 of each year with the Fort Belknap Indian Community Council. The report shall contain at a minimum:

- A. The names of the current Board of Directors and President;
- B. A census of all students including the total number of Tribal members enrolled as full-time and part-time students and the total number of non-tribal full-time and part-time students;
- C. A copy of the annual audit and evaluations of various programs administered by the College including accreditation evaluations and reports; and
- D. A statement showing the annual operating budget of the College from tuition, grants, gifts, and interest from endowment funds.

The College President may present the annual report to the Community Council upon request.

ARTICLE VIII (Restated and Amended) Community Council Authority

At all times the Community Council shall possess the power to adopt ordinances, resolutions, rules and/or regulations it deems appropriate to protect the health, safety and welfare of its citizens. Nevertheless, the College shall retain its existing autonomy from Fort Belknap Indian Community Council to meet the standards set forth by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities, the regional accrediting agency.
