HUMANE CARE AND OUTREACH Canton & Stark County, OhioWhen the city council in Canton was considering renewing the contract of an animal control service whose owner had already been reprimanded for possible animal cruelty, Alley Cat Allies mobilized our activists in the region, took out ads in the local newspaper, testified at a city council meeting, organized a Town Hall gathering, and hosted a Spay-A-Thon to help cats from all over Stark County The owner declined to continue his contract to the city, and the local Stark County Humane Society started a pilot TNR program that neuters feral cats for free Galloway Township, New JerseyA New Jersey news team reported on live TV in June 2012 about a colony of cats living on the grounds of Aloe Village senior community in Galloway Township The news team alerted animal control officers, who promptly removed some cats and turned them in to a shelter where six kittens were killed Alley Cat Allies' staff arrned on the scene, educated both the property managers and residents that they could stop the killing, and began doing Trap-Neuter-Return Our intervention at Aloe Village saved more than 60 cats' lives Gatesville, TexasAlthough many of the 175 feral cats living at a prison in Gatesville had been neutered, vaccinated, and tended to for years, Alley Cat Allies learned in April 2012 that the new warden wanted them gone Working closely with two local groups, Alley Cat Allies intervened and convinced prison officials to stop trapping cats and approve Trap-Neuter-Return instead at no cost to taxpayers Officials are now considering implementing a comprehensive TNR plan for the other 18 prison facilities in the region Laurel, MarylandCollaborating closely with Laurel residents, Alley Cat Allies presented a standing-room-only workshop on the benefits of a community TNR program in the spring of 2012 Among the 70 attendees was Mayor Craig Moe, who subsequently publicly endorsed Trap-Neuter-Return for the city Alley Cat Allies is now involved in a city committee that continues to work closely with the community, holding workshops and helping implement a program that will best benefit the cats and people of Laurel Feral Friends NetworkMembers of our Feral Friends Network are our on-the-ground allies providing people with local Trap-Neuter-Return and spay/neuter expertise The network is a group of organizations, individuals, and veterinary practices who can provide guidance, knowledge, and services to help a person new to feral cats and their care Launched soon after we formed, the Feral Friends Network has helped tens of thousands of individuals over the years obtain the resources they need to start organized TNR programs in their own communities In 2012, the network grew by 13% 1,205 members of the network helped advocates, caregivers, and interested individuals new to the movement by providing their feral cat expertise and services Thanks to our members in all 50 states (and Washington, DC) and 18 countrnes, Alley Cat Allies was able to respond to nearly 5,000 [4,900 to be exact] requests for local resources

EDUCATION AND AWARENESS Santa Ana, CaliforniaAfter city officials in Santa Ana announced a misguided plan to trap feral cats to prevent the spread of typhus, we immediately contacted them to let them know that typhus is spread by fleas-not cats We requested a moratorium on the trapping and offered to help educate the community about flea prevention for their pets The following week, three Alley Cat Allies staff members were on the ground in Santa Ana assisting city officials in speaking with 300 residents at a community educational fair where we provided flea treatments and bilingual materials on local spay/neuter resources National Feral Cat Day 2011Alley Cat Allies founded National Feral Cat Day in 2001 to raise awareness about feral cats and Trap-Neuter-Return In 2011, our slogan was Compassion for Cats Coast to Coast We soared past our goal of 250 events, one in every state, for National Feral Cat Day 2011 In fact, more than 350 events were held across the country Helping Cats in Your Community WebinarIn Summer FY 2012, we launched an exciting new resource for caregivers all over the country our first Helping Cats in Your Community webinar Since the kick-off in July, there have been close to 100 attendees from all around the country, including professionals from the veterinary field, learning the life-saving basics of TNR

LAW AND POLICY Wake County, North CarolinaWe filed a lawsuit in late January after hearing that Wake County Animal Control was trapping cats and refusing to release them to their caregivers After our legal strategy saved two cats, we rallied the community to successfully convince the Wake County Board of Commissioners to adopt a model TNR ordinance that protects cats and caregivers Camden County, New JerseyIn the spring of 2012, the Camden County Association of Mayors asked Alley Cat Allies to speak about the importance of Trap-Neuter-Return at its monthly association meeting The presentation was so well received that we helped craft a new model ordinance supporting TNR which we hope will be enacted by all 37 municipalities in Camden County in the coming year Brevard County, FloridaThis year, the Brevard County Commissioners abruptly suspended key elements of the county's TNR program, which Alley Cat Allies helped to put in place 14 years ago We hosted letter writing meetings, organized town hall meetings and workshops, created educational materials, placed an open letter to the commissioners in Florida Today and supported a lawsuit to oppose the commissioners' plans to roll back more than a decade of humane care in Brevard County Orlando, FloridaCats at Loews hotels in Orlando were cared for by employees when the national chain suddenly reversed its support for TNR at three of its Orlando properties and began trapping cats A mother cat and her kittens were taken to a local shelter and killed We worked with a local group to rescue the cats as they were brought in to the shelter, while simultaneous rallying support for the cats' to remain in their homes Our major campaign in Orlando culminated in a rally staged across the street from the hotels and a petition bearing more than 31,000 signatures telling Loews to let the cats stay


