We have audited the accompanying consolidated balance sheet of El Paso Children's Hospital and Affiliate (the "Hospital"), Texas non-profit corporations, as of September 30, 2012, and the related consolidated statements of operations and cash flows for the year then ended. These consolidated financial statements are the responsibility of the Hospital's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these consolidated financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes consideration of internal control over financial reporting as a basis for designing audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Hospital's internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the consolidated financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Hospital as of September 30, 2012, and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared assuming that the Hospital will continue as a going concern. As shown in the consolidated financial statements, the Hospital incurred a net operating loss of \$23,135,844 during the year ended September 30, 2012, and as of that date, current liabilities exceeded current assets by \$20,877,273, and total liabilities exceeded total assets resulting in a net deficit of \$22,943,313. These factors, as well as the uncertain conditions that the Hospital faces regarding its loans and borrowings with UMC (as discussed in Notes 6 and 7) raise substantial doubt about the Hospital's ability to continue as a going concern. Management's plans regarding those matters also are described in Note 3. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that might result from the outcomes of this uncertainty.

Note 1 – Description of Organization

Organization – El Paso Children's Hospital and affiliate (the "Hospital") provides pediatric inpatient, outpatient, and emergency care services to the residents of El Paso and the surrounding areas. The Hospital is governed by its Board of Directors, which have the authority and responsibility for management, control, and administration of the Hospital.

El Paso Children's Hospital was formed on August 8, 2007 as a non-profit corporation located in El Paso, Texas, and is located within the University Medical Center of El Paso (UMC) facility. The Hospital consists of approximately 225,000 square feet of the UMC facility with 122 private pediatric rooms, a pediatric emergency room, a pediatric inpatient and outpatient infusion center, pediatric operating rooms, and a pediatric rehabilitation center. The Hospital was in the development stage as of September 30, 2011. El Paso Children's Hospital received the Joint Commission accreditation on March 8, 2012 and received their Medicaid provider number in June 2012. The Hospital is the only separately licensed, non-taxing, independent 501(c)(3) non-profit hospital in the El Paso region and the only dedicated pediatric hospital within a 200-mile radius of El Paso, Texas. Through the hospital's partnership with Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, the Hospital conducts pediatric research and education and serves as a teaching hospital for the Texas Tech residency program.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of consolidation – These consolidated financial statements include the accounts of El Paso Children's Hospital as well as El Paso Children's Physician Group (Physician Group), a non-profit affiliate organized under the laws of the State of Texas and recognized as tax-exempt pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Service Code. The Physician Group was formed on March 3, 2012 and is governed by its Board of Directors. The purpose of the Physician Group is to employ and manage the pediatric specialty physicians. The Hospital has been deemed to have control over the Physician Group as all members of the board of directors of the Physician Group are also members of the board of the Hospital, and both organizations share the same management. The intercompany balances and transactions have been eliminated in consolidation.

Basis of presentation – Financial statement presentation follows the requirements of Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 958-205, *Not-for-Profit Entities–Presentation of Financial Statements*. Under this guidance, the Hospital is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

Use of estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Significant estimates contained in the Hospital's financial statements include the allowance for doubtful accounts, contractual allowances which are netted within patient accounts receivable, estimated third-party payor settlements, and depreciation and amortization. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Recent accounting pronouncements – During the year ended September 30, 2012, the Hospital adopted FASB ASU 2010-23, *Health Care Entities (Topic 954) Measuring Charity Care for Disclosure*, and FASB ASU 2010-24, *Health Care Entities (Topic 954) Presentation of Insurance Claims and Related Insurance Recoveries*. In accordance with FASB ASU 2010-23, charity care has been disclosed in Note 11 at the cost of providing the related services for the year ended September 30, 2012. FASB ASU 2010-24 requires the estimated liability on insurance claims, such as medical malpractice claims and workers compensation claims, to be separately recorded from the insurance recoveries. The Hospital had no such claims as all such claims are the responsibility of UMC and are a component of the services agreements described in Note 7. Thus, this recent pronouncement has no impact on the consolidated balance sheet as of September 30, 2012. Further, the adoptions of FASB ASU 2010-23 and 2010-24 had no impact to the amounts reported in the statements of operations and cash flows.

During the year ended September 30, 2012, the Hospital early adopted FASB ASU 2011-07, *Health Care Entities (Topic 954) Presentation and Disclosure of Patient Service Revenue, Provision for Bad Debts, and the Allowance for Doubtful Accounts for Certain Health Care Entities*. The amendments in the guidance require that health care entities that have a policy of providing services to patients and recording significant patient service revenue regardless of their ability to pay to present bad debt expense separately as a deduction from patient service revenue. This presentation applies only to bad debts on patient service revenue; bad debt expense related to other sources of revenue will continue to be reported as operating expense. In addition, upon adoption, such health care entities are required to include expanded disclosures related to patient service revenue and patient accounts receivable. The Hospital's financial statements include these expanded disclosures.

Cash and cash equivalents – The Hospital maintains cash and cash equivalent accounts at financial institutions which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Hospital considers all liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less to be cash equivalents. The Hospital has not experienced any losses in such accounts, and management believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk held at these financial institutions. The carrying amount reported in the consolidated balance sheet for cash and cash equivalents approximates fair value.

Patient accounts receivable and allowances – The Hospital reports patient accounts receivable for services rendered at net realizable amounts due from third-party payers, patients, and others. Accounts receivable are reduced by an allowance for doubtful accounts. In evaluating the collectability of accounts receivable, the Hospital analyzes its collection information and existing economic conditions, identifies trends for each of its major payor sources of revenue, and percentages of accounts receivable aging categories to estimate the appropriate allowance for doubtful accounts. The Hospital outsources the billings and collections functions to a third-party service provider. The service provider bills third-party payors directly and bills the patient when the patient's liability is determined. Management regularly reviews data about these major payor sources of revenue in evaluating the sufficiency of the allowance for doubtful accounts. For receivables associated with services provided to patients who have third-party coverage, the Hospital analyzes contractually due amounts and provides an allowance for doubtful accounts, if necessary. For receivables associated with self-pay patients, the Hospital records a

significant allowance for doubtful accounts in the period of service on the basis of its past experience, which indicates that many patients are unable or unwilling to pay the portion of their bill for which they are financially responsible.

Contractual allowances represent the amounts which reduce patient accounts receivable to amounts that are considered to be due from third-party payors based on existing contracts or negotiated settlements with these payors. The contractual allowance percentages are updated several times per year by payor class and line of business. Contractual allowances are deducted from gross patient accounts receivable on the consolidated balance sheet.

The Hospital's allowance for doubtful accounts for self-pay patients was 86% of self-pay accounts receivable at September 30, 2012. During the year ended September 30, 2012, the Hospital wrote off no self-pay receivables, nor did the Hospital change its charity care or uninsured discount policies. The Hospital does not maintain a material allowance for doubtful accounts from third-party payors, nor did it have significant write-offs from third-party payors.

Management believes that the allowances for doubtful accounts and contractual allowances are adequate. Because of the uncertainty regarding the ultimate collectability of patient accounts receivable, there is a possibility that recorded estimates of the allowance for doubtful accounts and contractual allowances will change by a material amount in the near term.

Inventories – Inventories are stated at lower of cost or market (the first-in, first-out method) and consist primarily of medical, surgical, and maintenance supplies and pharmaceuticals.

Property and equipment – Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Property and equipment donated for Hospital operations are recorded at fair value at the date of donation as additions to unrestricted net assets when the assets are placed in service. Additions, improvements, and other capital outlays that significantly extend the useful life of an asset and are greater than \$2,500 are capitalized. Costs incurred for repair and maintenance are expensed as incurred.

Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the assets' estimated useful lives ranging from 5 to 15 years. Leasehold improvements are amortized over their useful lives not to exceed the term of the related lease agreement.

The Hospital determines that an impairment write-down is necessary whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of an asset may not be recoverable. Recoverability of assets to be held and used is measured by a comparison of the carrying amount of an asset to future undiscounted net cash flows expected to be generated by the asset. If such assets are considered to be impaired, the impairment to be recognized is measured by the amount by which the carrying amount of the assets exceeds the fair value of the assets. There were no impairment charges for the year ended September 30, 2012.

Net assets and changes therein – Net assets, income, expenses, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions. Unrestricted net assets represent resources that are not subject to donor-imposed restrictions and are available to support the Hospital activities.

Net patient service revenue – The Hospital has agreements with third-party payers that provide for payments to the Hospital at amounts different from its established rates. Payment arrangements include prospectively determined rates per discharge, reimbursed cost, discounted charges, and per diem payments. Net patient service revenue is reported at the estimated net realizable amounts from patients, third-party payers, and others for services rendered, including estimated retroactive revenue adjustments under reimbursement agreements with third-party payers. Retroactive adjustments are considered in the recognition of revenue on an estimated basis in the period the related services are rendered, and such estimated amounts are revised in future periods as adjustments become known.

Patient service revenue, net of contractual allowances and discounts (but before the provision for uncollectible accounts), recognized during the year ended September 30, 2012, is as follows:

Charity care – The Hospital provides care to patients who meet certain criteria under its charity care policy without charge or at amounts less than its established rates. Because the Hospital does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care, these amounts are not reported as net patient service revenue.

Contributions – Contributions, including unconditional promises to give, are recorded in the period made. Donated equipment and other donated goods are recorded at their estimated fair value as of the date of the donation. All contributions are available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Conditional promises to give are recognized when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. Unconditional promises to give due in the next year are recorded at their net realizable value. Unconditional promises to give due in subsequent years are reported at the present value of their net realizable value, using risk-free interest rates applicable to the years in which the promises are to be received.

Donated services – A substantial number of volunteers donate significant amounts of their time for the Hospital's program activities. These donated hours are a necessary part of the Hospital's activities. No dollar amounts have been reflected in the consolidated financial statements for these services, since the services do not require specialized skills, and would typically not be purchased if not provided by donation.

Income taxes – The El Paso Children's Hospital and Physician Group are non-profit corporations, exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Accordingly, no provision has been made for income taxes in the financial statements.

The Hospital recognizes the tax benefit from uncertain tax positions only if it is more likely than not that the tax positions will be sustained on examination by the tax authorities, based on the technical merits of the position. The tax benefit is measured based on the largest benefit that has a greater than 50% likelihood of being realized upon ultimate settlement. The Hospital had no unrecognized tax benefits at September 30, 2012. The Hospital files exempt organization returns and applicable unrelated business income tax returns in the U.S. Federal jurisdiction and Texas Department of Revenue. The Hospital is no longer subject to income tax examinations by taxing authorities for years before fiscal year 2008 for its federal and state filings.

Advertising costs – Advertising costs are expensed as incurred.

Self-insurance programs – The Hospital sponsors a self-insured health plan for its employees and their departments. The Hospital purchases excess liability coverage to cover losses that exceed its self-insurance program. It is the Hospital's policy to record the expense and related liabilities for employee health claims based on actuarial determined estimates. Liabilities are based on an estimate of claims that have been incurred but not reported and invoices received but not yet paid. There are known claims and incidents that may result in assertion of additional claims, as well as claims from unknown incidents arising from services provided to patients that may be asserted. However, management does not believe that the asserted or unasserted claims will exceed the total amount of insurance coverage.

Subsequent events – Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the balance sheet date, but before financial statements are available to be issued. The Hospital recognizes in the financial statements the effects of all subsequent events that provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at the date of the balance sheet, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing the financial statements. The Hospital's financial statements do not recognize subsequent events that provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at the date of the balance sheet but arose after the balance sheet date and before financial statements are available to be issued. The Hospital has evaluated subsequent events through September 18, 2013, which is the date the financial statements became available to be issued.

Note 3 – Going Concern

As shown in the accompanying financial statements, the Hospital incurred a net operating loss during the year ended September 30, 2012 of \$23,135,844, and as of that date, current liabilities exceeded current assets by \$20,877,273, and total liabilities exceeded total assets resulting in a net deficit of \$22,943,313. These factors, as well as the uncertain conditions that the Hospital faces regarding its loans and borrowings with UMC (as discussed in Notes 6 and 7), create an uncertainty about the Hospital's ability to continue as a going concern. Management of the Hospital is in negotiations with UMC to extend or modify the repayment terms of the Hospital's obligations to UMC such that the Hospital achieves sufficient liquidity to continue operations into the foreseeable future. Management believes the Hospital will reach a mutually acceptable agreement with UMC such that the Hospital can continue operations into the foreseeable future. The ability of the Hospital to continue as a going concern is dependent on a mutually acceptable solution to its liquidity needs. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that might be necessary if the Hospital is unable to continue as a going concern.

Note 4 – Net Patient Service Revenue

A summary of payment arrangements with major third-party payors follows:

Medicaid – Non-Managed. Inpatient services rendered to Medicaid program beneficiaries that are not part of a managed care plan are paid at prospectively determined rates per discharge similar to those of the Medicare inpatient program. Medicaid outpatient beneficiaries are reimbursed using a mixture of cost-based and a fee schedule methodologies. For outpatients, the Hospital is reimbursed for cost-based services at a preliminary rate, with the final settlement determined after submission of annual cost reports by the Hospital and audits thereof by the Medicaid fiscal intermediary. The Hospital cost report will be filed in February 2013. The Hospital has accrued an estimated payable of \$1,383,920 in the accompanying balance sheet based on interim payments and expected costs.

Medicaid – Managed. Inpatient and outpatient services rendered to Medicaid managed care program beneficiaries are primarily paid based on prospective rates and fee schedule amounts, with no retroactive settlement for the difference in the cost of services and the payments received.

Other third-party payors – The Hospital has also entered into payment agreements with certain commercial insurance carriers. The basis for payment to the Hospital under these agreements includes prospectively determined rates per discharge, discounts from established charges, and prospectively determined daily rates.

Revenue from the Medicaid programs accounted for approximately 38% of the Hospital's net patient service revenue for the year ended September 30, 2012.

Management believes that these estimates are adequate. Laws and regulations governing the Medicaid programs are extremely complex and subject to interpretation. As a result, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates will change by a material amount in the near term. Estimates are continually monitored and reviewed, and as settlements are made or more information is available to improve estimates, differences are reflected in current operations.

Under the Development Service Agreement, UMC provided certain funding prior to the commencement of operations of the Hospital and funding during the initial six months of operation of the Hospital.

Phase I Funding Loan – Effective February 14, 2012, the Hospital entered into an agreement with UMC in the amount of \$6,332,603 to repay a portion of funds expended by UMC for the development of the Hospital. The note matures on February 16, 2018 and bears interest at 4.8% per annum beginning February 14, 2012. The Hospital was not required to make payments within the first twelve months. Monthly installment payments of principal and interest began March 14, 2013 in the amount of \$124,633. The principal balance outstanding as of September 30, 2012 was \$6,332,603, which excludes interest of \$177,062 included in Due to UMC in the accompanying consolidated balance sheet.

Phase II Working Capital Loan – Effective February 10, 2012, the Hospital entered into an agreement with UMC to repay an additional portion of funds expended by UMC for the development of the Hospital and to borrow funds for use as working capital in an amount not to exceed \$25,000,000. The note matured on July 1, 2013 and bears interest at 4.8% per annum. The Hospital was required to make two partial payments of \$6,000,000 on August 1, 2012 and September 1, 2012 with payments first applied to accrued interest and then to the principal balance. The remaining balance of principal and interest are payable in four monthly installments beginning March 2013 through June 2013. During 2012, The Hospital made partial payments totaling \$4,950,000. At September 30, 2012, the Hospital was in default of the agreement for failure to pay the full amounts due at August 1, 2012 and September 1, 2012. Under the terms of the agreement, UMC may require the Hospital to immediately pay the remaining unpaid

principal and accrued interest balances. The principal amount outstanding as of September 30, 2012 was \$15,988,987, which excludes interest of \$399,118 included in Due to UMC in the accompanying consolidated balance sheet. As of September 18, 2013, UMC has not waived the breach and accordingly the entire amount of the note, \$15,988,987, has been included in current liabilities.

Note 7 – Related Party Due to UMC

In 2012, UMC agreed to various cancelable and non-cancelable agreements with the Hospital including but not limited to the following: a) Master Agreement; b) Facility Lease Agreement; c) Development Services Agreement; d) Administrative Services Agreement; e) Information Technology lease; f) Interim Equipment Agreement; g) Contract Services Agreement for Diagnostic Imaging and Laboratory; and h) Repayment Phase Agreements (Phase I and Phase II) (see Note 6).

Facility lease agreement – UMC has leased building space to the Hospital to provide general and pediatric care. The lease matures in February 2042 and includes a monthly payment of \$860,509 for first 36 months with a 1% increase per year thereafter. The lease also has two renewal options of 10 years. The total rent escalation over the base lease term is recognized as rent expense on a straight line basis over the life of the base lease term and amounts to \$108,876 per month at the end of September 30, 2012.

Administrative services agreement – UMC and the Hospital entered into an Administrative Services Agreement under which UMC will provide specified administrative and support services to the Hospital. These services shall include but not be limited to the following: 1) Fiscal and revenue cycle; 2) Information technology; 3) Human resources; 4) Ancillary support; 5) Nursing support; 6) Medical staff support; and 7) Diagnostic imaging and laboratory services. These services are due once billed to the Hospital.

Information technology agreement – The Hospital has leased from UMC certain information technology capital equipment, software and licenses under a cancelable operating lease. The agreement matures on March 2018 and is to be paid over 5 years starting March 2013. The Hospital straight lines the lease over the life of the contract at \$151,839 per month plus interest of 4.8% per annum.

Interim equipment agreement – The Hospital has certain leased equipment from UMC under a cancelable operating lease. The agreement matures on March 1, 2017 and will be paid over 5 years at a monthly payment of \$330,812 per month plus interest of 4.8% per annum on the lease amount \$1,457,947.

Other – This balance includes miscellaneous services provided by both UMC and the Hospital under the Master Agreement. Additionally, this balance includes all accrued interest on the notes payable in the amount of \$576,180.

Note 8 – Operating Leases

The Hospital leases the hospital building (see Note 7) and certain medical equipment under non-cancelable operating leases that expire in various years through 2041. The Hospital also leases certain medical equipment on a month-to-month basis. Total rental expense under operating leases was approximately \$7,420,187 for the year ended September 30, 2012.

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Note 9 – Employee Benefits

The Hospital has established a Section 401(k) pension plan (the “plan”). There is no minimum period of service in order to be eligible to participate. The Hospital will match based on years of service, however, no participant’s matching contribution will exceed 4% of their annual compensation. The Hospital will also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution. The amount of profit-sharing contribution shall be equal to 2% of the participant’s annual compensation. Employees vest in their allocated portion of employer contributions at 20% after each year of service. At September 30, 2012, accrued employer contributions of \$425,422 are included in accrued salaries and benefits in the accompanying consolidated balance sheet. Total annual contribution expense for the plan, which is included in salaries and benefits in the accompanying consolidated statement of operations, approximated \$645,000.

Note 10 – Employee Health Insurance Benefit Program

The Hospital purchases stop loss insurance from an unrelated insurance company. The Hospital is self-insured up to \$30,000 per covered member. Benefits in excess of this retention limit are insured through the stop loss policy. Health care benefit expense for the years ended September 30, 2012 was approximately \$1,387,000. Accruals for unpaid claims incurred but not reported amounted to approximately \$271,000 at September 30, 2012 and are included in the consolidated balance sheet in accrued salaries and benefits. Estimates for incurred but not reported claims are based on historical trends, expected lag time in reporting of claims, and other factors.

Note 11 – Charity Care

The Hospital provides charity care to patients who are financially unable to pay for the health care services they receive. The Hospital's policy is not to pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care. The Hospital maintains records to identify and monitor the level of charity care it provides. The costs of providing health care services for patients qualifying for charity care was approximately \$1,041,000.

Note 12 – Concentrations of Risk

The Hospital provides credit, in the normal course of business. The Hospital does not require collateral with the extension of credit. The Hospital maintains an allowance for doubtful accounts based on management's assessment of collectability, current economic conditions, and prior experience. Because of the uncertainty regarding the ultimate collectability of patient accounts receivable, there is at least a reasonable possibility that recorded estimates of the allowance for doubtful accounts and contractual allowances will change by a material amount in the near term.

Note 13 – Commitments and Contingencies

Healthcare regulatory environment – The healthcare industry is subject to laws and regulations of federal, state, and local governments. These laws and regulations include, but are not limited to, matters such as licensure, accreditation, government healthcare program participation requirements, reimbursement for patient services, and Medicare and Medicaid fraud and abuse. In recent years, government activity has increased with respect to investigations and allegations concerning possible violations of fraud and abuse statutes and regulations by healthcare providers. Violations of these laws and regulations could result in expulsion from government healthcare programs, the imposition of significant fines and penalties and significant repayments for patient services previously billed.

Management believes that the Hospital is in compliance with applicable government laws and regulations. Compliance with such laws and regulations can be subject to future government review and interpretation as well as regulatory actions unknown or unasserted at this time.

Malpractice insurance – The majority of physician services during fiscal year 2012 were contracted with either UMC or the Texas Tech Health Sciences Center. Late in fiscal year 2012, the Hospital, through the Physician Group, began employing a number of physicians who were previously contracted with UMC, although the majority of physician services continued through contracts with the Texas Tech Health Sciences Center. Thus, as of September 30, 2012, the Hospital had no material exposure to medical malpractice liabilities.

Litigation – The Hospital is involved in litigation arising in the ordinary course of business. Claims alleging malpractice have been asserted against the Hospital and are currently in various stages of litigation. In management's opinion, upon consultation with legal counsel, malpractice coverage is adequate to cover adverse judgments, if any, made against the Hospital.

Workers' compensation insurance – The Hospital is insured under the Texas Mutual Insurance Company for the purpose of providing insurance for workers' compensation coverage. The policy is retrospectively rated; premiums accrue based on the ultimate cost of the experience of the Hospital. At September 30, 2012, the Hospital cannot estimate the additional premiums or refunds, if any. Additional premiums, if any, are not expected to be significant.

Note 14 – Functional Expense Classification

In recording the activities of the Hospital, expenses are specifically tracked or allocated on the basis of periodic time and expense studies, and recorded in the following functional categories:
