Service which allows The Chicago Community Foundation to be treated as a component part of The Chicago Community Trust for tax

purposes. Information reported for the fiscal year beginning in 2011 represent consolidated information for The Chicago Community Trust

and The Chicago Community Foundation. All prior periods include financial information related only to The Chicago Community Trust.

Based on the prescribed calculation for determining the public support test, for the tax years being in 2007-2011, The Chicago Community

Trust received less than 33.3% of its total support from the general public. However, the Trust continues to be a publicly supported

organization base on the following facts and circumstances:

(1) The trust is a 98 year old institution, one of the oldest community foundations, serving broad charitable needs of the community.

(2) A substantial amount of its public support during the current year, over 45% (consolidated) was derived from from the general public.

(3) The Trust has a broad mission to improve the health and vitality of the diverse community, provide leadership in and contribute to

innovative approaches to address community challenges and promote philanthropy by informing and engaging donors about

philanthropic opportunities, which enable them to make a difference in the community.

(4) The governing board represents the broad interest of the public. Ten of the current sixteen members of the board are appointed for

five year terms by public or quasi-public officials: the Mayor of Chicago(2), the presiding Judge of the Probate Division of the Circuit

Court of Cook County, the senior active judge (native of Chicago) of the United States District Court of the Northern District of Illinois (2),

the Presidents of the University of Chicago and Northwestern University and the lay presiding officer of the United Way Crusade of

Mercy of Chicago. Of the remaining members, five members of the Committee are appointed by the Trustee's Committee,

which is comprised of the chief executive officers of five of the Trustee Banks which hold the assets of the Trust, and one member

is appointed by the Board.

(5) The Trust has a professional development/fund raising department and the Trust has embarked on a comprehensive capital campaign.

The campaign has been very successful and provides a means for securing on-going and future gifts.

Education

Grant making in education continues to focus on improving teaching and learning through strengthening instruction in high-needs schools and districts.

Instruction is the core work of schools, and it is imperative that the Trust support its improvement for several reasons:

1. Children are capable of and will be required to know more and have broader skills in order to succeed in their education and careers after high school.
2. Educators need continuous support to build their knowledge and skills to deliver on these broader and deeper goals for all students.
3. Schools and school systems need infrastructures for teachers to work jointly to develop coherent curriculum pathways for learning — as well as to build professional learning into the life of schools to ensure continuous improvement.

One of the most promising opportunities to advance the quality of education in the United States is the adoption of the Common Core Standards in English/Language Arts and Mathematics — as well as additional forthcoming rigorous standards in science, social sciences and the arts. These standards define more coherent and higher order thinking, problem solving and expressive skills than previous state standards. They provide a new road map for schools with significantly higher expectations for the content and processes of learning. However, merely defining new common standards and assessments will not change students' learning experiences. We must invest in building deeper content knowledge and teaching skills of teams of educators as well as school and system leaders.

Trust grants in fiscal year 2012 supported projects that build the knowledge and skills of educators in each of the core curriculum areas — in each case with the support of university-based experts in those fields.

- In English and language arts, the Trust was the lead supporter of the Chicago Public Schools' effort to engage 60 "Early Adopter Schools" and network leaders to begin to implement school-wide changes in literacy curriculum and instruction aligned with the new standards.
- In mathematics, the Trust supported two projects providing intensive professional development in 32 districts in West and South Cook County and in Chicago Public Schools involving math teachers in grades 6–10.
- In science and the social sciences, even though the new standards have not yet been released, Trust grants supported high-quality professional development of teams of teachers in 70 schools.
- In the arts and language development, the Trust supported the development of policies and practices in CPS that will ensure the expansion and deepening of opportunities for all children in those arenas of learning.

Some of this work is also being replicated in about 20 private schools serving high-needs students in Chicago.

The Trust also launched support to three universities to begin transforming teacher and school leader education programs, which will deepen educators' knowledge and skills in teaching specific subject matter as well as strengthen their abilities to support learning of all students, including English language learners and special-needs students.

Workforce Development

Reducing unemployment in the Chicago region means addressing the needs of both employers and job seekers. To accomplish this, the Trust invested in the region's most productive workforce development providers as well as key organizations that work to identify the needs of growing businesses and match firms with promising employees.

The Trust focused on funding job training and placement organizations that benefit job seekers, taxpayers and employers. The Trust made grants to Jane Addams Resource Corporation and the Safer Foundation to train and place ex-offenders in jobs in the metalworking industry. This strategy helps bolster a key industry in Chicago's history that now suffers from a shortage of trained workers, thus helping the Chicago region retain both firms and jobs. These placements are doubly valuable because by employing ex-offenders, participating firms reduce the likelihood of future offenses and reduce public costs of law enforcement.

Grants to Kinzie Industrial Development Corporation and Local Economic and Employment Development Council address the vital need of helping new entrepreneurs and small businesses located in key industrial areas of Chicago to fill their employment needs. These small businesses fuel economic recovery, but are operated by entrepreneurs whose strength is their business ideas — not their personnel recruiting skills. By helping these businesses find strong local employees, the Trust helps develop strong businesses.

The Trust made grants to Erie House and Instituto del Progreso Latino for bridge programs that help people with less education begin climbing the ladder to employment and, eventually, middle class jobs. Specializing in jobs in health care and manufacturing, these organizations help new workers to blend the basic and vocational education needed to succeed in the workplace.

Key to the success of a regional workforce strategy is strong relationships with the business community. Both the City of Chicago and Cook County have undertaken new strategies this year to build those connections and bring more efficiency to the employment-development process. After Cook County's three workforce boards merged to create the Chicago Cook Workforce Partnership, the Trust provided a lead grant to help support its business outreach capability. Another grant to Skills for Chicago's Future supported new efforts to learn and meet the workforce recruitment needs of Chicago businesses. For low-wage workers who live paycheck to paycheck, it is essential that they are paid entirely what they are owed and that their rights and safety are respected in the workplace. Research conducted at the University of Illinois at Chicago has documented that this is a problem in many work settings, particularly for non-English-speaking immigrant workers. To address

these issues, the Trust made grants to a number of worker centers that work with employers and employees to ensure payment of all wages owed and that workers' rights are respected.

Trust grants will result in placement of about 400 people in jobs with an overall one-year return on the Trust's investment of approximately 2.5 to 1.

Economic Development

Recognizing that metropolitan Chicago needs to have concrete plans to build our economic future, the Trust supported a number of planning efforts to examine opportunities to strengthen the Chicago region as a global economic center.

The Chicagoland Chamber of Commerce facilitated the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's (OECD) territorial review of metropolitan Chicago. This OECD analysis examines the assets and challenges of the tri-state geographic area, including northeastern Illinois, southwest Wisconsin and northwestern Indiana. World Business Chicago created *A Plan for Economic Growth and Jobs in the Chicago Region* and looks primarily at what Chicago can do as the center of the region. The Center for Neighborhood Technology's *Prospering in Place* report proposes strategies to implement GO TO 2040, a future development plan for the seven-county region: Cook, Lake, DuPage, Will, Kane, Kendall and McHenry.

Findings from the three reports will provide guidance to business leaders, governments and civic organizations to determine strategies and actions that would position the Chicago region more competitively in light of sweeping challenges linked to the global economy. The plans promote coordinated effort by public and private sectors with a view to aligning interests, investments and actions to ensure economic prosperity for the Chicago region.

Support was also provided for micro-loan programs to help develop small businesses, as well as efforts led by local universities and community colleges in the area of biomedical science and nanotechnology.

Health

The fragmentation and expense of the health care system and the lack of universal access to health care leave many low-income families and individuals who seek medical care carrying the burdens of chronic disease, poor health outcomes and financial difficulty associated with high medical costs. Chicago and Cook County have made substantial investments in publicly funded health care, however, the region's public health system is in need of a strategy for care coordination with the patient at the center of the care model.

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA) of 2010 makes health system reform a mandate at the highest levels of government. To capitalize on the federal mandate to expand health care access, assist with the implementation of health reform, reduce chronic disease and improve health outcomes, the Trust grant making in health focuses on three key areas:

1. Improving access to health care
2. Implementing health system reform
3. Preventing and reducing obesity

The Trust seeks to create a healthier region through strategies, innovations and interventions that remove barriers to health care, improve health outcomes and improve the region's public health care system. Trust grants in fiscal year 2012 supported projects that included strategies to support an integrated and highly functioning public health system; effective public policies and practices that maximize the benefits of health care reform, especially for previously uninsured individuals and vulnerable populations; and strategies to enhance policies, systems and environments to increase access to healthy, affordable foods and opportunities for physical activity. Successful grant proposals include:

- Improving access to health care: The University of Illinois at Chicago Miles Square Health Center was awarded a grant to support the implementation of a telemedicine hub in partnership with two regional health center networks and the University of Illinois at Chicago Medical Center to provide a range of specialty care services through remote video technology for low-income and uninsured patients.
- Implementing health system reform: The Illinois Maternal and Child Health Coalition was awarded a grant to support outreach and education on health reform legislation and expanded access to care to health and social service providers engaged in service delivery in low-income and minority communities, thus ensuring these communities are aware of the benefits of health reform.
- Preventing and reducing obesity: The Illinois Public Health Institute was awarded a grant to support the Illinois Alliance to Prevent Obesity (IAPO). This statewide obesity-prevention coalition composed of leading public health agencies, health provider coalitions, school districts, social service agencies and research institutions will advance school, workplace and community-based initiatives and policies that foster opportunities for residents to increase physical activity and consume healthy and affordable foods.
- The Trust this year also provided support to the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services for its Innovations Project. The new Medicaid reform law states that Illinois must enroll 50 percent of the Medicaid population in "care coordination" by Jan. 1, 2015. This means at least 1.5 million Medicaid clients — children, parents, seniors and disabled people — will be assigned to an integrated health care delivery system. In response to the changes in the law, the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services deployed the Innovations Project to test new models of delivering care and bring successful pilots for care coordination to scale to meet the needs of the newly eligible Medicaid population. In a joint partnership with the Michael Reese Health Trust, a grant was made to provide data and technical assistance to health care entities seeking to deliver the required care coordination and ensure the development of new models of care within the region.

Housing

The Trust's housing priorities seek to ensure that residents can obtain and sustain safe, affordable rental and homeownership options and that people with special needs have access to supportive housing environments that promote their long-term stability and integration into the community.

Homelessness

The Trust's program in homelessness is focused on finding permanent housing for people who are homeless. Homelessness is caused by many factors: mental illness, drug addiction, domestic violence and job loss. Over the past decade, homelessness in Chicago has been cut nearly in half, due largely to a highly functioning continuum of care that has benefited tremendously from consistent support from the Trust.

Accomplishments such as this require leadership and strong system management, which were provided by the Chicago Alliance to End Homelessness, a longtime Trust grant recipient. Additional grants to the Emergency Fund, which merged this year with the alliance; Corporation for Supportive Housing for technical assistance to the system; and the Midwest Center for Harm Reduction for training for housing providers in how to maintain housing for the most-difficult-to-serve clients helped strengthen the system. Key to addressing homelessness is helping perhaps the most vulnerable people, people living day and night on the streets. The Trust provided grants to Center for Housing and Health, Heartland Health Outreach and Beacon Therapeutic to provide outreach, case management and housing referral to individuals and families living on the street and who appeared to be most physically vulnerable. Together these organizations identify the most vulnerable people, provide them ongoing assistance for as long as they live on the street, and move them to permanent supportive housing as vacancies become available.

Trust grants to a variety of shelters serving youth, gay and lesbian youth, victims of domestic violence, individuals and families, combined with the aforementioned outreach and housing-placement efforts, will result in approximately 300 people moving from homelessness to permanent housing during the year.

Foreclosure Prevention and Intervention

To help mitigate the foreclosure crisis in our region, the Trust continued to provide significant support through key initiatives including:

- The Regional Home Ownership Preservation Initiative (RHOPI) is a network of organizations working to develop and implement more coordinated and robust regional responses to the spread of foreclosures across the Chicago region. RHOPI has set priorities in the areas of housing counseling and legal aid, lending and financial products, reprogramming of vacant properties, and research and communications. By engaging public, private and nonprofit stakeholders, fostering collaboration across sectors and jurisdictional boundaries, and building capacity and galvanizing support across the region, RHOPI seeks to exert a collective, measurable impact on the foreclosure crisis in metropolitan Chicago. In 2012, Trust support for this work leveraged a \$2.9 million grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for one of the RHOPI inter-jurisdictional partners, the West Cook Housing Collaborative, bringing the total amount raised from

government sources to approximately \$30 million across the inter-jurisdictional collaborations funded by the Trust. This year the Trust's support also helped RHOPI members and other partners develop business plans and promote innovative strategies to redevelop blighted, vacant properties into affordable rental housing and other uses.

- Working with the Circuit Court of Cook County Foreclosure Mediation Program, the Trust continued to coordinate a regional outreach program in which nonprofits went door to door to tell homeowners about how the court's mediation program could help them avoid foreclosure.

Increasing Affordable Housing

- In a context in which approximately 55 percent of renters spend more than 30 percent of their income on housing, the Trust seeks to significantly reduce the percentage of cost-burdened renters in our region and to nurture successful models for affordable, well-located and energy-efficient rental housing. Even before the unemployment and foreclosure crises pushed even more households to compete for fewer affordable rental units, there was a longstanding deficit of affordable rental homes for the lowest-income households. Scarcity of affordable rental housing is the principal cause of family homelessness and substandard housing conditions, including growing problems of overcrowding. Some cities have seen a decline in their affordable housing development and management capacity during and since the Great Recession. The Trust is committed to protecting and promoting the capacity of community development corporations (CDCs) serving the Chicago region and to supporting innovation and excellence, ensuring that Chicago remains a national leader in rental solutions for the 21st century. Therefore, in 2012 the Trust emphasized the creation and preservation of affordable housing units by supporting highly productive and creative CDCs as well as advocacy and organizing groups working to maximize the stock of decent affordable rental housing. Trust funding in 2012 is projected to create, preserve and/or green-retrofit more than 2,000 affordable rental and permanent supportive housing units near public transit for people with disabilities, senior citizens, formerly-homeless individuals, and families.

- With Illinois facing the need to shift housing and services for people with disabilities from institutions to community-based settings in response to budgetary limitations and the three Consent Decrees, the Trust is supporting innovative work to rebalance state systems and create a range of affordable, accessible and/or supportive housing options throughout the region. For example, in 2012, the Trust supported IFF's Home First Illinois initiative, a collaborative effort with the state and Access Living, which provides staffing for a \$15 million demonstration project that will turn foreclosed properties into affordable rental housing for people with physical disabilities, prioritizing those that are moving out of state-funded institutions. The Trust also supported needs assessments for supporting the transition of people with developmental disabilities and mental health needs into community-based settings across the state as well as a state planning grant to help secure U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development funds to provide rental assistance for up to 400 people with disabilities.

Human Services

Hunger

Trust support to prevent and eliminate hunger addresses the greatest challenge facing the hunger system: acquiring more food. Private sector food producers and retailers are becoming increasingly efficient in their production and ordering, leaving less excess food available for donation. As a result, food banks and other organizations seek new sources. New strategies to secure fresh food include developing direct relationships with local growers, developing collaborative purchasing, merging food banks to make processes more efficient, and supporting neighborhood growers.

- With a particular emphasis on food-insecure Latino communities and geographies whose changing demographics were leading to increased demand for Spanish-speaking outreach capacity, Trust funding in 2012 emphasized organizing and collaborative planning of food pantries and kitchens around similar needs to enhance efficiency and effectiveness of emergency and nutritious food distribution in these underserved communities, many of which are also launching or coordinating with urban agriculture projects to enhance community access to fresh produce.
- The Trust continued its support of the LINK Up Illinois campaign to develop the technological capacity of farmers markets throughout the region to enable LINK card purchases on site and to provide double value coupons to incent users of LINK [Illinois' name for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)] to purchase fresh vegetables at the markets. The campaign aims to both encourage changes in lifestyle choices in favor of more healthy food purchases as well as changes in the food system by enhancing demand for locally grown produce.
- Trust staff provided leadership on the development of state hunger priorities as an appointee to the State's Commission to End Hunger, which released its report and action plan in 2012. This work led to the launch of the No Kid Hungry and Hunger Free Illinois campaigns, which received Trust support to launch outreach to enhance participation in free and reduced rate summer feeding programs.

Advocacy of the Social Safety Net

The vast majority of services and supports provided to low-income people are either paid for or delivered by state or local governments. The availability and nature of these services and supports are worked out in the legislative arena and in state and city departments. History has shown that a strong and progressive safety net depends upon strong advocacy organizations able to inform government decision makers, marshal public opinion, inform the media and the public, and provide technical assistance to public officials. The need is even more vital at this time as the Illinois budget crisis will persist over the next five years, creating pressure and need to reduce many governmental functions. It is essential that program cuts affect the poorest residents to the least extent possible.

To keep the Illinois support system strong for the most vulnerable people, the Trust invested in the most effective advocates in a variety of fields: Access Living (disabilities), Illinois Coalition for Immigrant and

Refugee Rights (immigrants), Chicago Coalition for the Homeless (homeless), Women Employed (scholarships) and Chicago Jobs Council (low-wage workers). During the past year, these groups were successful in helping to move people with disabilities to better housing options, keeping Illinois and Chicago as the most immigrant friendly state and city nationally, developing new low-income housing opportunities in Chicago, and maintaining state scholarships despite the state budget crisis.

The Trust continued to support organizations that have worked to maintain public benefits and human services. A Trust grant to Illinois Partners for Human Service helped this advocacy network grow to more than 700 members and become the long-needed single voice for providers statewide. The Trust helped Voices for Illinois Children build its unique capacity to report on state financial conditions — reports government officials often use. A grant to the Heartland Alliance supported a key report on the depth of late payments to human service providers and ongoing reports on poverty levels in the city and state. The Trust continued to support the Sargent Shriver Center for Poverty Law, the nation's leading locally based organization providing advocacy and technical assistance to protect the rights and opportunities of very low-income people.

Working together, in 2012, these organizations finally stemmed the tide of disproportionate cuts to human services programs in state government.

Violence Prevention and Justice System Reform

Chicago and the region have experienced a long and steady decrease in crime over the past 20 years. However, Chicago, in particular, has suffered from a stubborn and unacceptable homicide rate, and both the Cook County jail and state prisons have too many inmates.

To address these problems, the Trust continued its support for CeaseFire, a neighborhood-based initiative aimed at defusing potentially violent or lethal confrontations before they turn tragic and providing training on nonviolence and conflict resolution.

The Trust also supported Chicago's youth summer jobs program aimed at reducing youth violence by providing grants to Phalanx Family Service to help provide jobs in Roseland, the Comer Center for Harper High School and Enlace for the near Southwest Side. Homicide levels were lower in communities with these programs, and crimes other than homicide continued to decrease across the city during the past year.

While incarceration is an essential tool for law enforcement and the criminal justice system, it needs to be a last resort. Growing evidence indicates that it is not helpful for youth or certain nonviolent offenders. The Trust made grants to Jane Addams Juvenile Court Foundation and Juvenile Justice Initiative to continue developing ways to reduce the detention of juveniles and find ways for them to get the social, psychological and educational support needed for them to avoid violence. For adults, the Trust worked closely with Thresholds and the Cook County State's Attorney's Office to develop a pilot program to divert misdemeanor defendants with mental illness or who are veterans from prosecution if they complete a clinical mental health assessment. The program has strong promise for heading off future crime by helping people address the underlying causes of their criminal behavior. The Trust also supported the Chicago Appleseed Fund for Justice

to continue its work with the county courts aimed at expanding diversion from incarceration for drugs, prostitution and other nonviolent offenders so they can receive needed treatment rather than only punishment.

Approximately 50 percent of offenders incarcerated in Cook County jail or the state prisons eventually recidivate, so it is essential to provide stronger interventions that help re-entering offenders find stable housing, jobs, mental health and drug treatment services where needed, and stronger social supports. Grants to North Lawndale Employment Network, Safer Foundation and St. Leonard's Ministries purchase services shown to reduce the likelihood of an ex-offender recidivating by half.

A reduction in the flow of offenders to Cook County jail opens one possibility of generating significant cost savings for taxpayers. To explore that possibility, the Trust made a grant to TASC to employ a consultant to work with the Cook County Board to determine what would be necessary for the county to offer social impact bonds or contracts whose proceeds would be used to purchase the services needed to divert low-risk offenders from jail. At this writing, the county board had adopted a resolution to formally begin the planning process.

Arts and Culture

Capacity-Building for the Sector

The Trust was the lead foundation funder for Chicago's new Cultural Plan and provided an array of data and maps so that community participants and planning consultants could assess how arts assets are distributed throughout the city. Visit www.culturalindicators.org to access this data. This information will help to benchmark the impact of the Cultural Plan and the Trust's efforts and identify future needs and opportunities.

A new cohort of 30 small arts and cultural organizations received their initial grants for the SMART Growth program, a three-year management capacity-building initiative that has been proven to effectively strengthen this essential component of the cultural ecology, enabling them to contribute to their communities, pay a living wage to their artists and further their artistic missions. Based on an initial assessment conducted by the Arts & Business Council of Chicago, grant recipients receive funding, professional development and connections to resources that build stability and resilience in the face of economic tumult, leadership transitions or demographic shifts that can lead to crisis management or even collapse.

Arts Learning

Consistent with the new strategic plan, arts learning grants are targeted toward schools that serve academically underperforming, low-income students. Funded programs are monitored to ensure that offerings are engaging, consistent, rigorous, sequential and effective in fostering a culture of continuous learning. Through the Arts Infusion Initiative, grants and professional development are directed toward teens who are at high risk for violence and located within the Cook County Juvenile Detention Center and community sites in three federally-designated Comprehensive Anti-Gang Initiative communities: Lawndale,

Back of the Yards and South Shore. These grants included the installation of three new digital media labs in collaboration with the U.S. Attorney's Office.

Artistic and Cultural Diversity

Production support was provided to grant recipients that strive to strengthen a culture of arts participation among demographic groups, geographic areas or artistic genres that are under-represented. Examples include Rivendell Theatre's production depicting the experience of women in the military, the Lyric Opera of Chicago's first mariachi opera, the AfriCOBRA exhibit at the Southside Community Art Center, and a series of Community Café events hosted by the Inner-City Muslim Action Network.

Taken together, these grants aim to enhance the cultural vibrancy, access and diversity within the region by showcasing Chicago's rich and diverse cultural landscape, strengthening participation among residents and visitors, and building the next generation of artists and audiences.

Civic Vitality

Strengthening Public Agencies

The combination of increased service needs occasioned by the recession and intensive financial pressure on the state government has led the state to search for new ways of becoming more efficient. The Trust worked closely with the state government to improve its operations and therefore make itself more responsive to providers and people with service needs. The Trust set aside \$100,000 to match funding from the Ford Foundation to help with process redesign in public aid offices that are aimed at making case processing more efficient. In the early months of the initiative, the redesign has led to a significant increase in food stamp determinations and approvals. Another Trust grant will provide consulting assistance to the state to reduce the paperwork human service providers need to submit with state contracts, thereby freeing up human service providers from redundant administration.

The Trust has also been a strong supporter of the state's new Budgeting for Results process aimed at making state government programs more accountable by helping them set priorities and meet goals. A Trust grant to the Government Finance Officers Association enabled it to lead a high-level strategic planning process, resulting in a set of outcome-based priorities designed to guide future state budget making.

Strengthening Nonprofits

When additional fundraising is insufficient to meet operating needs, organizations often need to consider merging or sharing back-office functions such as accounting, information technology, purchasing, insurance or human resources. These strategies can enable agencies to spend more of their revenues on maintaining or expanding service and less on administrative functions.

During the past year, the Trust supported a number of cost-saving initiatives. These included collaboration of Chicago Youth Centers with Family Focus, the merger of SOS Children's Villages with Boys Town Chicago, transition of programs from Hull House to Metropolitan Family Services and Uhlich Children's Advantage, the

merger of the Community Renewal Society and Protestants for the Common Good, and the merger of the Emergency Fund with the Chicago Alliance for Homelessness.

The Trust also supported the exploration of back-office administrative collaborations by more than 20 providers overseen by the Oak Park-River Forest Community Foundation and continued to support Community Service Partners.

Collectively, these projects will produce one-year cost savings of around \$1 million and out-year savings far higher.

The Trust also supported a unique collaboration of 15 domestic violence providers led by the Battered Women's Network in creating what will be the first consolidated database in the nation that links need, services provided and outcomes for domestic violence service providers. The Trust also made a grant to Christopher House to support a path-breaking learning circle of providers of children, youth and adult education services, where six providers measure results with common metrics and then share those results in common among program staff.

Sustainable Development

Developed land in the Chicago region grew by 66 percent between 1960 and 1990, while the population increased by a mere 14 percent. As urbanized land expanded geographically, people became more dependent on automobiles; the distances they drove increased; and walking and public transit use declined. Federal, state and local policies and regulations favored investments in and around highways over public transportation and encouraged separation of land uses, with homes located far away from job centers and commercial districts. In addition, today the Chicago region has 280 autonomous units of government and 1,200 taxing districts that do not work in a coordinated manner to manage the regional growth effectively. This model of growth is harmful to our environment and affects healthy community development — particularly as the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning projects that the region's population will grow by more than 2 million residents by 2040.

For more than a decade, the Trust supported nonprofits that advance the building blocks of sustainability — land use, transportation, environment and economic development — to create a more livable region. The Trust was also a key supporter of two plans led by government agencies that can help the region grow sustainably: the Chicago Climate Change Action Plan spearheaded by the City of Chicago and GO TO 2040 regional plan led by the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning.

To support the implementation of these two plans, the Trust launched a new initiative to support 10 communities in the Chicago region to implement plans and strategies to make their communities more sustainable and serve as models for other communities.
