

Guidelines

Mission and Purpose

The Anna Lalor Burdick Program seeks to educate young women about healthy reproduction in order to broaden and enhance their options in life.

The program focuses particularly on young women who have inadequate access to information regarding sexual and reproductive health, including comprehensive and unbiased information on contraception and pregnancy termination.

Eligibility

To be eligible applicants must be tax exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Service Code and defined as “not a private foundation” under section 509(a) of the Code.

While projects may take place outside the U.S., the Anna Lalor Burdick program will only fund organizations based in the United States.

Funding Interests

- Programs for young women, particularly those who are disadvantaged by poverty, discrimination, geographic isolation, or other factors leading to inadequate reproductive health education
- Programs that include a comprehensive approach to sexual and reproductive health education

- Clear definition of project goals and intended outcomes and a feasible plan to assess impact and success
- Collaborative efforts, including evidence of participation by proposed partner organizations
- Demonstration of plans to share outcomes and successful techniques or products

Geographic Focus

The program has no geographic limits.

Funding Availability and Duration

The trustees award a small number of grants in the range of \$10,000 to \$50,000, with an average grant size between \$20,000 and \$25,000.

Grants are awarded for one year. On rare occasions, trustees invite follow-up work to a project that has shown outstanding results or promise during its first year.

To individuals, or for individual research projects and scholarships

General operating support for ongoing programs

Application Procedures

The first step in applying for a grant is to submit an online concept paper. Instructions for preparing an online concept application are found at the Application Instructions tab on the left side of this screen. Concept papers are submitted online only.

If your concept paper is approved by the trustees, you will be invited to submit a full proposal.

Deadlines

Deadlines for concept papers are May 1 and November 1. The online portal will open one month prior to the concept paper deadline.

Applicants will be informed within 6-8 weeks of the deadline date of the trustees' decision regarding the concept paper.

Applicants invited to submit a full proposal will receive a full set of instructions to assist in preparation of a full online proposal.

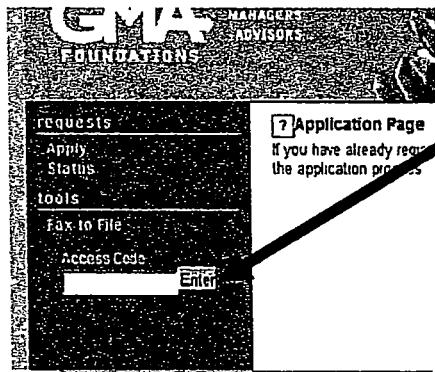
First Read the Anna Lalor Burdick Program guidelines to determine your eligibility.

Register Prior to submitting a concept application through the foundation's online grants system, applicants must complete a one-time registration. Previously registered applicants can simply log in. You only need to register once for all GMA Foundations clients. Please do not register your organization more than once.

To register, you will need to supply your contact information and create a password to log in to the system. The foundation prefers that the principal investigator or primary contact register.

Be sure to save your password where you can find it again. You will need it to work on proposal drafts and to submit reports if you receive a grant.

If you are a grant writer, please register using the name and email address of the principal investigator or primary contact at the organization for which you are applying. If you use your own information, the organization information will be linked to your email address, which will cause a problem if you then try to fill out an application for another organization or if you move on and the organization wishes to re-apply or submit a report.



Click Apply Once you are in the system, click *Apply* on the top left side of your screen, see illustration.

Enter Access Code The Access Code routes your proposal to the foundation. Each of GMA's foundation clients has its own Access Code; it is *not* the same as your password. Enter the code: *albconcept* (all lowercase) in the Access Code box on the middle left side of your screen.

Click Link to Open Form Click Enter to open the application form. If you would like to review the questions prior to starting your application, click on Print Question Legend, located above your name, to get a list of the proposal questions.

Draft Application Complete your online application. Save frequently. If you want to leave your application before it is complete, click on *Save as Draft* at the **bottom** of the page; the next screen will confirm that you have saved your application. If you do not see the confirmation, there is an error on your page that needs to be fixed before you can continue. You can come back later and continue your application by signing in with your *password* and continuing to work on the application.

Submit When Complete Your application must be submitted when you are done in order to remove it from draft status. After clicking Submit, a new screen will appear confirming receipt of your application. You cannot make changes after submitting your application. If you do not see the confirmation, there is an error on your page that needs to be fixed before you can continue.

Tips for Using the System

Can't find the application form? If you don't see the link to the application form, you probably did not enter the access code in the field on the left side of your screen after you registered and logged in.

Make a PDF of your proposal. If you would like make a pdf of your submission, use the Print Packet function. You can choose to save or print this pdf for your records.



Print Packet

Uploading? The upload fields accept only one document. If you upload the wrong document, simply browse and upload the right one to overwrite the incorrect upload. Once you see the name of the document you want to upload in the grey box, scroll to the bottom of the page and click Save as Draft. You will know that the upload worked when you see the document link below the grey box. You will also see it when you use the Print Packet function.

Cutting and pasting is fast. Cutting and pasting directly from your word processor is easy if you keep in mind that 3,200 characters (including spaces) equal approximately one page with four paragraphs in 12 point type. To facilitate cutting and pasting, text limits are typically generous, but do not feel compelled to write more than necessary just to use all of the characters allowed. **Please note:** If you choose to cut and paste, hit the space bar after pasting to ensure the system counts your characters properly.

Forget formatting. The system removes all formatting from your pasted text. It will turn bullets into gibberish. Saving your documents in RTF before you paste will require less clean-up in your proposal.

What is the deadline? The Anna Lalor Burdick Program has two application rounds per year. The deadlines are May 1 and November 1 with a firm receipt time before 12:00 midnight Eastern Time on the date specified. If the deadline dates fall on a weekend or holiday, the date is extended to the next regular working day.

Did we get it? Once you click Submit, your proposal is on its way. Log in to check the status of your proposal submission. If you see Awaiting Foundation Action beside the project name, your proposal was submitted properly.

Application Guidelines

The Lalor Foundation postdoctoral fellowship program supports promising new researchers in establishing scientific and teaching careers. The mission of the program is to support these researchers early in their work so that they can become independently funded in the field of mammalian reproductive biology as related to the regulation of fertility.

Eligibility of Institutions and Individuals

U.S. institutions must be exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Internal Revenue Code and must submit a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service stating that it is "not a private foundation."

If the institution is not located in the United States and has not been classified by the Internal Revenue Service, please contact the fellowship manager at GMA Foundations at the address below.

The individual nominated by the applicant institution for the postdoctoral fellowship for conduct of the work may be a citizen of any country. The individual should have training and experience at least equal to the Ph.D. or M.D. level and should not have a faculty appointment (i.e., instructor, lecturer or higher). Potential fellows should not have held the doctoral degree more than two years from receipt of the degree.

The applicant institution may make its nomination of a fellow from among its own personnel or elsewhere, but qualifications being equal, candidates from other than the proposing institution itself may carry modest preference. The application must name the institution's nominee for fellowship and include his or her performance record. Only one application per laboratory/sponsor will be considered.

Financial Data

Fellowships will be \$42,000 per year for coverage of fellowship stipend, fringes and institutional overhead. Other expenses are not allowed. Institutional overhead may not exceed 10 percent of the total fellowship award. Renewal for one additional year is possible under special circumstances. Please see specific renewal guidelines.

Application Instructions

NEW FOR 2013 APPLICATIONS

This year's deadline is midnight eastern standard time Tuesday, January 15. The online registration portal will open in September.

Lalor Foundation Fellowship Online Registration Guide

Read the Eligibility Guidelines: Before registering, read the guidelines for the postdoctoral fellowship program to be sure that you and your institution are eligible and that your proposed research topic aligns with the foundation's priorities.

Register: Prior to submitting a paper proposal to the Lalor Foundation, applicants must complete a one-time online registration. After completing the registration, you can simply log in.

You will need to supply your contact information and create a password to log in. The foundation prefers that the proposed fellow register. **Do not create more than one registration.** If you have questions about registration, contact technical support (below in Tips for Using Registration System).

Be sure to *save your password where you can find it again*. You will need it to work on your application abstract, budget and Appendix C draft and to submit reports if your application is approved.

Click Apply: After you have registered, click *Apply* on the upper left side of your screen.

Enter Access Code: The Access Code routes your registration information to the foundation. The Access Code is *not* the same as your password. **Enter the code *fellow* (all lowercase) in the Access Code box on the middle left side of your screen.**

Click Link to Open Form: Click Enter to open the application abstract space, budget and Appendix C upload.

Save frequently. If you want to leave your application before it is complete, click on *Save as Draft* at the bottom of the screen; the next screen will confirm that you have saved your application. Submit When Complete: Check your registration materials carefully while in draft. You will not be able to make changes to the registration materials after clicking submit. Click *submit* once when you are done in order to remove the material from draft status. After clicking submit, a new screen will appear confirming receipt of the application abstract, budget and Appendix C. If you do not see the confirmation, there is an error on your page that needs to be fixed before you can submit.

This information will become your cover sheet and does not need to be printed and submitted with the rest of your application packet (see below). The foundation will export this information into a cover sheet that will then be added to the rest of your packet when it is received.

Tips for Using the Registration System

Make a PDF of your application. If you would like make a pdf of your submission for your own use, use the Print Packet function. You can choose to save or print this pdf for your records. Do not send us a copy of the Print Packet. Before clicking "submit," review your application abstract, budget and Appendix C draft.

What is the deadline? The deadline for *receipt of all* registration *and* paper application materials is midnight eastern standard time on January 15. If January 15 falls on a weekend, the deadline date will be the following Monday.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR POSTDOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP APPLICATION

After completing the online registration, please continue with the body of the application, which should be filled out completely and submitted with the Appendices described below.

1. The proposed fellow is responsible to see that the signed, completed application and all supporting information is RECEIVED by the foundation not later than midnight eastern standard time on January 15 each year. In the event that January 15 falls on a weekend or holiday, the next working day is the deadline date.
2. The application and all material submitted should be typewritten on 8 1/2" x 11" or A4 paper. Please do not change the font size or margins of the forms provided. The narrative portion of the application should have 1" margins all the way around, except that applicants using A4 paper should leave 1.5" at the bottom of each page. The prospective fellow's name should appear in the upper right hand corner of each page. Forms are available online, but proposals should be submitted in hard copy.
3. The application should be accompanied by the applicant's official doctoral transcript. The applicant should also complete the NIH Biographical Sketch form.
4. One original and 4 copies of the application and accompanying documents should be addressed to the Fellowship Manager, The Lalor Foundation, Inc., c/o GMA Foundations, 77 Summer Street, 8th Floor, Boston, MA 02110-1006 USA. To reduce the volume of paper, please *print double sided whenever possible*. Applications should be held by clips or rubber bands, no staples please; folders, report covers, or other types of binders do not fit files and are discarded.

APPENDICES: The paper application consists of three appendices as follows:

Appendix A – Project Narrative (5 pages only including figures and references)

1. The plan of work for the project should concisely describe the present state of knowledge regarding the problem, the scope, specific objectives and importance of the work which will be accomplished during the period.
2. Please outline in what fashion this research can potentially be applied to the regulation of human fertility or to a method of birth control. This information may be helpful in making a choice between applications which are equally attractive from a purely scientific point of view.

Appendix B – Letters of Support (Send 1 confidential, sealed envelope of each. Letters will be opened and copied at the foundation.)

1. Independent Expert Reviews: The applicant should contact two independent experts who will review the proposal, comment on its scientific merit and give their opinion of the ability of the lab to supervise and support the project. These reviewers should be experts in the field who do not know the applicant personally and should state their own qualifications to perform the review. Representatives of any institutional unit that stands to receive financial benefit from a fellowship are not considered to be independent reviewers. Preference is for reviewers from outside the applicant's institution. The instructions and form included in this application material should be sent to the expert reviewers. These letters are not required of renewal applicants.

2. Reference: The applicant should also submit one letter of reference from someone who does know the applicant's work and who can comment on the applicant's abilities as a researcher. This should not be the person who will be the mentor/sponsor on the project but, rather, someone like a dissertation advisor or committee member. Representatives of any institutional unit that stands to receive financial benefit from a fellowship are not considered to be appropriate references. The instructions and form included in this application material should be sent to the reference. This letter is not required for renewal applicants.

3. The applicant should request a **letter from the proposed sponsor/mentor** outlining in layman's terms the relevance/importance of the project to the foundation's focus; the training/experiences during the project that will assist the fellow to apply successfully for continuing funding and to progress toward independence; the ability of the fellow to carry out the proposed project. The sponsor/mentor should prepare the letter of support utilizing the instructions included in this application material. If there will be more than one sponsor/mentor, they should collaborate to produce one letter of support, signed by both, and they should outline how they will coordinate supervision of the applicant's progress. Joint sponsorships may occur but are not usual. See below for renewal applicants' sponsor/mentor letter.

All letters should be sent *to the applicant* for inclusion in the proposal packet. These letters should be on the forms provided in these instructions and in sealed envelopes, marked "Confidential," and signed by the reviewer across the envelope flap. All letters of support should include the NIH Biographical Sketch of the person writing the review. Proposals are not complete without these letters. Please plan ahead; emailed letters are not confidential and are not acceptable. In fairness to all applicants, do not include extra letters of support.

Appendix C – Institutional Representation

This appendix is the final part of the online registration materials and sets forth information concerning the institution's eligibility to receive grants under U.S. tax laws and approvals of the project by reviewing bodies. Please print Appendix C, obtain appropriate signatures and include with the application materials.

Renewal Applications

Fellowship renewals are not automatic; renewal applications are reviewed along with the pool of new applicants.

1. Update your online application information. (See instructions above.) Print an original and 4 copies of Appendix C and include it with your application packet.
2. Submit an original and 4 copies of your progress report on the project thus far and a narrative description of the work planned for a second year, not exceeding five pages including figures and references.
3. Your sponsor should report in layman's terms on progress toward the mentoring and training activities planned for the first year. The sponsor should indicate:
 - the relevance/importance of the project's potential second year to the foundation's focus on the regulation of fertility,
 - comment on the first year's work, including how much of the first-year project was accomplished and what training took place in the first year,
 - barring unforeseen circumstances, how likely is it that the proposed work can be accomplished within the term of the fellowship?
 - the training/experiences during a second year that will assist the fellow to progress toward successful funding and independence,
 - and the fellow's ability to accomplish the goals of the proposed project.
4. Additional letters of reference are not required for renewal applications.
5. Both the renewal applicant and sponsor should submit their updated NIH Biographical Sketches.
