Based on the information in the plea agreements and statements of facts in the criminal cases, from 2009 through approximately July 2012, PMI employees stole funds belonging to the Smthsonian by significantly under-reporting the total number of revenue vehicles that entered the parking lot through the entrance lanes they worked and stealing cash from such under-reporting, by, among other things, disabling the electronic counting mechanism in the parking booth and failing to give out parking tickets to paying visitors. The Smthsonian's total estimated losses at this time are \$1,794,090.00 in addition to the investigation referenced above, the Smthsonian undertook the corrective actions of assuming direct responsibility for the parking operations as of April 14, 2013, hard wiring the electronic counting mechanisms, updating technology associated with cash handling and integrating internal controls, and installing security cameras with microphones in all five parking booths, in the office area of the gatehouse, and in the cash/safe room.
