1. Resurrection Bay Conservation Alliance, *et al.* v. City of Seward.

Trustees for Alaska represents conservation and community groups in a federal court challenge against the City of Seward for discharges of storm water without a permit under the Clean Water Act from the City's small boat harbor and boat repair yard facility at the Seward Marine Industrial Center.

Status of the case: The District Court ruled that a permit was required for City boat repair area. The District Court also decided that Plaintiffs were the prevailing parties, but "special circumstances" precluded an award of attorneys' fees. Attorneys' fees issue appealed to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. Ninth Circuit ruled that Plaintiffs entitled to an award of reasonable attorneys' fees and case remanded to District Court. Motion made to Ninth Circuit for attorneys' fees on appeal. Motion made to District Court for reasonable attorneys' fees. Attorneys' fees awarded by both the District Court and the Ninth Circuit. Case closed.

2. Cook Inletkeeper, *et al.* v. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, *et al.* Trustees for Alaska represents conservation and fishing groups as well as two Native villages in a petition to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit challenging the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's decision to issue a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general permit for oil and gas facilities in Cook Inlet under the Clean Water Act.

Status of the case: Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals remanded six effluent limitations to EPA for proper 401 Certification. EPA re-proposed six effluent limits for produced water discharges and sought public comment. Case dismissed. Case closed.

3. Nunamta Aulukestai, *et al.* v. State, Dep't of Nat. Res. Trustees for Alaska represents Nunamta Aulukestai, Ricky Delkittie, Sr., Violet Willson, Bella Hammond, and Victor Fischer in a state court constitutional challenge under Article VIII to upland hardrock exploration and temporary water use permitting at the proposed Pebble Mine Project.

Status of the case: Trial held in December 2010. Post-trial proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law submitted March 24, 2011. Court issued Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, denying relief to Plaintiffs. Case appealed to the Alaska Supreme Court, and briefing is underway. Defendant and Defendant-Intervenors made motions for attorneys' fees; discovery underway.

4. Nunamta Aulukestai, et al. v. Irwin. Trustees for Alaska represents Nunamta Aulukestai, Ricky Delkittie, Sr., and Bella Hammond in a state court constitutional due process challenge to the administrative appeal process for upland hardrock exploration and temporary water use permitting at the proposed Pebble Mine Project.

Status of the case: Case not consolidated with #3, and superior court ruled against Plaintiffs. Plaintiffs appealed to the Alaska Supreme Court and oral argument set for October 2012.

5. Native Village of Sleetmute v. State, Dep't of Nat. Res., et al. Trustees for Alaska co-represents the Native Village of Sleetmute in an administrative appeal of the Commissioner of the Alaska Department of Natural Resources' Best Interest Finding approving the exploration license for Holitna Energy Co.

Status of the case: Petitioners appealed to Alaska Supreme Court and oral argument set for November 2012.

6. Resisting Environmental Destruction on Indigenous Lands, et al. v. Irwin. Trustees for Alaska represents Resisting Environmental Destruction on Indigenous Lands, Gwich'in Steering Committee, Alaska Wilderness League, Center for Biological Diversity, and Northern Alaska Environmental Center in an administrative appeal under Article VIII of the Alaska Constitution of the Commissioner of the Alaska Department of Natural Resources' 2009-2018 Beaufort Sea Areawide Lease Sale Best Interest Finding.

Status of the case: Court ruled in favor of Petitioners. State appealed to Alaska Supreme Court, brief complete, oral argument held, and awaiting decision.

7. Alaska Community Action on Toxics, et al. v. Aurora Energy Servs., LLC, et al. Trustees for Alaska represents Alaska Community Action on Toxics and the Alaska Chapter of the Sierra Club in a citizen suit under the

Clean Water Act for unpermitted pollutant discharges from the Seward Coal Loading Facility.

Status of the case: Cross-motions for summary judgment filed. Awaiting oral argument.

8. Butte Area Residents Civic Organization v. State, Dep't of Nat. Res. Trustees for Alaska represents Alaska Center for the Environment, Knik River Watershed Group, Cook Inletkeeper, Alaska Quiet Rights Coalition, Friends of Mat-Su, the Alaska Chapter of the Sierra Club, and Robert Howard as *amici curiae* in an administrative appeal of the Knik River Public Use Area Management Plan challenging the State's failure to comply with state law planning requirements. *Amici* support the challenge.

Status of the case: Supplemental briefing requested and filed. Awaiting decision.

9. State of Alaska v. Lubchenco, et al. Trustees for Alaska represents Defendant-Intervenors Alaska Center for the Environment, Center for Biological Diversity, Cook Inletkeeper, Defenders of Wildlife, Natural Resources Defense Council, and North Gulf Oceanic Society in a challenge by the State of Alaska to the National Marine Fisheries Service's decision to list the Cook Inlet beluga whale as endangered. Defendant-Intervenors are defending the listing decision.

Status of the case: Court ruled against Plaintiff and upheld the federal listing of the Cook Inlet beluga whale as endangered. Case closed.

10. Native Village of Kivalina IRA Council, et al. v. U.S. EPA. Trustees for Alaska represents Petitioners Native Village of Point Hope, Alaska Community Action on Toxics and the Northern Alaska Environmental Center in a direct appeal to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals of the Environmental Protection Agency's Environmental Appeals Board's decision dismissing an appeal of monitoring requirements in the Clean Water Act permit for the Red Dog Mine. Co-counsel in the case, the Center on Race, Poverty & the Environment represents Petitioner Native Village of Kivalina IRA Council.

Status of the case: Oral argument held. Ninth Circuit ruled against Petitioners. Case closed.

11. Native Village of Point Hope, et al. v. U.S. EPA. Trustees for Alaska represents Plaintiffs Native Village of Point Hope, Alaska Community

Action on Toxics and the Northern Alaska Environmental Center in a federal district court challenge to the Environmental Protection Agency's approval of a less stringent site-specific criterion for total dissolved solids in Red Dog Creek for wastewater discharges from the Red Dog Mine.

Status of the case: Case transferred to the District of Alaska. Cross-motions for summary judgment filed and argued. Court ruled against Plaintiffs.

12. Alaska Center for the Environment, *et al.* v. State, Dep't of Env'tl. Conservation. Trustees for Alaska represents Alaska Center for the Environment, Alaska Community Action on Toxics, Cook Inletkeeper, Northern Alaska Environmental Center, Nunamta Aulukestai, Native Village of Point Hope, Native Village of Port Graham, and Southeast Alaska Conservation Council in a state court challenge to the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation's adoption of Interim Antidegradation Implementation Procedures as guidance rather than as a regulation, as required by the Alaska Administrative Procedure Act.

Status of the case: Court granted Teck Alaska's and NANA Corporation's motions to intervene. Motions for summary judgment filed and oral argument held.

13. Pebble Limited Partnership v. Lake and Peninsula Borough, *et al.* Trustees for Alaska represents Nunamta Aulukestai as *amicus curiae* in a challenge by a mining company to a local citizen initiative requiring approval of a conditional use permit before mining is allowed in the Borough. *Amicus* supports the Defendant Lake and Peninsula Borough and Borough Clerk to uphold the citizen initiative.

Status of case: Case consolidated with new case filed by the State of Alaska against the Lake and Peninsula Borough. Case remains in early stages.

14. Anchorage v. Federal Highway Administration, *et al.* Trustees for Alaska represents Friends of Government Hill, Stephanie Kesler, and Robert French as potential intervenors in a lawsuit by the Municipality of Anchorage challenging the environmental impact statement for the Knik Arm Crossing.

Status of case: Case dismissed before intervention granted. Case closed.

15. Nunamta Aulukestai, *et al.* v. Sullivan. Trustees for Alaska represents Appellants Nunamta Aulukestai, Ricky Delkittie, Sr., and Bella Hammond in a state court constitutional due process challenge to the administrative

appeal process for upland hardrock exploration and temporary water use permitting at the proposed Pebble Mine Project for its 2011 permits.

Status of the case: Case stayed pending outcome of Case #4.

16. Chuitna Citizens Coalition, et al. v. Alaska Dept. of Natural Resources. Trustees for Alaska represents Plaintiffs Chuitna Citizens Coalition and Cook Inletkeeper in state court challenge against the Alaska Department of Natural Resources for its unreasonable and unlawful delay in adjudicating pending instream flow reservation applications.

Status of the case: Discovery ongoing.

17. Chuitna Citizens Coalition v. Sullivan. Trustees for Alaska represents Appellant Chuitna Citizens Coalition in superior court administrative appeal against the Commissioner of the Alaska Department of Natural Resources' regarding his denial of an appeal of a temporary water use permit in a stream where Chuitna Citizens Coalition has pending instream flow reservation applications.

Status of the case: Summary judgment briefed and awaiting oral argument.

18. Cook Inletkeeper, et al. v. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, et al. Trustees for Alaska represents conservation and fishing groups as well as two Native villages in a petition to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit challenging the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's decision to re-issue six less stringent effluent limitations in a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System general permit for oil and gas facilities in Cook Inlet under the Clean Water Act.

Status of the case: Case in Ninth Circuit Mediation Program pending the outcome of Case #12.

19. Friends of Mat-Su, et al. v. Usibelli Coal Mine, Inc. Trustees for Alaska represents Plaintiffs Friends of Mat-Su, Castle Mountain Coalition, Cook Inletkeeper, Alaska Community Action on Toxics, and the Alaska Chapter of the Sierra Club against Defendant Usibelli Coal Mine in federal District Court alleging Defendant's unpermitted surface coal mining operations at the Wishbone Hill Mine in violation of the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act.

Status of the case: Case dismissed. Case closed.
