1. OFFICES

The principal office for the transaction of business of the Wayne and Gladys Valley Foundation ("Foundation") is hereby fixed and located at 2777 Alvarado Street, San Leandro, California 94577. The Board of Directors ("Board") is hereby granted full power and authority to change said principal office from one location to another in the State of California.

2. MEMBERS

2.1 <u>Membership.</u> The Foundation shall have one (1) class of members only, and the rights and privileges of each member shall be equal. The Foundation shall have no more than two (2) members. Each member shall be a life member.

The Board may establish such other classes of non-voting, honorary memberships and determine the rights, interests and privileges of such classes, if any, as it shall deem appropriate. No member shall hold more than one membership in the Foundation.

- 2.2 <u>Vacancies; Admission of New Members.</u> A vacancy in a membership shall be deemed to exist in the case of the death, resignation or incapacity of any member. Only the remaining member shall be entitled to fill a vacancy in one of the memberships. At any time, a majority of the current members may appoint a successor member or members in order to succeed to any future vacancy or vacancies immediately upon the occurrence thereof. A majority of the members shall retain the power to revoke any such appointment of a successor member prior to the occurrence of the vacancy.
- 2.3 <u>Place Of Meeting.</u> All meetings of the members shall be held at the principal office of the Foundation or at such other place as may be specified in any notice of a meeting of members.
- 2.4 <u>Voting.</u> Except as otherwise provided in the Articles of Incorporation or by statute, each member shall be entitled to one (1) vote; provided, however, that at any election for directors each member may cumulate his vote and give

one candidate a number of votes equal to the total number of directors to be elected, or distribute his vote on the same principle among as many candidates as he thinks fit.

- 2.5 <u>Transfer Of Membership.</u> A membership in the Foundation is not transferable or assignable.
- 2.6 <u>Dues And Assessments.</u> No member shall be subject to assessment by the Foundation for dues, membership fees or otherwise.
- 2.7 <u>Liabilities Of Members.</u> No present or future member of the Foundation shall be personally liable to the Foundation's creditors for any liability, obligation or indebtedness of the Foundation, and any and all creditors shall look only to the assets of the Foundation for payment.
- 2.8 <u>Suspension And Expulsion Of Members.</u> The Board shall have the power by a good faith vote of a majority of its members to suspend or to expel and terminate the membership of any member for conduct which in its opinion disturbs the order, dignity, business or harmony, or impairs the good name, popularity or prosperity of the organization, or which is likely, in its opinion, to endanger the welfare, interest or character of the organization, or for any conduct in violation of these By-Laws or of the rules and regulations of the Foundation, which may be made from time to time. Such action by the Board may be taken at any meeting of such Board upon the initiative of any member or members of the Board after first complying with the procedures for expulsion, suspension or termination set forth in Section 5341 of the California Corporations Code ("Code"). The proceedings of the Board in such matter shall be final and conclusive.

3. MEMBERS' MEETINGS

- 3.1 <u>Annual Meeting.</u> The annual meeting of the members shall be held on the second Wednesday of November.
- 3.2 <u>Special Meetings.</u> Special meetings of the members, for any purpose or purposes whatsoever, may be called at any time by the Chairman of the Board, the President or by the Board, or as otherwise provided by California law.
- 3.3 <u>Notice of Meeting.</u> Notices of meetings shall be given in writing to members entitled to vote by the Secretary or the Assistant Secretary or by any director.

Such notices shall be sent to the member's address appearing on the books of the Foundation or supplied by him to the Foundation for the purpose of notice, not less than ten days before such meeting.

Notice of any meeting of members shall specify the place, day and the hour of meeting and the general nature of the business to be transacted and otherwise comply with Code Section 5511.

3.4 <u>Consent To Members Meetings.</u> The transactions at any meeting of members, however called and noticed, shall be valid as though had at a meeting duly held after regular call and notice, if a quorum be present either in person or by proxy and if, either before or after the meeting, each of the members entitled to vote but not present in person or by proxy signs a written waiver of notice or a consent to the holding of such meeting or an approval of the minutes thereof. All such waivers, consents or approvals shall be filed with the Foundation records or made a part of the minutes of the meeting.

Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the members may be taken without a meeting if authorized by a writing signed by all of the members who would be entitled to vote at a meeting for such purpose and filed with the Secretary of the Foundation.

3.5 Quorum. The presence of both members shall be required in order to constitute a quorum at all meetings of the members. If there is a vacancy in a membership, only the remaining member shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. If a quorum is not present at any meeting, the present member may adjourn the meeting until the other member shall be present.

4. <u>DIRECTORS AND MANAGEMENT</u>

4.1 <u>Powers.</u> Subject to the limitations of the Articles of Incorporation, or the By-Laws, and of the laws of the State of California as to action to be authorized or approved by the members, all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under authority of, and the business and affairs of this Foundation shall be controlled by, the Board elected by the members.

Should this Foundation, at any time, have no members, the persons who are directors of this Foundation shall be its members and shall exercise all the rights and powers of members. On ceasing to be a director of this Foundation, any such person shall cease to be a member.

4.2 <u>Number And Qualification Of Directors.</u> The affairs of the Foundation shall be managed by a Board of not less than three (3) nor more than seven (7) directors.

The number of directors may be fixed or changed from time to time by amendment of the Articles of Incorporation of this Foundation, or by amendment of the By-Laws of this Foundation adopted by the vote or written assent of the members of the Foundation entitled to exercise a majority of the voting power, or the vote of a majority of a quorum at a meeting of members entitled to vote called pursuant to the By-Laws of this Foundation.

For purposes of determining a quorum of the Board the number of directors last elected by the members shall be the authorized number of directors until the next election of directors notwithstanding that a vacancy may exist on the Board for some period of time subsequent to such last election.

- 4.3 <u>Election And Terms Of Office.</u> The directors shall be elected at the annual meeting of the members, but if such annual meeting is not held or the directors are not elected thereat, the directors may be elected at any special meeting of the members held for that purpose. The term of office for the directors shall be one (1) year.
- 4.4 <u>Vacancies.</u> Vacancies on the Board may be filled by a majority of the remaining directors, though less than a quorum, and each director so elected shall hold office until his successor is elected at an annual meeting of members or at a special meeting called for that purpose.

The members may at any time elect a director to fill any vacancy not filled by the directors.

A vacancy or vacancies shall be deemed to exist in case of the death, resignation or removal of any director, or if the members shall increase the authorized number of directors but shall fail at the meeting at which such increase is authorized or at an adjournment thereof to elect the additional director so provided for, or in case the members fail at any time to elect the full number of authorized directors.

If the Board accepts the resignation of a director tendered to take effect at a future time, the Board shall have the power to elect a successor to take office when the resignation shall become effective.

No reduction of the number of directors shall have the effect of removing any director prior to the expiration of his term of office.

- 4.5 <u>Removal Of Directors.</u> The entire Board or any individual director may be removed from office by a majority vote of the members, providing there are sufficient members present to constitute a quorum.
- 4.6 <u>Liabilities Of Directors.</u> No director of this Foundation shall be subject to assessment by the Foundation, nor shall any such director be personally liable for any of the debts, liabilities or obligations of the Foundation, nor shall personal liability in any event attach to any member of this Foundation in connection with any of its undertakings; all of its liabilities shall be limited to its common funds and assets.
- 4.7 <u>Place Of Meetings.</u> Meetings of the Board shall be held at the principal office of the Foundation in the State of California, as designated for that purpose from time to time by resolution of the Board or written consent of all of the members of the Board, or at such other place as may be specified in any notice of a meeting of directors. Any meeting shall be valid, wherever held, if held by the written consent of all members of the Board given either before or after the meeting and filed with the Secretary of the Foundation.

- 4.8 <u>Annual Meetings.</u> The Board shall hold an annual meeting for the purpose of organization, selection of officers, and the transaction of other business. Annual meetings of the Board shall be held without call or notice immediately following the annual meeting of members.
- 4.9 <u>Regular Meetings.</u> Regular meetings of the Board shall be held without call or notice on the second Thursday of each February, May and September of each year at ten o'clock a.m. local time; provided, however, should said day fall upon a holiday observed by the Foundation at its principal office, then said meeting shall be held at the same time on the next day thereafter ensuing which is a full business day.
- 4.10 <u>Special Meetings Notices.</u> Special meetings of the Board for any purpose or purposes shall be called at any time by the Chairman of the Board, the President or by any Vice President or by any two directors.

Special meetings of the Board shall be held upon forty-eight hours' notice by first-class mail or twenty-four hours' notice given personally or by telephone, telegraph, telex, or other similar means of communication. Any such notice shall be addressed or delivered to each director at such director's address as it is shown upon the records of the Foundation or as may have been given to the Foundation by the director for purposes of notice or, if such address is not so shown on such records or is not readily ascertainable, at the place in which the meetings of the directors are regularly held.

- 4.11 <u>Participation in Meetings by Conference Telephone.</u> Members of the Board may participate in a meeting through use of conference telephone or similar communications equipment, so long as all members participating in such meeting can hear one another.
- 4.12 <u>Waiver Of Notice</u>. When all of the directors are present at any directors meeting, however called or noticed, and sign a written consent thereto on the records of such meeting, or if a majority of the directors is present and if those not present sign in writing a waiver of notice of such meeting which shall be filed with the Secretary of the Foundation, the transactions thereof are as valid as if had at a meeting regularly called and noticed.
- 4.13 <u>Notice Of Adjournment.</u> Notice of the time and place of holding an adjourned meeting need not be given to absent directors if the time and place be fixed at the meeting adjourned.
- 4.14 Quorum. One-third (1/3) of the authorized number of directors shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and the action of a majority of the directors present at any meeting at which there is a quorum, when duly assembled, is valid as a Foundation act; provided, that a majority of the directors, in the absence of a quorum, may adjourn from time to time but may not transact any business.

- 4.15 <u>Action Without Meeting.</u> Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board shall individually or collectively consent in writing to such action. Such consent or consents shall have the same effect as a unanimous vote of the Board and shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board.
- 4.16 <u>Fees And Compensation.</u> Directors and members of committees may receive such compensation, if any, for their services, and such reimbursement for expenses, as may be fixed or determined by the Board.

5. OFFICERS

- 5.1 <u>Titles And Qualification.</u> The officers of this Foundation shall be a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer (Chief Financial Officer), who shall be appointed by the Board. A Chairman of the Board, one or more Vice Presidents and one or more Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers may be appointed from time to time.
- 5.2 Other Officers And Agents. The Board may create such other offices and appoint, or empower the President to appoint, such other officers and agents as it or he shall deem necessary, who shall have such authority, and hold their offices for such terms, and shall exercise such duties as shall be determined from time to time by the Board
- 5.3 <u>Number Of Offices For Each Individual.</u> It shall be permissible for one individual to hold more than one office of the Foundation, except that neither the Secretary nor the Treasurer may serve concurrently as the President or Chairman of the Board.
- 5.4 <u>Salaries.</u> The salaries or other compensation, if any, of the officers of the Foundation shall be fixed from time to time by the Board.
- 5.5 Term Of Office And Removal. Any Chairman of the Board, the President, any Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Foundation shall be chosen annually by, and serve at the pleasure of, the Board and shall hold office until their removal or successors are appointed and qualify in their stead. Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the Board may be removed at any time by the affirmative vote of a majority of the whole Board.

All officers, agents, and employees, other than those appointed by the Board, may be removed at any time by the officers or committee appointing them.

5.6 <u>Chairman of the Board.</u> The Chairman of the Board, if there is such an officer, shall, if present, preside at all meetings of the Board and exercise and perform such other powers and duties as may be from time to time assigned by the Board.

- 5.7 <u>President.</u> In the absence of a Chairman of the Board, the President shall preside at all meetings of the directors. He shall have general and active control of the affairs of the Foundation, subject to the Board, and shall see that all orders and resolutions of the Board are carried into effect. He shall have the general powers and duties of supervision and management usually vested in the office of the President of a corporation, and shall perform such duties as may from time to time be assigned to him by the Board.
- 5.8 <u>Vice President.</u> In the absence of, or in the event of the disability of, the President, or in case of his failure or refusal to act, the Vice President, if there be such an officer, shall have such other powers and shall do and perform such other duties as may from time to time be assigned to him by the Board.
- 5.9 <u>Secretary.</u> The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the Board and record all votes and minutes of proceedings in a book to be kept for that purpose. He shall give or cause to be given notice of all meetings of the Board, and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board, or the President, under whose supervision he shall be.
- 5.10 <u>Assistant Secretary.</u> The Assistant Secretary shall act in the absence of the Secretary.
- 5.11 <u>Treasurer (Chief Financial Officer)</u>. The Treasurer shall be the Chief Financial Officer and shall have the custody of the corporate funds and securities, and shall keep full and accurate accounts or receipts and disbursements in books belonging to the Foundation, and shall deposit all money and other valuable effects in the name, and to the credit of, the Foundation, in such depositories as may be designated by the Board.

He shall disburse the funds of the Foundation as may be ordered by the Board, taking proper vouchers for such disbursements, and shall render to the President and directors at the regular meetings of the Board, or whenever they may require it, an account of all his transactions as Treasurer, and of the financial condition of the Foundation.

He shall give the Foundation a bond, if required by the Board, in a sum and with one or more sureties satisfactory to the Board, for the faithful performance of the duties of his office, and for the restoration to the Foundation in case of his death, resignation or removal from office, of all books, papers, vouchers, money and other property of whatsoever kind in his possession or under his control belonging to the Foundation.

5.12 <u>Duties May Be Delegated.</u> In case of the absence of any officer of the Foundation or for any other reason that the Board may deem sufficient, the Board may delegate for the time being the power or duties or any of them, of such officer, to any other officer, or to any director.

6. EXECUTIVE AND OTHER COMMITTEES

The Board, by resolution adopted by a majority of the entire Board, may designate two (2) or more directors to constitute such committees as it may require, including an Executive Committee, and to delegate to such committees any of the authority of the Board except with respect to:

- (a) The approval of any action for which the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law also requires approval of the members or approval of a majority of all members;
 - (b) The filling of vacancies on the Board or on any committee;
- (c) The fixing of compensation of the directors for serving on the Board or on any committee;
- (d) The amendment or repeal of bylaws or the adoption of the new bylaws;
- (e) The amendment or repeal of any resolution of the Board which by its express terms are not so amendable or repealable;
- (f) The appointment of other committees of the Board or the members thereof;
- (g) The expenditure of corporate funds to support a nominee for director after there are more people nominated for director than can be elected; or
- (h) The approval of any self-dealing transaction, as such transactions are defined in Code Section 5233(a).

The designation of any such committee and the delegation of authority herein granted shall not operate to relieve the Board or any member thereof of any responsibility imposed on it or him by law. No member of any such committee shall continue to be a member thereof after he ceases to be a director of the Foundation. The Board shall have the power anytime to change the number of members of any such committee, to fill vacancies thereon, and to change any member thereof. The Board shall have the power to prescribe the manner in which proceedings of any such committee shall be conducted. In the absence of any such prescription, the regular and special meetings and other actions of any such committee shall be governed by the provisions of Section 5 applicable to meetings and actions of the Board. Minutes shall be kept of each meeting of each committee.

7. CORPORATE RECORDS AND REPORTS -- INSPECTION

- 7.1 Records. The Foundation shall maintain adequate and correct accounts, books and records of its business and properties. All of such books, records and accounts shall be kept at its principal place of business in the State of California, as fixed by the Board of Directors.
- 7.2 Contracts, Etc. - How Executed. The Board, except as in these By-Laws or otherwise provided, may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Foundation. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. Unless so authorized by the Board, no officer, agent or employee of the Foundation shall have any power or authority to bind the Foundation by any contract or engagement, or to pledge its credit, or to render it liable for any purpose or to any amount.
- 7.3 Annual Report. The directors shall cause to be sent to the members, not later than one hundred twenty (120) days after the close of the fiscal or calendar year, a balance sheet as of the closing date of such year, together with a statement of Receipts and Disbursements for such year. These financial statements shall be certified by the President, the Secretary or the Treasurer, which officers may employ a certified public accountant to prepare said financial statements, and shall otherwise comply with Code Section 6321.

8. CORPORATE SEAL

The corporate seal shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the Foundation, the date of its incorporation, and the word "California".

9. <u>AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS</u>

- 9.1 <u>By Members.</u> New By-Laws may be adopted or these By-Laws may be repealed or amended at the annual or any other meeting of the members called for that purpose, by a vote of members entitled to exercise a majority of the voting power of the Foundation, or by written assent of such members.
- 9.2 <u>By Directors.</u> Bylaws may not be adopted, amended or repealed by the Board.
- 9.3 Record Of Amendments. Whenever an amendment or new By-Law is adopted, it shall be copied in the book of By-Laws of this Foundation with the original By-Laws, in the appropriate place. If any By-Law is repealed, the fact of repeal, with the date of the meeting at which the repeal was enacted or written assent filed, shall be stated in said book.

10. OTHER PROVISIONS

10.1 <u>Notices.</u> If any notice required to be given by these By-Laws is given by mail it shall be deemed to have been given at the time a written notice is

deposited in the United States mails, first class, postage prepaid. Any other written notice shall be deemed to have been given at the time it is personally delivered to the recipient or is delivered to a common carrier for transmission, or actually transmitted by the person giving the notice by electronic means, to the recipient, as the case may be. Oral notice shall be deemed to have been given at the time it is communicated, in person or by telephone or wireless, to the recipient or to a person at the office of the recipient who the person giving the notice has reason to believe will promptly communicate it to the receiver. All notices to members shall comply with the provisions of Code Section 5511.

10.2 <u>Construction And Definitions.</u> Unless the context otherwise requires, the general provisions, rules of construction, and definitions contained in the General Provisions of the California Nonprofit Corporation Law and in the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law shall govern the construction of these Bylaws.

11 <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

- any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or other agent of the Foundation, or is or was serving at the request of the Foundation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another foreign or domestic corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of a foreign or domestic corporation which was a predecessor corporation of the Foundation or of another enterprise at the request of such predecessor corporation; "proceeding" means any threatened, pending, or completed action or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative; and "expense" includes, without limitation, attorneys' fees and any expenses of establishing a right to indemnification under Sections 11.4 or 11.5.3.
- Indemnification In Actions By Third Parties. Foundation shall have power to indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any proceeding (other than an action by or in the right of the Foundation to procure a judgment in its favor, an action brought under Code Section 5233, or an action brought by the Attorney General or a person granted relator status by the Attorney General for any breach of duty relating to assets held in charitable trust), by reason of the fact that such person is or was an agent of the Foundation, against expenses, judgments, fines, settlements, and other amounts actually and reasonable incurred in connection with such proceeding if such person acted in good faith and in a manner such person reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Foundation and, in the case of a criminal proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe the conduct of such person was unlawful. The termination of any proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner which the person reasonably believed to be in the best interests of the Foundation or that the person had reasonable cause to believe that the person's conduct was unlawful.

- Foundation. The Foundation In Actions By Or In The Right Of The
 Foundation. The Foundation shall have the power to indemnify any person who was or
 is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed
 action by or in the right of the Foundation, or brought under Code Section 5233, or
 brought by the Attorney General or a person granted relator status by the Attorney
 General for breach of duty relating to assets held in charitable trust, to procure a
 judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that such person is or was an agent of the
 Foundation, against expenses actually and reasonably incurred by such person in
 connection with the defense or settlement of such action if such person acted in good
 faith, in a manner such person believed to be in the best interests of the Foundation, and
 with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like
 position would use under similar circumstances. No indemnification shall be made under
 Section 11.3:
- 11.3.1 In respect of any claim, issue, or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable to the Foundation in the performance of such person's duty to the Foundation, unless and only to the extent that the court in which such proceeding is or was pending shall determine upon application that, in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for the expenses which such court shall determine;
- 11.3.2 Of amounts paid in settling or otherwise disposing of a threatened or pending action, with or without court approval; or
- 11.3.3 Of expenses incurred in defending a threatened or pending action which is settled or otherwise disposed of without court approval, unless it is settled with the approval of the Attorney General.
- 11.4 <u>Indemnification Against Expenses.</u> To the extent that an agent of the Foundation has been successful on the merits in defense of any proceeding referred to in Sections 11.2 or 11.3 or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, the agent shall be indemnified against expenses actually and reasonably incurred by the agent in connection therewith.
- 11.5 <u>Required Determinations.</u> Except as provided in Section 11.4 any indemnification under this Section 11 shall be made by the Foundation only if authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the agent is proper in the circumstances because the agent has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Sections 11.2 or 11.3, by:
- 11.5.1 A majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who are not parties to such proceedings; or
- 11.5.2 Approval of the members (within the meaning of Code Section 5034), with the persons to be indemnified not being entitled to vote thereon; or

- 11.5.3 The court in which such proceeding is or was pending upon application made by the Foundation or the agent or the attorney or other person rendering services in connection with the defense, whether or not such application by the agent, attorney, or other person is opposed by the Foundation.
- 11.6 Advance Of Expenses. Expenses incurred in defending any proceeding may be advanced by the Foundation prior to the final disposition of such proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the agent to repay such amount unless it shall be determined ultimately that the agent is entitled to be indemnified as authorized in this Section 11.
- Foundation to indemnify its or its subsidiary's directors or officers for the defense of any proceeding, whether contained in the Articles, these By-Laws, a resolution of members or directors, an agreement, or otherwise, shall be valid unless consistent with this Section 11. Nothing contained in this Section 11 shall affect any right to indemnification to which persons other that such directors and officers may be entitled by contract or otherwise. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Bylaws, no indemnification shall be permitted which would cause the imposition of any tax, including any penalty, interest or addition to tax, under Chapter 42 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or any corresponding provision of California law.
- 11.8 <u>Forms Of Indemnification Not Permitted.</u> No indemnification or advance shall be made under this Section 11, except as provided in Sections 11.4 or 11.5.3, in any circumstances where it appears:
- 11.8.1 That it would be inconsistent with a provision of the Articles, these Bylaws, or an agreement in effect at the time of the accrual of the alleged cause of action asserted in the proceeding in which the expenses were incurred or other amounts were paid, which prohibits or otherwise limits indemnification; or
- 11.8.2 That it would be inconsistent with any condition expressly imposed by a court in approving a settlement.
- 11.9 <u>Insurance</u>. The Foundation shall have power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any agent of the Foundation against any liability asserted against or incurred by the agent in such capacity or arising out of the agent's status as such whether or not the Foundation would have the power to indemnify the agent against such liability under the provisions of this Section 11, provided, however, that the Foundation shall have no power to purchase and maintain such insurance to indemnify any agent of the Foundation for a violation of Code Section 5233.
