For more than 50 years, the East-West Center (Center) has been promoting better relations and understanding among the people and nations of the United States, Asia, and the Pacific through cooperative study, research, and dialogue The Center serves as a resource for information and analysis on critical issues of common concern, bringing people together to exchange views, build expertise, and develop policy options As a national, public diplomacy institution, the Center works in partnership with more than 750 organizations throughout the United States and in the region The collaborative research and education programs bring together Americans and counterparts from Asia and the Pacific to work in an atmosphere of academic freedom on issues of mutual importance The Center's exchange and dialogue programs involve multi-country, region-wide activities involving everyone as full participants In November 2011, the Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Leaders Meeting was held in Hawaii where the Center collaborated with the APEC Hawai`i Host Committee and served as a facilitator for the Committee and the APEC 2011 Hawai`i Conference The Center conducted educational programs to help inform everyone about their stake in the region, launched APEC-related studies in areas such as energy security and free trade, hosted a preliminary meeting of senior APEC officials, sponsored a successful business symposium during the Leaders' Week, and developed an international consortium of K-12 schools in APEC economies This past year, over 3,760 participants took part in Center activities throughout the region The following is a highlight of the program activities during the year RESEARCH PROGRAM The Asia Pacific region is experiencing rapid political, social, economic, and environmental change Some countries in the region lead the world in economic growth, while others lag behind Some boast long and well-established democratic traditions, while others struggle with issues of governance and human rights And everywhere, policymakers are dealing with environmental challenges, population change, health risks, pressure for greater political participation, and uncertainties in the global economy The East-West Center's Research Program supports the Center's mission by engaging the research and policy communities in the Asia Pacific region on issues of shared concern Researchers contribute expertise to broad and well-established networks of specialists and institutional partners, leading collaborative and interdisciplinary research on the evolving challenges of a dynamic region They also provide insights and analysis to the Center's professional exchange, education, and public outreach programs, including its work with the media Activities included the Annual Summer Institute in International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights to train international law professionals from the region to focus on human rghts and business including the issues of corporate responsibility in the region, the Pacific Regional Integrated Science and Assessment program to help Pacific communities cope with climate change, and computer models to estimate the HIV program impact on selected countries Project work continued on a study of National Transfer Accounts (NTA) which provides estimates of income, consumption, saving, and both public and private transfers of funds for specific age groups The Trans-Pacific Partnership agreement is an ambitious effort to sustain and invigorate America's linkages with the dynamic economies of the Asia Pacific region The Asian International Justice Initiative (AIJI) promotes capacity-building in the human-rghts sector and rule of law, focusing on Southeast Asia The Initiative works at the regional level to support the work of the ASEAN Inter-governmental Commission on Human Rights, and the Human Rights Resource Center for ASEAN The Asia-Pacific Governance and Democracy Initiative conducts international workshops and publishes books and policy briefs on important governance and democracy topics in the region

EDUCATION PROGRAM The Center offers educational opportunities for future leaders in the Asia Pacific region and the U S in an era of increased social, economic and technological interdependence Graduate degree scholarships and certificate programs prepare students and professionals to address the challenges and complexities of the world's most dynamic region Undergraduate degree scholarships build and strengthen the base of future leaders in East Timor and the South Pacific The Program also provided professional development programs for educators to strengthen the capacity of individuals and institutions to cultivate in their students an appreciation and understanding of the histones, cultures, and contemporary issues of the Asia Pacific The Program accomplishments include continued training of future leaders in the Asia Pacific Leadership Program (APLP), college educators through the Asian Studies Development Program (ASDP), and K-12 teachers through the AsiaPacificEd Program In FY 2012, 530 students from 63 countries participated in the Center's undergraduate and graduate training and scholarship program that is unlike individual scholarship programs, since these students are instilled with a common learning experience centered on U S -Asia Pacific issues and community service The governments of the U S and Brunei signed an agreement for a Brunei-U S English Language Enrichment Program for the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) The Center partnered with the University of Brunei Darussalam to carry out this innovative program for officers and diplomats and law professional-trainers intended to strengthen ASEAN integration through promoting English-language proficiency and enhancing cross-cultural interaction

SEMINARS AND OUTREACH PROGRAM The Center has developed the most extensive program of trans-Pacific journalist and editor exchanges in the region, with exchanges for the Asia Pacific region as a whole (Jefferson Fellows), for Islamic journalists and American journalists (the Senior Journalist Seminar), health journalists, and bilateral programs with Japanese, Korean, and Chinese journalists The Center also offers short-term policy seminars where senior and emerging leaders and business people from a variety of sectors focus on issues of regional concern The program is developed around a thematic focus and provides participants with an opportunity to strengthen their understanding of Asia Pacific-U S developments and challenges, build a regional network and to become leaders with a more international perspective Burmese journalists and several other hundred journalists and media experts from over 100 news organizations and 25 countries gathered in South Korea to discuss the changing media landscape including the use of social media and how it is shaping journalism in Asia and the Pacific Journalists from Asia and the Pacific also attended the Center's first U S Presidential Election Monitoring Seminar to gain perspectives on the American electoral system, key issues in the presidential campaign, and to engage in discussions with experts and policy analysts on how the election results might impact U S foreign policy around the world East-West Center in Washington supports the Center's overall mission through direct work with U S policymakers and opinion leaders in the nation's capital It facilitates understanding of the U S policy process by its Asia Pacific participants through direct interaction with U S policymakers It also continues the successful Asia Matters for America/America Matters for Asia initiative to organize and disseminate information, data, and analysis on the US-Asia interactions

OTHER PROGRAMS Other Programs include the Pacific Islands Development Program (PIDP) and Auxiliary enterprise services PIDP is an enduring partnership between the Center and twenty-two island governments It is the only program of its kind based in the United States, bringing together heads of government from an area that spans one-third of the globe During APEC, Malaysian Prime Minister Razak and President Sang of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam gave speeches at the Center Secretary of State Clinton spoke of an American "pivot toward the Asia Pacific" in her third policy address hosted by the Center The Center also sponsored a series of meetings where heads of State and special envoys from 11 Pacific Island nations met with President Obama and other top U S and international officials Collaborating with the other Center programs PIDP also hosted election officials from the Pacific Islands to provide first-hand knowledge and experience of the U S Presidential Election Reporting and the U S electoral process Other activities included serving as independent democracy election observers during the Timor-Leste and Papua New Guinea elections Auxiliary enterprises provide conference facilities and dormitory housing for students and conference participants that participate in the East-West Center's programs


