Summary of Direct Charitable Activities

The rainforest land was purchased to achieve the Foundation's mission to preserve the land as a natural habitat for wildlife as well as an area for environmental study. The land is a part of the biological corridor for the wildlife of the Carate-Corcovado region. Environmental and educational groups and other visitors will be able to stay, study and become engaged in the ongoing efforts to preserve this biologically intense area of the Osa Peninsula. A website has been developed for the Costa Rican site named Catappa for the purpose of informing groups of the opportunities at the site as well as at the adjacent Corcovado National Park of Costa Rica. A highlight was providing lodging for Osa Conservation volunteers who participated in the local project to save turtle eggs from poachers and return them safely to the ocean. The foundation will also participate with other non-profit organizations and the local community in research and responsible eco-tourist development for living sustainably with the environment.
