The Foundation prefers not to fund programs for research, health care, the elderly, religious education, animal welfare, or those that are primarily recreational. The Foundation will not consider requests for funding of endowments.

Applicants should apply for support by submitting the Colorado Common Grant Application. Waiver from this form of application may be granted by the Foundation Manager in the case of small organizations.

A yearly report is required for all grant recipients.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### What are the Foundation's primary areas of interest?

The Foundation wishes to support programs designed to bring self-sufficiency to members of highly motivated at-risk populations, particularly family units with infants and young children. Areas of interest include:

- Early childhood and preschool education and development programs
- Parenting education and programs designed to enhance parent and child interaction
- Job readiness and life skills training for families and heads of household transitioning from welfare to self-sufficiency

#### What types of grantee organizations does the Foundation prefer?

The Foundation prefers to fund organizations and projects that are controlled in Colorado, rely primarily on Colorado financial support and offer their programs and resources to Colorado residents. The Foundation also funds organizations that are well run and are cost effective.

### What types of financial support does the Foundation provide?

The Foundation traditionally provides general operating and program support in areas of interest. On a limited basis, the Foundation may consider start-up/seed money and capital improvement requests that closely align with its funding priorities.

### What level of support can be expected from the Foundation?

The Foundation's average grant is \$2,500 - \$3,500. The grant range is \$1,000 to \$10,000.

### Are multi-year grants awarded?

No. Grants are made on a yearly basis.

### Are reports required?

Yes. A yearly report is required from all grant recipients. The Common Grant Report format is preferred.

### What types of grant applications will not be considered by the Foundation?

- Applications from organizations that do not primarily serve financially disadvantaged Colorado residents
- Requests from organizations not qualified under Internal Revenue Code §501(c)(3)
- Applications from organizations that discriminate
- Applications for endowments, reserve funds, or debt reduction
- Medical, scientific, or academic research
- Health care programs
- Violence prevention programs
- Food distribution programs
- Care for the elderly
- Religious organizations for religious purposes
- Animal welfare or animal rights programs
- Recreational programs including wilderness adventures and summer camps
- Residential Treatment facilities for at-risk populations and substance abuse
- Multi-year funding requests
- Programs outside of Colorado

### What form of grant application should be used?

The Common Grant Application format has been modified to meet the needs of the foundation's application process. Proposal submission procedures and an Application Checklist are available through the Foundation office. Only complete applications receive funding consideration.

#### What is the deadline for submitting a grant proposal?

Applications must be postmarked by May 1 of the current funding year.

#### What is the notification process?

Applicants will be notified in writing of all grant decisions. Grants are awarded in November.

#### Are applicants encouraged to contact the Foundation before submitting a proposal?

Yes. The Foundation welcomes the opportunity to communicate with grant seekers. The Foundation fully understands that valuable resources are typically devoted to the submission of a grant application and encourages contact with the Foundation office to determine if the work of your agency is aligned with current funding priorities.
