NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Organization

HACD Corporation ("the Corporation") is a governmental non-profit Corporation organized to provide low-income housing and services to residents living in Danbury. CT

The sole member of the Corporation is the Housing Authority of the City of Danbury ("DHA" or "the Authority") The Corporation is governed by the Board of Commissioners of DHA The Board of Commissioners of DHA must approve all actions, including issuance of bonded debt, operational and capital budgets, through resolution

HACD Corporation owns and operates 26 units of low-income housing in Danbury. Connecticut

B. Reporting Entity

In accordance with statement No 39 of the Government Accounting Standards Board ("GASB"), the Corporation's financial statements include those of HACD Corporation and any component units. Component units are legally separate, tax-exempt organizations that meet all of the following criteria.

- ◆ The economic resources received by the separate organization are almost entirely for the direct benefit of the Corporation
- The Corporation has the ability to access a majority of the economic resources held by the separate organization
- The economic resources referred to above are significant to the Corporation

Based upon the application of these criteria, this report includes all programs and activities operated by the Corporation. There were no additional entities required to be included in the reporting entity under these criteria in the current fiscal year.

However, the Corporation is considered a component unit of the Danbury Housing Authority and as such is included in their financial statements

C. Basis of Presentation and Principles of Accounting

The Corporation is considered to be a governmental entity for the purpose of applying accounting and financial reporting standards, that is, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board ("GASB") has jurisdiction over the entity's accounting standards

The Corporation's financial statements are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is responsible for establishing GAAP for state and local governments through its pronouncements (Statements and Interpretations).

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

C. Basis of Presentation and Principles of Accounting (continued)

All transactions are accounted for using the economic resources measurement focus and the accrual basis of accounting Revenues, expenses, gains, and losses from assets and liabilities resulting from exchange and exchange-like transactions are recognized when the exchange takes place

The Corporation's primary source of non-exchange revenue relates to grants and subsidies. In accordance with GASB Statement No 33, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Non-exchange Transactions, grant and subsidy revenue are recognized at the time eligible program expenditures occur and/or the Project has complied with the grant and subsidy requirements

In accordance with GASB Statement No 20, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Proprietary Funds and Other Governmental Activities that Use Proprietary Fund Accounting, the Project has elected to apply all Financial Accounting Standards Board pronouncements. Accounting Principles Board Opinions and Accounting Research Bulletins issued that do not conflict with or contradict GASB Pronouncements

D. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period Significant estimates include the allowance for doubtful accounts, accrued expenses and other liabilities, depreciable lives of properties and equipment and contingencies. Actual results could differ from those estimates

E. Cash and Cash Equivalents

HUD requires housing authorities to invest excess funds in obligations of the United States. Certificates of Deposit or any other federally insured investment. HUD also requires that deposits be fully collateralized at all times. Acceptable collateralization includes FDIC insurance and the market value of securities purchased and pledged to the political subdivision. Pursuant to HUD restrictions, obligations of the United States are allowed as security for deposits. Obligations furnished as security must be held by DHA or with an unaffiliated bank or trust company for the account of DHA.

As a component unit of DHA, the Corporation maintains collateralization in accordance with HUD requirements

For the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents include all cash balances and highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less at time of purchase

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

F. Tenant Accounts Receivable

Rents are due from tenants on the first day of each month. As a result, tenants receivable balances primarily consist of rents past due and vacated units. An allowance for doubtful accounts is established to provide for all accounts, which may not be collected in the future for any reason. Collection losses on accounts receivable are charged against the allowance for doubtful accounts.

G. Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are recorded at cost at the time of the purchase. Depreciation is computed for financial statement purposes using the straight line method over a period of 3 - 10 years for Equipment and 5 - 40 years for Buildings and Improvements. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance and minor renewals are charged against income and expenditures. Major renewals and betterments are capitalized. Upon the sale or retirement of fixed assets, the cost and related accumulated depreciation is eliminated from the accounts and any related gain or loss is reflected in the Statement of Activities and Changes in Net Position.

H. Long-Lived Assets

The Corporation evaluates the carrying value of long-lived assets. When indications of an impairment are present, the recoverability of the carrying value of the assets in question are assessed based on the future undiscounted cash flows expected to result from their use. If the carrying value cannot be recovered, impairment losses would be recognized to the extent the carrying value exceeds fair value. The Corporation does not have any impaired assets at December 31, 2012.

I. Prepaid Tenant Rents

Prepaid tenant rents consist of prepayment of rent by tenants applicable to future periods

J. Rental Income

Rental income is recognized as rentals become due. Rental payments received in advance are deferred until earned

K. Income Taxes

The Corporation is exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is, therefore, not subject to income taxes on activities related to its exempt function

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

L. Risk Management

The Corporation is exposed to various risks of loss related to torts, theft of, damage to and destruction of assets error and omission, injuries to employees, and natural disaster. There have been no significant reductions in insurance coverage. Settlement amounts have not exceeded insurance coverage except for deductibles for the previous three years.

NOTE 2 - CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

For the fiscal year ended December 31, 2012, the carrying amount of the Corporation's cash and cash equivalents was \$20,212, and the bank balance approximated \$20,632. The entire bank balance was covered by federal depository insurance as of December 31, 2012.

Custodial credit risk is the risk that, in the event of a bank failure, the government's deposits may not be returned to it. The Corporation does not have a formal policy for custodial credit risk. As of December 31, 2012, the Corporation's bank balances were not exposed to custodial credit risk.

NOTE 3 - TENANT ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE, NET

Tenant receivables consist of rental money due to the Corporation for providing housing, and at December 31, 2012 are shown net of allowance for doubtful accounts of \$228

NOTE 4 - ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE - OTHER GOVERNMENT

At December 31, 2012 accounts receivable - other government consists of amounts owed from various governments for unreimbursed costs and grants
