NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2012 AND 2011

1. ORGANIZATION

Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Ocean State, Inc.

The Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Ocean State, Inc. (the Agency) is a non-profit corporation established to provide guidance and companionship to girls and boys through individual relationships with adult volunteers.

Big Sisters Fund

The Big Sisters Fund (the Fund) was formed in 1997 to collect used household items and clothes to raise funds to enable the Agency to further its mission. The By-Laws and Articles of Incorporation provide that the Agency shall be the sole member of the net earnings of the Fund. In the event that the Fund is liquidated or dissolved, all property and assets of the Fund remaining after providing for all debts and other expenses shall be distributed to the Agency.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying consolidated financial statements include the Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Ocean State, Inc. and its subsidiary the Big Sisters Fund which are collectively referred to as the Organization. The consolidated financial statements are presented to eliminate all significant inter-organization balances and transactions and to provide a more meaningful presentation of the economic activity of these Organizations.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

For financial statement purposes, the Organization considers all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents, except those funds that the Board has designated for investment.

Investments

Investments are recorded in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). Accordingly, investments in marketable securities are recorded at their fair value in the statement of financial position. Fair value is established by quoted market values. The unrealized gain or loss on investments is reflected in the statement of activities as part of investment income. Investment costs of \$7,183 and \$6,945 related to investment income is netted with investment income for the years ended December 31, 2012 and 2011, respectively. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. The Organization has a formal investment policy which provides for sufficient liquidity of assets. The investments must utilize a diversified approach including cash equivalents, bonds and various equity securities. The policy also provides for the usage of fixed income investments to provide a source of current income, to serve as a hedge against deflation and to reduce the variability of the total market value of the endowment.

NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2012 AND 2011

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Accounts and Notes Receivable

The Organization uses the reserve method for uncollectible accounts. Accordingly, the Organization has estimated the allowance reserve to be zero based on experience and review of current receivables at December 31, 2012 and 2011.

The Organization received approximately 84.6% of its total revenue for the year ended December 31, 2012 from one customer. In addition, 100% of the receivable balance at December 31, 2012 is due from one customer.

Property, Equipment and Depreciation

Property and equipment is stated at cost. The cost and accumulated depreciation of assets sold or retired are removed from the respective accounts and any gain or loss is recorded in earnings. Maintenance and repairs are charged to expense when incurred. Depreciation is provided on the straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Capital assets are defined by the Organization as assets with an initial individual cost of \$600 or more and an estimated useful life in excess of one year.

In accordance with GAAP, the Organization reviews long-lived assets and all intangible assets for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of such assets may not be recoverable. Any long-lived assets held for disposal are reported at the lower of their carrying amounts or fair value less cost to sell. Recoverability of these assets is determined by comparing the forecasted undiscounted net cash flows of the operation to which the assets relate to the carrying amount. If the operation is determined to be unable to recover the carrying amount of its assets, then intangible assets are written down to fair value first, followed by the other long-lived assets of the operation. Fair value is determined based on discounted cash flows or appraised values, depending on the nature of the assets. Management's review of such assets of the Organization has not indicated any material adverse effect on the Organization's consolidated financial position or results of operations.

Net Assets

The financial statement presentation follows GAAP for Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations. The Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets.

The Organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as temporarily restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit their use. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are released and reclassified to unrestricted net assets. Donor restricted contributions and support whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted contributions.

NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2012 AND 2011

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Net Assets (Continued)

Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long-lived assets must be maintained, the Organization reports expirations of donor restrictions when donated or purchased long-lived assets are placed in service.

Net assets are classified as follows:

Unrestricted Net Assets consists of the net resources available to support normal operations.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets consist of amounts given with donor specified purposes for which expenditures satisfying those purposes have not been made.

Permanently Restricted Net Assets consist of amounts given with the stipulation that the principal be maintained intact in perpetuity. Income from these investments may be used to fund operations or may be restricted by donor stipulations.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Advertising Costs

It is the Organization's policy to expense advertising costs as incurred. The Organization has incurred advertising costs of \$23,979 and \$14,319 for the years ended December 31, 2012 and 2011, respectively.

Contributed Services

The Organization receives donated services from a variety of unpaid volunteers assisting the Organization. No amounts have been recognized in the accompanying statement of activities because the criteria for recognition of such volunteer effort under GAAP have not been satisfied.

Income Taxes

The Organization is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization is also exempt from Rhode Island income taxes. However, income from certain activities not directly related to the Organization's tax-exempt purpose may be subject to taxation as unrelated business income at both the state and federal levels. In addition, the Organization qualifies for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and has been classified as an organization other than a private foundation under Section 509(a)(2).

The Organization evaluates all significant tax positions as required by GAAP. As of December 31, 2012 and 2011, the Organization does not believe that it has taken any tax positions that would require the recording of any additional tax liability nor does it believe that there are any unrealized tax benefits that would either increase or decrease within the next twelve months. The Organization's income tax returns are subject to examination by the appropriate taxing jurisdictions. As of December 31, 2012, the Organization's federal and state tax returns generally remain open for the last three years.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The carrying amount of cash and cash equivalents approximates fair value. The carrying amount of accounts receivable, other assets, prepaid rent, accounts payable and accrued expenses, accrued payroll, line of credit, deferred rent and deferred revenue approximates fair value due to their short-term nature. The carrying amount of long-term debt approximates fair value as the interest rate approximates current market rates for debt with similar remaining maturities.

GAAP defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, establishes a fair value hierarchy based on the quality of inputs used to measure fair value, and enhances disclosure requirements for fair value measurement. The Organization accounts for a significant portion of financial instruments at fair value or considers fair value in their measurement for financial assets and liabilities that are re-measured and reported at fair value at each reporting period, except for nonfinancial assets and nonfinancial liabilities that are recognized or disclosed at fair value in the financial statements on a nonrecurring basis.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. GAAP also establishes a fair value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. The standard describes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement

Level 1:

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

Level 2:

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- · Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- · Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3:

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurements.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Common Stocks: Valued at the share price listed in the active trading market (NYSE, AMEX, NASDAQ) times the number of shares held by the Organizations at year end.

Bonds. Valued at the share price listed in the active trading market (NYSE, AMEX, NASDAQ) times the number of shares held by the Organizations at year end.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the plan at year end.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Organization believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

6. PERMANENTLY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Permanently restricted net assets represent the Dr. Dorothy Pieniadz Founding Mothers' Fund (Pieniadz Fund), which was established in 2000 by Dr. Dorothy Pieniadz. An initial donation of \$50,000 was made by Dr. Pieniadz and any additional contributions may be made as long as they are acceptable to the Agency. Annual distributions from the Pieniadz Fund shall be used for operating expenses or reinvested in the endowment at the discretion of the Board of Directors. In all respects, the use of the Pieniadz Fund shall be in accordance with the charitable purposes of the Agency. At December 31, 2012 and 2011, the fair value of the Pieniadz Fund was \$64,979 and \$63,229, respectively.

The primary objective of the investment management of the endowment is to maximize total return, which will allow for future growth through a diversified portfolio strategy and within acceptable risk parameters as was previously determined by the Finance Committee. Risk is managed within the portfolio by the financial advisor in accordance with the objectives identified by the Finance/Audit Committee. The Pieniadz Fund has chosen to follow a strategy of minimal risk as it only consists of one government agency bond, plus a cash reserve.

The spending policy is designed to limit spending for current operations – so as to allow endowment to grow without being depleted for operations. Annual distributions from the Pieniadz Fund, as determined in accordance with the distribution policies of the Organization, shall be used for operating expenses or reinvested in the Pieniadz Fund, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, with the understanding that the Board of Directors reserves the right to make changes to the distribution policies as circumstances require. In all respects, the use of the Pieniadz Fund shall be in accordance with the charitable purposes of the Organization.

Interpretation of Relevant Law

The Board of Directors of the Organization has interpreted the State of Rhode Island's Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act (SPMIFA) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, the Foundation has classified as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in permanently restricted net assets is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the Organization in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by SPMIFA. In accordance with SPMIFA, the Organization considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds:

- (1) The duration and preservation of the fund;
- (2) The purposes of the Organization and the donor-restricted endowment fund;
- (3) General economic conditions;
- (4) The possible effect of inflation and deflation;
- (5) The expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments;
- (6) Other resources of the Organization;
- (7) The investment policies of the Organization.

Return Objectives and Risk Parameters

The primary objective of the investment management of the endowment is to maximize total return, which will allow for future growth through a diversified portfolio strategy and within acceptable risk parameters as was determined by the Finance Committee. Risk is managed within the portfolio by the financial advisor in accordance with the objectives by the Finance Committee.

Strategies Employed for Achieving Objectives

In an attempt to provide the Organization with sufficient liquidity, the donation of \$50,000 was chosen to be invested in either a money market or a short-term fixed income obligation. Therefore, the money is invested in one government agency bond, plus a cash reserve. The primary purpose of fixed income investments (bonds, cash equivalents) are to provide a source of current income, to serve as a hedge against deflation and to reduce the variability of the total market value of endowment. The investment performance is measured on a long-term (3 to 5 years) basis by both the financial advisor and the Board of Directors.

8. LEASE COMMITMENTS

Operating Leases

On November 1, 2011, the Organization renewed an operating lease for office space in Cranston, Rhode Island. Payments of \$8,400 are due monthly until the lease expires on October 31, 2016. The lease contains an option to extend this term for two additional consecutive periods of 5 years.

On April 9, 2012, the Organization entered into an operating lease for office space in Middletown, Rhode Island. Payments of \$700 are due monthly until the lease expires on April 30, 2013.

On November 1, 2012, the Organization entered into an operating lease for office space in Cumberland, Rhode Island. Payments of \$650 are due monthly until the lease expires on November 30, 2013.

In addition, the Organization also leases various vehicles and equipment on a month-to-month basis with expiration dates through December 2015.

9. CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Organization has a potential concentration of credit risk in that it maintains deposits with a financial institution in excess of amounts insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation ("FDIC"). The maximum deposit insurance amount is \$250,000 for interest bearing accounts, which is applied per depositor, per insured depository institution for each account ownership category. Non-interest bearing transaction deposit accounts are provided unlimited insurance coverage through December 31, 2012. Beginning on January 1, 2013, non-interest bearing transaction accounts will no longer be insured separately from depositors' other accounts at the same insured depository institution. Instead, non-interest bearing transaction accounts will be added to any of a depositor's other accounts in the applicable ownership category, and the aggregate balance is insured up to \$250,000, per depositor, per insured depository institution for each account ownership category.

10. COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

The Organization has received grants for specific purposes that are subject to audit by the grantors or their representatives. Such audits could lead to request for reimbursement to the grantor agency for expenditures disallowed under terms of the grant. Organization officials believe such disallowances, if any, would be immaterial.

11. OBLIGATIONS UNDER CAPITAL LEASES

The Agency and the Fund each have an obligation under a capital lease for equipment at various interest rates, payable in monthly installments. The leases expire in November 2013 and May 2014 for the Agency and the Fund, respectively. Included in fixed assets is the cost of equipment acquired under capital leases in the amount of \$60,878 at December 31, 2012 and 2011. Accumulated depreciation on such assets was approximately \$44,460 and \$32,286 at December 31, 2012 and 2011, respectively.

12. LINE OF CREDIT

On July 23, 2009 the Organization entered into a line of credit arrangement with a financial institution which carries a maximum possible balance of \$50,000. Amounts borrowed on the line bear interest at a rate of prime plus .50% (3.75% at December 31, 2012 and 2011). The balance on the line of credit was \$0 as of December 31, 2012 and 2011. Collateral used to secure the line is the Organization's investments account. The line must be reviewed and renewed annually by the bank.

13. PENSION PLAN

The Organization has a simple IRA pension plan covering all employees meeting certain eligibility requirements. Employer contributions to the plan are based on a fixed percentage of salaries. The contribution percentage is 3% and 2% for years ended December 31, 2012 and 2011, respectively. Pension expense totaled \$10,809 and \$4,953 for years ended December 31, 2012 and 2011, respectively.
