CAYUGA MEDICAL CENTER FOUNDATION NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the Years Ended December 31, 2012 and 2011

A. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Organization:

The Cayuga Medical Center Foundation (the Foundation) is a not-for-profit organization located in Ithaca, New York. The Foundation solicits, accepts, holds, invests and administers gifts, grants, bequests, contributions, devices, benefits or trust endowments and property of any kind for the benefit of Cayuga Medical Center at Ithaca (the Medical Center) and others by using, disbursing or paying the income or principal thereof exclusively for the foregoing purposes or in the advancement thereof.

2. Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Estimates also affect the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

3. Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements of the Cayuga Medical Center Foundation have been prepared on the accrual basis. Consequently, revenue is recognized when earned rather than when received and expenditures are recorded when incurred rather than when paid.

4. Risks and Uncertainties:

Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the fair value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect the net assets of the Foundation.

5. Income Taxes:

The Foundation is exempt from income taxes as a non-profit organization under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

The Foundation accounts for income taxes in accordance with FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 740, *Income Taxes*. FASB ASC 740-10 clarifies the accounting for income taxes, by prescribing a minimum recognition threshold a tax position is required to meet before being recognized in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Foundation is no longer subject to U.S. federal, state, or local income tax examinations by tax authorities for years before 2009.

6. Cash and Cash Equivalents:

The Foundation considers all highly liquid investments with maturities of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents.

7. Pledges:

Pledges are derived from employee and community support. Amounts are recorded at the time the pledge is made, at the present value of the expected future contribution.

8. Investments:

Investments are recorded at fair value, based on quoted market prices. If quoted market prices are not available, fair values are based on quoted market prices of comparable instruments. Interest, dividends, realized gains and changes in fair value resulting from unrealized gains and losses are included as increases or decreases in unrestricted net assets unless the income is restricted by donor or law.

9. Payable to Durham Trust:

Payable to Durham Trust represents a revocable trust with an agreement dated October 2000 for an initial term of three years. The agreement is automatically renewed for successive three year terms unless either party gives written notice of termination at least one year prior to the expiration of a term. Should the trust be revoked, the amount due to the donor is the fair value of the investments at that time. The investments are recorded at fair value and are commingled in the Foundation portfolio. The interest income earned from the Durham Trust must be re-invested into the Trust until a predetermined return has been met.

10. Payable to Cayuga Medical Center:

As a result of the Medical Center having an economic interest in a portion of the Foundation's net assets, the Medical Center has recognized its interest in net assets of the Foundation and the Foundation has recognized a liability to the Medical Center.

11. Funds Held in Trust by Others:

Funds held in trust by others represent investments associated with Franklin Cornell, Annie Stewart and Katherine R. Spinney trusts which are held in perpetuity. During 2012 the Annie Stewart trust was transferred out of the funds held in trust by others and into the Foundation's investment account. The interest income earned from the Cornell trust is for general operating purposes of the Medical Center and is recorded as payable to Cayuga Medical Center. The interest income from the Stewart and Spinney trusts is for donor restricted purposes of the Medical Center and has been recorded as payable to Cayuga Medical Center. Funds held in trust by others are recognized at the estimated fair value of the assets which approximates the present value of the future cash flows when the irrevocable trust is established or the Foundation is notified of its existence.

12. Financial Statement Presentation:

The Foundation reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets and permanently restricted net assets.

13. Revenue Recognition:

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

B. RESTATEMENT OF PRIOR PERIOD

Certain prior period inaccuracies resulting in an understatement of previously reported net assets were discovered in the current year. Accordingly, a prior period adjustment of \$29,782 was made during 2012 to write down the 2011 allowance for doubtful scholarship receivables and associated provision for bad debts. The effect of the restatement on net assets for 2011 was an increase of \$29,782.

C. INVESTMENTS

Investments are recorded at fair market value.

The Foundation's investments had unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of \$371,104 and \$(28,014) on December 31, 2012 and 2011, respectively. The cost and fair value of the Foundation's investments are as follows:

Permanently restricted net assets are restricted to investments to be held in perpetuity or in trust by others, certain of the income from which is expendable to purchase equipment, support education, provide healthcare financial assistance and general unrestricted use.

G RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Foundation has agreements with Cayuga Medical Center for administrative, accounting and fundraising services. Total fees paid during 2012 and 2011 were \$189,225 and \$176,679, respectively.

H. CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

During the year the Foundation will have bank deposits in excess of the FDIC insured limits.

I. ENDOWMENT

An endowment fund is an established fund of cash, securities, or other assets that provides income for the support of a not-for-profit organization. Endowment funds are generally established by donor restricted gifts but can also be established by an organization's governing board. A donor can stipulate that a gift is to be invested in perpetuity or for a specified term. The net assets of an endowment fund can result from three sources: original principal, gains and losses, or interest and dividends. When classifying the net assets of an endowment fund, each source must be evaluated separately. Each source is unrestricted unless its use is restricted-temporarily or permanently by donor law.

Cayuga Medical Center Foundation's permanently restricted endowment consists of five individual funds: Young Women's Healthcare Education Assistance Fund, C.B. Howell Health Education Fund, Spinney Fund for Charity Care (Held by Others), Cornell Fund for Unrestricted Purposes (Held by Others), and Stewart Fund for Charity Care. The Stewart Fund for Charity Care was transferred out of the Held by Others account during 2012.

The permanently restricted funds were established by a donors' restriction that the gift's principal be invested in perpetuity. No donor restrictions have been placed on the investment returns of the Cornell Fund. Investment returns of all the other funds are restricted by the donor for specific purposes. As required by GAAP, net assets associated with endowment funds, including funds designated by the Board of Trustees to function as endowments, are classified and reported based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

Interpretation of Relevant Law

The Board of Trustees of Cayuga Medical Center Foundation has interpreted and complied with the New York Prudent Management Institutional Funds Act (NYPMIFA) as requiring the preservation of the fair value of the original gift as of the gift date of the donor-restricted endowment funds absent explicit donor stipulations to the contrary. As a result of this interpretation, Cayuga Medical Center Foundation classifies as permanently restricted net assets (a) the original value of gifts donated to the permanent endowment, (b) the original value of subsequent gifts to the permanent endowment, and (c) accumulations to the permanent endowment made in accordance with the direction of the applicable donor gift instrument at the time the accumulation is added to the fund. The remaining portion of the donor-restricted endowment fund that is not classified in permanently restricted net assets is classified as temporarily restricted net assets until those amounts are appropriated for expenditure by the organization in a manner consistent with the standard of prudence prescribed by NYPMIFA.

In accordance with applicable state law and the Foundation's investment policy, the Foundation considers the following factors in making a determination to appropriate or accumulate donor-restricted endowment funds:

- 1) The duration and preservation of the fund;
- 2) The purposes of the Cayuga Medical Center Foundation and the donor-restricted endowment fund;
- 3) General economic conditions;
- 4) The possible effect of inflation and deflation;
- 5) The expected total return from income and the appreciation of investments;
- 6) Other resources of the Foundation; and
- 7) The investment policies of the Foundation.

Funds with Deficiencies

From time to time, the fair value of assets associated with individual donor-restricted endowment funds may fall below the level that the donor or NYPMIFA requires the organization to retain as a fund of perpetual duration. There were no such deficiencies as of December 31, 2012 and 2011.

Return Objectives and Risk Parameters

Cayuga Medical Center Foundation has adopted investment and spending policies for endowment assets that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs supported by its endowment while seeking to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets. Under this policy, as approved by the Board of Trustees, the endowment assets are invested in a manner that is intended to provide for the long-term well being of the Foundation. The goal is to exceed the benchmarks set for each type of investment, as applicable.

Strategies Employed for Achieving Objectives

To satisfy its long-term rate-of-return objectives, Cayuga Medical Center Foundation relies on a total return strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and current yield (interest and dividends). The Foundation targets a diversified asset allocation that places a greater emphasis on equity-based investments to achieve its long-term return objectives within prudent risk constraints.

Spending Policy and How the Investment Objectives Relate to Spending Policy

Cayuga Medical Center Foundation has a policy of budgeting and appropriating funds for distribution each year during the adoption of their annual budget. In determining annual distributions, the Foundation considers the long-term expected return on its endowment, and maintains a minimum amount to allow for a diversified portfolio and asset allocation. This is consistent with the Foundation's objective to maintain the purchasing power of the endowment assets held in perpetuity or for a specified term as well as to provide additional real growth through new gifts and investment return.

J. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 established a three-tier hierarchy for fair value measurements, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value as follows.

- Level 1 Observable inputs such as quoted prices for identical instruments in active markets.
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are observable either directly or indirectly through corroboration with observable market data.
- Level 3 Unobservable inputs in which there is little or no market data, which would require the Foundation to develop its own assumptions.

As of December 31, 2012, the Foundation held certain assets and liabilities that were measured at fair value on a recurring basis. The fair value of investments and funds held in trust, payable to Durham Trust and Cayuga Medical Center, are obtained from readily available market prices. Fair value for the promises to give is determined by calculating the present value of the future distributions expected to be received, using a 6% discount rate. Amounts pledged that are less than \$100,000 are measured in the aggregate using present value techniques that consider historical trends of collection, the type of donor (individual or corporation/foundation) and general economic conditions in the geographic area in which the majority of the donor's live.
