

THESE VILLAGES INCLUDE CONGREGACION ZARAGOZA, OCTAVIO PAZ, TEPEYAC, SAN AGUSTIN JITOTOL, SAN ANTONIO CHICHARRAS, 20 DE NOVIEMBRE, CANTON MURILLO, CANTON NUEVA AND CANTON REFORMA.
