TOBACCO CONTROL OVERVIEW OF ACTIVITIES IN REPORTING PERIOD THROUGHOUT 2012, THE UNION HAS CONTINUED TO FOCUS ON WORKING WITH GOVERNMENTS, AT A NATIONAL LEVEL WHEREVER POSSIBLE, TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT TOBACCO CONTROL LEGISLATION AND POLICY COMPREHENSIVE TOBACCO CONTROL LEGISLATION WAS PASSED ARGENTINA, CHILE, VIETNAM AND BULGARIA TOBACCO TAXATION LEGISLATION THAT WILL FUND TOBACCO CONTROL PROGRAMMES WAS PASSED IN THE PHILIPPINES PROGRESS TOWARDS NATIONAL LEGISLATION HAS BEEN PROMISING IN BANGLADESH WHERE THE CABINET APPROVED A DRAFT TOBACCO CONTROL LAW AND IN CHINA WHERE TOBACCO CONTROL HAS BEEN INCLUDED ON THE TWELFTH FIVE-YEAR PLAN OF CHINA WHERE NATIONAL PROGRESS IS SLOWER, STRATEGICALLY-SELECTED AND MULTILATERAL SUB-NATIONAL INITIATIVES ARE PROVING EFFECTIVE IN ADVANCING SMOKEFREE ENVIRONMENTS AND OTHER TOBACCO CONTROL MEASURES THE CHINA SEVEN CITIES PROGRAMS AND THE INDONESIAN MAYORS ALLIANCE HAVE BOTH DEMONSTRATED THE POTENTIAL FOR SUB-NATIONAL COOPERATION ON SMOKEFREE ENVIRONMENTS TO PROTECT SIGNIFICANT POPULATIONS AND INFLUENCE THE NATIONAL AGENDA BANGLADESH IS MOVING TOWARDS A SIMILAR MODEL AND HAS HAD MODEST SUCCESS IN KHULNA AND AND GUANGZHOU HAVE ALL ALLOCATED FUNDS TO TOBACCO CONTROL BUILDING OF THE UNION CONTINUES TO FOCUS ON ESTABLISHING TOBACCO CONTROL INFRASTRUCTURES - SUCH AS GOVERNMENT TOBACCO CONTROL CELLS THAT CAN GRADUALLY BECOMING SELF-SUSTAINING THROUGH TOBACCO TAXATION ALLOCATIONS THE GOVERNMENTS OF HARBIN, TIANJIN, SHENZHEN AND GUANGZHOU HAVE ALL ALLOCATED FUNDS TO TOBACCO CONTROL PROGRAMS AND CELLS THE PHILIPPINES ESTABLISHED A NATIONAL TOBACCO CONTROL COORDINATING OFFICE (NTCCO) WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH IN 2011 BUILDING ON THE UNION'S LONG HISTORY WITH PUBLIC HEALTH AND MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS AROUND THE WORLD, THE UNION IS CONTINUING TO ADVANCE TOBACCO CONTROL MEASURES THROUGH THE BROADER HEALTHCARE COMMUNITY IN RUSSIA, THE UNION'S COLLABORATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH RESULTED IN A SMOKING STATUS SECTION BEING INCLUDED IN THE ELECTRONIC PERSONAL MEDICAL HISTORY FOR GOVERNMENT HEALTHCARE PATIENTS IN INDIA, THE UNION AND MINISTRY OF HEALTH HEALTH WORKERS GUIDE HAS BEEN DISTRIBUTED TO OVER HALF A MILLION FRONT-LINE HEALTH WORKERS OVER THE TWO YEAR PERIOD INCREASINGLY, THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY IS RECOGNISING THE PROGRESS OF THE UNION AND PARTNERS, AND STEPPING UP EFFORTS TO COUNTER TOBACCO CONTROL PROGRAMS THE UNION IS SUPPORTING BI GRANTEES TO DEFEND LEGISLATIVE CHALLENGES AND DEVELOPING MATERIALS - SUCH AS THE UNION FCTC ARTICLE 5 3 TOOLKIT - THAT WILL HELP GOVERNMENTS AND ORGANIZATIONS SAFEGUARD THEMSELVES FROM TOBACCO INDUSTRY INFLUENCE THE UNION AND GRANTEES IN BRAZIL, INDIA, PAKISTAN, LEBANON AND SOUTH AFRICA HAVE SUCCESSFULLY DEFENDED CHALLENGES OR BROUGHT LEGAL PROCEEDINGS AGAINST THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY

THE LINKED MODEL APPROACH HAS THE POTENTIAL TO ANSWER SOME OF THESE QUESTIONS AND WILL ASSESS THE IMPACT OF XPERT MTB/RIF ON HEALTH SYSTEM COSTS, PATIENT ACCESS AND OUTCOMES, AND THE TB EPIDEMIC IN A GIVEN SETTING THIS WORK IS SET TO CONTINUE THROUGH THE NEXT REPORTING PERIOD KEY RESULTS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS. IN MAY 2012, OPERATIONAL RESEARCH ANALYST IVOR LANGLEY AND TREAT TB DEPUTY PROJECT DIRECTOR HANNAH ALSDURF TRAVELLED TO BRAZIL TO COLLECT AND ANALYZE ADDITIONAL DATA ON PATIENT OUTCOMES, COST, AND OTHER FACTORS RELATED TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF LPA AND XPERT MTB/RIF.
