BYLAWS

Adopted May 20, 1904. Amended January 15, 1908; November 1, 1912; October 27, 1916; June 2, 1922; April 27, 1923; January 28, 1931; June 19, 1957; April 22, 1958; April 29, 1960; October 26, 1971; January 31, 1980; February 13, 1986; April 27, 1995; June 21, 2001, February 21, 2002; March 8, 2007; and June 20, 2012.

WHEREAS, by Deed of Trust dated New York, March 12, 1904, Andrew Carnegie established the Carnegie Hero Fund and appointed a Commission charged with administering the Carnegie Hero Fund according to the terms of said Deed of Trust; and

WHEREAS, the Commission appointed by Mr. Carnegie was composed of the following named persons and their duly elected successors forever, namely:

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the CARNEGIE HERO FUND COMMISSION enact bylaws in order to effectuate the purposes set forth in the said Deed of Trust;

NOW, THEREFORE, the following provisions are hereby enacted as the bylaws of the CARNEGIE HERO FUND COMMISSION:

ARTICLE I
Commission

Section 1. The title of this body, created by appointment of Andrew Carnegie, is the CARNEGIE HERO FUND COMMISSION.

The purpose of the CARNEGIE HERO FUND COMMISSION shall be to act as trustee of the Carnegie Hero Fund and to administer said Fund in accordance with the provisions of the letter of Andrew Carnegie dated New York, March 12, 1904.

Section 2. The members of the Commission shall not exceed twenty-one in number. In the event of vacancies, occasioned by death, resignation, or otherwise, of any of the above-named twenty-one members or their successors, such vacancies shall be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members present at any annual or special meeting of the Commission properly convened. In addition, there may be elected as Honorary Members such persons as may be deemed by the members of the Commission to be deserving of special recognition on account of their services to the Commission. Honorary members shall be entitled to attend all meetings of the Commission and to vote, but they shall not count toward a quorum.

Section 3. The annual meeting of the Commission shall be held in June of each year on such day and at such place in the City of Pittsburgh as the President of the Commission shall establish. Special meetings of the Commission may be held at the call of the President or upon the written request of any three members. Notices in writing of all meetings of the Commission shall be given by the Secretary to each member not less than 10 days before each annual, special, or adjourned meeting. The notice for each special meeting shall recite the purpose for which it is called. At all meetings of the Commission nine members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a less number than quorum may adjourn to a fixed date.

Section 4. No part of the net earnings of the Commission may inure to the benefit or be distributed to any officer or director of the Commission or to any other private person, except that the Commission shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purposes as set forth in its Deed of Trust. In the event of the dissolution of the Commission or in the winding up of its affairs, or other liquidation of its assets, the Commission's property shall not be conveyed to any organization created or operated for profit or to any individual for less than the fair market value of such property; all assets remaining after all debts and expenses of the Commission have been paid or provided for shall be conveyed or distributed by the trustees to one or more organizations qualifying for the exemption afforded by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and approved by the court of competent jurisdiction. Any such assets not so distributed shall be disposed of pursuant to an order by a court of competent jurisdiction exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as said court shall determine.

ARTICLE II

Officers

Section 1. The officers of the Commission shall consist of a President, an Executive Director, one or more Vice Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary, and such other officers as the members of the Commission may from time to time deem necessary. They shall be elected from among the members and/or the employees of the Commission at the annual meeting in February and shall hold office for one year and until their successors are elected. All vacancies in the foregoing offices may be filled by the Commission for the unexpired term at any special meeting of the Commission properly convened. Any two or more offices may be held by one person.

Section 2. The President shall have general charge and control over the affairs of the Commission, subject to the members of the Commission, except for the compensation paid to the

officers of the Commission, which shall be determined by the Executive Committee. He shall preside at all meetings of the Commission and shall appoint all standing committees and be ex-officio a member of each, except for the Audit Committee. He shall have power to enforce the bylaws, regulations, and orders and shall perform such other duties as are common to the office. He may delegate any of his duties to an officer of the Commission.

Section 2a. The Executive Director shall hold office at the pleasure of the board and, under the direction of the President and the Executive Committee, shall have operating charge of all affairs of the Commission not specifically assigned otherwise by these bylaws or by action of the board.

Section 3. The Vice Presidents, in order of seniority, shall, in the absence or disability of the President, perform all the duties of the office of President and shall perform such other duties as the members of the Commission may from time to time prescribe.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall be the financial officer of the Commission and shall cause to be kept books of accounts, showing in detail all moneys received and disbursed, which books shall at all times be open to the inspection of the Commission. His books, records, and all financial transactions shall be audited at least once annually by an independent certified public accountant, to be selected by the Commission or by the Executive Committee after due consultation with the Audit Committee. He shall deposit all funds to the credit and in the name of the Commission, in such depositories as the Finance Committee shall designate. He shall give a bond with sureties, in such amount as may be approved by the Executive Committee, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties. When called upon by the Commission or Finance Committee, he shall make detailed reports to them of receipts and disbursements, and at each annual meeting he shall present a statement or summary showing the income and expenditures for the preceding year and shall perform such other duties as are common to the office. The members of the Commission may, in their discretion, elect an Assistant Treasurer who shall perform such duties of the Treasurer as the Commission shall direct. The Assistant Treasurer will provide a bond with sureties in such amount as may be approved by the Executive Committee, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties.

Section 5. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Commission in a book provided for that purpose and preserve the permanent records and correspondence of the Commission. Such minutes, records, and correspondence shall be open to the members for their review at all times. He shall send to the members of the Commission notices of all meetings and perform such other duties as are common to the office.

ARTICLE III Standing Committees

Section 1. The following Standing Committees, consisting of not less than two nor more than six members (except the Executive Committee, which shall consist of at least ten members), shall be appointed by the President at each annual meeting, to serve for one year, and until their successors are appointed: (a) Executive Committee, (b) Finance Committee, (c) Audit Committee, and (d) Membership Committee.

Section 2. The Executive Committee shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Fund and shall have full authority to act on behalf of the Commission on all matters not specifically delegated in these bylaws to other Standing Committees, including but not limited to the authority to review case histories and take final action on the awarding of medals and benefits. At all meetings of the Executive Committee, six members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Section 3. The Finance Committee shall exercise responsibility for investments of the Fund of the Commission, and it shall report at the annual meeting on the amount, character, and performance of all investments made during the preceding year; and in addition, shall distribute at least semi-annually to the members of the Commission a summary of the condition of the Fund. In carrying out its responsibilities the Finance Committee may select on behalf of the Commission an independent investment advisor for the purpose of rendering advice and making investment decisions with respect to the Fund, provided that such investment advisor shall report regularly to the Commission regarding all investments made on its behalf. The Finance Committee may select on behalf of the Commission a banking or trust institution or a regulated investment company (mutual fund) as custodian of the cash, securities, and other assets of the Commission. No services shall be performed on behalf of the Commission by such investment advisor, banking or trust institution, or regulated investment company except pursuant to written agreement, the terms of which are satisfactory to the Commission.

Section 4. The Audit Committee shall exercise responsibility for assuring the accuracy of the books and records of the Treasurer. In carrying out its responsibilities, the Audit Committee shall receive, review, and report to the Commission on the annual audit of the Treasurer's books and records prepared by an independent certified public accountant pursuant to Article II, Section 4 of these bylaws.

Section 5. The Membership Committee shall be entrusted with the selection of, and power to nominate to the Commission, the names of suitable persons to fill vacancies on the Commission.

ARTICLE IV Amendments

These bylaws may be amended at any properly convened annual or special meeting of the Commission by a two-thirds vote of all the members present provided that the full text of the proposed amendment shall have been included in the notice of such annual or special meeting.
