Health & Emergency Relief- The increasing need for emergency support for families in financial crisis drove a decision to expand a proactive matching grant program in recent year in support of fundraising efforts by three local ministerial associations. All funds in those efforts were collected by LCCF through its Good Samaritan Fund and then matched dollar-for-dollar. With the unemployment rate still hovering around 8% and underemployment increasingly the norm, the primary emphasis in awards was on health and human services. LCCF Board of Directors and grants committee take an active role in the community by partnering with the numerous not-for-profit organizations that deliver services that are focused on keeping the citizens of LaGrange County healthy.

Scholarships - The LCCF scholarship program, which includes new and renewable scholarships, awarded 56 scholarships which resulted in tuition payments for local scholars of \$39,350.00 in 2012. Scholarship awardees are selected on a competitive basis through careful review and scoring process of applications by members of the LCCF all-volunteer Scholarship Advisory Committee and Board of Directors. All scholarship applications are available on-line during the scholarship season at www.lccf.net.

Education Support - LCCF operates a program in support of education for all citizens of LaGrange County. According to the Indiana Department of Workforce Development, LaGrange County has ranked last in the state for the percentage of workers (30.3%) who have completed a high school education for at least the last ten years. Education is an economic development issue that continues to challenge our county. It influences our ability to attract and keep high-paying manufacturing jobs. It also affects the ability of individual local workers to compete for those jobs. In 2012, LaGrange County Community Foundation (LCCF) continued its ongoing support of adult education. A grant to Learning Generation Initiative in the amount of \$19,761 funded essential instruction that resulted in nearly 50 local residents earning a GED's.

Community Development & Recognition- The Heart of Gold Program identifies and honors everyday citizens in LaGrange County who touch the lives of others. Nominees for the award were submitted to the Community Foundation by local residents familiar with the nominee's unselfish volunteer efforts to serve others. The LCCF also promotes community development through supporting youth programs. These programs allow for enriching after school activities, as well as summer camp programs that keep students engaged in being active and healthy and involved in the community.
