Project Summary:

The Indiana Native Plant and Wildflower Society (INPAWS) seek support for the Bicentennial “2012 Trees in 2012” Project. A tree advocacy group composed of representatives of local, not-for-profit environmental conservation organizations, including INPAWS, City of Evansville government agencies, and City of Evansville Parks and Nature Preserves created the Bicentennial “2012 Trees in 2012” Project.

In celebration of Evansville’s Bicentennial, 2012 native trees will be planted at sites around Vanderburgh County. The “2012 Trees in 2012” Project will provide community education on the importance of using native trees, along with the proper planting and site selection for trees. The community will be invited to join in a “Citizens Challenge” to help achieve the goal of planting 2012 trees in 2012 within our community.

Citizens will be invited to post a photo of their personal tree planting on the 2012trees.org Facebook page. People who post to the Facebook page will be entered into a random drawing to receive a free tree planted by the RTC.

Mission & Goals of Project:

The Mission of this informal tree advocacy group, called the Rivercity Trees Committee (RTC), is to offer local citizens a means to celebrate the Evansville’s Bicentennial and improve the quality of our community and environment by planting native trees. The RTC hopes to educate the community on the importance of using native trees and avoiding invasive trees or trees on the “do not plant list” for Indiana.

Project Results:

The RTC, along with our partners, sponsors and the citizens of Vanderburgh County can have a positive, long-term impact on the environment by planting native trees. Our community will have living memorials of the Bicentennial Celebration. When properly chosen and planted, trees can reduce a business or residence's energy demands. Trees are important carbon sinks and planting trees is a tangible, effective step in minimizing the impact of climate change.

Native Trees are well adapted to the local climate and geography; should require little or no pesticides or fertilizers and once established, will be drought resistant. Native trees improve the biodiversity of an area, providing food, shelter and nesting places for indigenous wildlife. These trees will add value to any landscape and improve our community ecologically, economically and aesthetically.

Communicating how to plant the right tree, the right way and in the right place can save homeowners, utility companies and business owners thousands of dollars. It is important to plant the tree in the correct environment, one that emulates the plant's native environment as much as possible. Trees should not be planted too close to buildings or power lines. These important facts will be communicated through our www.2012trees.org website and the Project Facebook page; both of which will be managed by the Department of Sustainability, Energy and Environmental Quality (SEEQ). Both the webpage and the Facebook page will include links to existing instructional videos on how to plant trees developed by City Arborist Shawn Dickerson.

Sponsor Participation:

Alcoa Volunteers will be invited to plant 26 native trees at three properties owned and operated by the Evansville Fire Department. These plantings will require twelve Alcoa Volunteers with the skills and physical ability to plant the trees. The trees will be approximately 1.5" to 2" in diameter. The holes for the trees will be pre-dug by the Arborist and staff. Each team of Alcoa volunteers will be accompanied by a Master Gardener to insure that the trees are planted properly. This will be an educational event with the public and media invited. Alcoa will be the only corporate sponsor for this event.

After planting, the EFD will be responsible for watering and maintaining the trees. The City will provide wood chip mulch to place around the trees to reduce water demand and discourage weed growth.
