RMHC receives support from McDonald's Corporation (McDonald's) consisting of the free use of its facilities, equipment, materials, and limited services. The free goods and services provided by McDonald's partially defray certain costs that RMHC would otherwise incur to conduct special fundraising events, as well as selected program service, fundraising, and management and general expenditures, including the free use of its facilities. Certain management services, such as financial, fundraising and program services are provided free of charge by employees of McDonald's. In addition, RMHC received five free full-page ads from USA TODAY. In 2012, the total value of the free services, office space and advertising space provided to RMHC (and included in its audited financial statements) was \$5,065,167, of which \$3,800,397 was provided by McDonald's and \$1,213,000 was provided by USA TODAY. RMHC received additional donated services from other donors totaling \$51,770. For tax purposes, the value of the donated services, advertising, and facilities must be excluded from total revenues in Part VIII and total expenses in Part IX of Form 990.

Note 13 - Form 990, Part IX, Line 11f, Investment Management Fees:

As a service to its US Local Chapters, RMHC pays the financial advisory services and administrative cost of an investment program that allows participating Chapters access to highly diversified investment options that would otherwise not be available to them.
