The Richard A. Perritt Charitable Foundation ("Foundation") has set aside \$700,000 during its fiscal year ended December 31, 2009 for funding a five year grant to Children's Memorial Hospital. The Foundation reported such set aside as a qualifying distribution for 2009 under the "cash distribution" test of IRC Section 4942(b)(2)(B)(ii), and accordingly, submits the following statement pursuant to Regulation Section 53.4942(a) - 3(b)(7)(ii):

(a) The nature and purposes of the project for which amounts are set aside: funding of a five-year grant to Children's Memorial Hospital in Chicago, Illinois for a long-term neuro-oncology clinical research project. This grant will be made in increments of \$140,000 per year, beginning in 2010. (The third increment of \$140,000 was paid in 2012 and is shown as a negative amount in Line 3b of Part XII of the Foundation Form 990-PF for 2012.)

(b) The amounts set aside will be paid for the specific project described in paragraph (a) above within 60 months after the date of the set-aside (December 31, 2009).

(c) The specific project described in paragraph (a) above will not be completed before the end of 2009, the taxable year in which the set-aside was made.

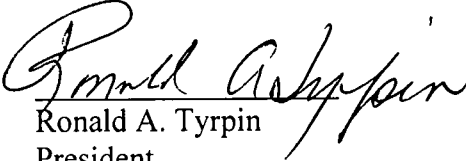

(f) The "Start-up payment period" for the Foundation is January 1, 1994 through December 31, 1997, and its "Start-up period minimum amount" is: (20% of \$39,599) + (40% of \$93,758) + (60% of \$128,836) + (80% of \$165,545), or \$255,160.60. As shown above, the sum of the Foundation's cash distributions during its start-up payment period is \$1,938,000, which exceeds the start-up period minimum amount.

The Foundation's full-payment period is January 1, 1998 through December 31, 2012. The full-payment minimum amount is the sum of 100% of the distributable amounts for all years in the full-payment period, which is \$2,488,810. As shown above, the sum of the cash distributions by the Foundation during its full-payment period is \$14,371,934, which exceeds the full-payment minimum amount.
