



It is my responsibility to keep the Endowment Committee informed of any changes to my address, degree/program, enrollment status and/or school transfers.

I understand that each semester I am required to provide proof of registration, a copy of my grades for the previous semester and a completed application form with my signature. I also understand that failure to provide all of these documents within the allotted timeframe may disqualify me for awards under this program.

I understand that I am responsible for following the guidelines set forth by the scholarship program. I further understand that failure to comply with the guidelines may cause me to forfeit any funds awarded to me and make me ineligible for participation in this program in the future.

I understand that if my application is submitted **after** the deadline, it will be held for consideration for the following semester.

I authorize the educational institution that I am attending or have attended to release information to the Western Shoshone Educational Legacy Fund Trustees regarding my enrollment status and grades.
