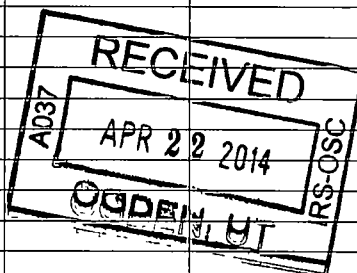

Statement 1

This Amended Form 990-PF is filed by the Donald E. Massey Trust (the "Trust"), to amend a previous "protective return" filed erroneously by prior legal counsel. Prior legal counsel determined that the provisions of Section 4947(a)(1) may be applicable to a portion of the Trust as explained in an attachment to the original return.

By this amended return, we are serving formal notice to the IRS that the "Separated Amount" referenced in the prior return is not a non-exempt charitable trust under Section 4947 and is not required to file a Form 990-PF. Further, through this amended return, we are requesting a return of 2012 taxes paid in the amount of \$101.00 and estimated tax payments in the amount of \$1,164.00 for a total of \$1,265.00.

Counsel for JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A., Special Fiduciary of the Trust has suggested that the charitable devise that has been set aside during the administration of the Trust may be a non-exempt trust under section 4947 of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). If it were a non-exempt trust, it would be subject to the same requirements and restrictions as are imposed on private foundations, including the annual filing requirement of Form 990-PF. However, since the Code allows a reasonable period of settlement of a trust, the Trust would not be considered a non-exempt trust until exhaustion of the time reasonably required by the trustee to perform the ordinary duties of administration.

By way of background, on December 13, 2001 Donald E. Massey ("Decedent") created a revocable trust in which he was the initial sole trustee. The Trust designated three successor trustees, namely, Brenda Joy Massey ("Brenda Joy"), Mr. Massey's executive assistant, Melissa M. Henaughen ("Melissa") and the Special Fiduciary. Paragraph 9(c) of the Trust contains the following devise: "After the death of the Settlor, the sum of twenty five million (\$25,000,000.00) dollars ("Charitable Devise") shall be distributed outright to such organization or organizations as shall be selected by the trustee for use in building facilities and supporting programs and services designed specifically for patients with brain injuries and their families, provided in each instance such organization or organizations qualified as an organization described in internal revenue code section 2055(a). The distribution(s) provided for in this paragraph 9(c) shall be made in memory of Settlor's late spouse Joyce Massey."

At the direction of Decedent, a Michigan nonprofit corporation, The Joyce and Don Massey Family Foundation was incorporated on June 20, 2002. It applied for and received from the IRS a determination letter that it is a private foundation described in section 501(c)(3).

According to the Form 1023, Application for Tax-Exempt Status, that was submitted to the IRS, the Foundation's activities are described as follows:

The organization is newly incorporated and presently has undertaken only organizational activities. It is anticipated that the primary charitable purpose of the organization will be to support closed head injury treatment and related research. This may be accomplished by establishing a new closed head treatment facility, add a closed head injury wing to an existing hospital or support for a closed head injury department at an existing hospital. The organization may also make grants to other medical, charitable and educational organizations

A comparison of the Foundation's description of activities and Decedent's intent in paragraph 9(c) of the Trust reveals that Decedent's intent would be satisfied by a distribution to the Foundation.

Prior to and after Decedent's death on June 9, 2011, a number of disputes have arisen regarding the validity of amendments to the Trust, including one which purported to replace the successor trustees named above. On April 11, 2011, Brenda Joy and Melissa filed a petition to confirm their determination as successor trustees, that the initial trustee (Decedent) was mentally or physically incapacitated and unable to discharge the duties of trustee when the Trust was allegedly amended on March 26, 2011. This was resolved in February 2013. On April, 18, 2011, two of the trustees attempting to replace the original trustees, filed a counter-petition seeking to enforce a previously undisclosed amendment which increased the original devise to the surviving spouse by a factor of ten. This dispute was not resolved until November, 2013 based on a settlement modifying the disputed amendment increasing the spouse's share. Pursuant to an Order dated December 6, 2011, the Special Fiduciary was directed to segregate the Charitable Devise from the remaining trust property and place it in a separate account, pending resolution of contested Trust provisions regarding successor trustees. This was resolved in September 2013 and the funds were transferred to the Foundation in December 2013.

There are remaining real estate assets which need to be sold including parcels in Tennessee and Michigan with substantial environmental issues, another parcel in Tennessee with a pending title dispute and a parcel in North Carolina which has zoning issues. The estate tax audit commenced at the beginning of 2014 and is in its early stages. Based on the auditor's requests, approximately five banker's boxes of documents describing the various disputes during the administration and pending issues are being reviewed by the auditor.

A dispute arose recently with respect to repairs to the home which was devised to Brenda Herzal Massey. The parties agreed that the Trust would finance the repairs up to a specified amount, based on a quote from a contractor. Subsequently, the parties have learned that the two story porch has a structural defect and a claim may be filed against the contractor who constructed it in 2009.

Section 4947 of the Code provides that trusts which are not exempt from taxation under section 501(a), all or a part of the unexpired interests in which are devoted to one or more charitable purposes, and which have amounts in trust for which a charitable deduction was

allowed, shall be subject to the same requirements and restrictions that are imposed on private foundations. These trusts are otherwise referred to as non-exempt charitable trusts.

Under Section 4947, a charitable trust is a trust which is not exempt from tax under 501(a), all of the unexpired interests of which are devoted to one or more charitable purposes and for which a charitable deduction was allowed. Importantly, an estate which is required to distribute all of its net assets in trust to charitable beneficiaries is not considered a charitable trust under 4947(a)(1) during the period of estate administration or settlement until the estate is considered terminated for federal income tax purposes. Treas. Reg. 1.641(b)-3(a), 53.4947-1(b)(2)(i). Further, a revocable trust that becomes irrevocable upon the death of the decedent-grantor, in which all of the unexpired interests are charitable, and under the terms of its governing instrument the trustee is required to hold some or all of the net assets in trust after it has become irrevocable, solely for charitable beneficiaries, is not considered a 4947(a)(1) charitable trust for a reasonable period of settlement.

According to Treas. Reg. 53.4947-1(b)(2)(iv), the term “reasonable period of settlement” means that period reasonably required (or if shorter, actually required) by the trustee to perform the ordinary duties of administration necessary for the settlement of the trust, including, for example, the collection of assets, the payment of debts, taxes and distributions, and the determination of rights of the subsequent beneficiaries.

The Code also subjects split-interest trusts to private foundation restrictions. A split-interest trust is a trust which is not exempt from taxation under 501(a), not all of the unexpired interests in which are devoted to specified charitable purposes, and which has amounts in trust for which a charitable deduction was allowed. The specified private foundation restrictions do not apply to noncharitable assets held in a split-interest trust which are segregated from other assets held in the trust for which a charitable deduction was allowed for an income or remainder interest. Amounts are considered segregated if (a) separate accounts for income, deductions, and other items properly attributed to each of the segregated amounts are maintained in a reasonable manner for (i) assets with respect to which no charitable deduction was allowed (for an income or remainder interest); and (ii) assets for which a charitable deduction was allowed; and (b) by reason of the separate accounting, the split-interest can be treated as two separate trusts, one devoted exclusively to noncharitable income and remainder interests and the other, a charitable or split-interest.

Although private letter rulings may not be relied upon as precedent, they are still instructive as to the IRS’s position on certain matters. By way of example, in Priv. Ltr. Rul. 1998-14036 (January 5, 1998), the IRS held that an estate and trust were not trusts described in either section 4947(a)(1) or section 4947(a)(2) of the Code since distributions would be completed within a reasonable period of administration or settlement. Here, decedent had created a revocable trust. After decedent died, the estate was settled. Pursuant to the trust indenture, one of its purposes was to pay death taxes, debts and expenses of the estate. The trust further provided for the creation, out of corpus, of individual trusts for decedent’s children. The remainder was to be distributed to a private foundation, previously formed by decedent. The ruling held that an estate functioning for the period of settlement of administration (including the period required to pay taxes, debts and bequests) is not described in section 4947(a)(2) of the Code. Further, it held that a trust is not described in section 4947(a)(1) during a reasonable

period of settlement which includes the period required to pay its debts, taxes and distributions. In this case, because there remained a possibility of claims against decedent and his businesses, as well as possible income tax liabilities, the estate and trust were still functioning within a reasonable period of administration or settlement and therefore neither the trust nor estate were considered non-exempt trusts described in sections 4947(a)(1) or 4947(a)(2) of the Code.

In this case, the Charitable Devise, although held in a separate account, is still accounted for as part of the Trust in gross. Even if it were considered a separate trust or segregated account of a split-interest trust, the result would be the same, since both are afforded a reasonable period of administration or settlement before being treated as a non-exempt charitable trust. Since the Trust and estate are still functioning within a reasonable period of administration or settlement, neither are non-exempt charitable trusts. Consequently, the annual filing requirement of Form 990-PF does not apply. Trust assets must be sold and distributions are still being reviewed. Finally, the federal estate tax return is being audited by the IRS.

Statement 2

As explained in the original 990-PF filing, the Donald E. Massey Trust consists of substantially all of the Donald E. Massey estate including a \$25 million bequest to be used in building facilities and supporting programs and services designed for patients with brain injuries and their families. The Wayne County Probate Court ordered the charitable devise of \$25 million to be set aside in a separate account pending further court proceedings (the "Separated Amount"). Prior counsel for the Separated Amount filed the original 990-PF erroneously based on the assumption that it constituted a non-exempt charitable trust under Section 4947 of the Code. The Trust in gross, that is, the Trust Estate other than the \$25 million charitable devise, paid the investment income tax of \$101.00 and estimated tax payments of \$1,164.00 for the benefit of the Separated Amount.
