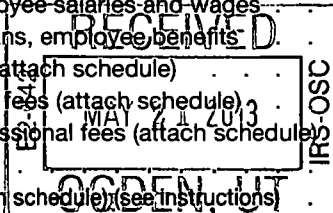

Attached is the three-part application form for The H. O. West Foundation's current Scholarship Program competition. The completed application must be returned to The H. O. West Foundation, 530 Herman O West Drive, Exton, PA 19341 by the 28th day of February of the year that you will graduate.

The Foundation will award up to seven college scholarships, valued at up to \$2,500 per year for four successive years toward tuition costs *only*, at an accredited college or university of your choice. One of the seven scholarships, the William S West Scholarship, is made possible through a gift to the Foundation from Mr. West's family in memory of our former Chairman and Chief Executive Officer.
