ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION FOR RAIBROOK FOUNDATION, INC.

Executed by the undersigned for the purpose of forming a Wisconsin corporation under Chapter 181 of the Wisconsin Statutes, WITHOUT STOCK AND NOT FOR PROFIT.

Article 1.

The name of the corporation is Raibrook Foundation, Inc.

Article 2.

The period of existence shall be perpetual.

Article 3.

The purposes shall be to provide financial assistance for institutions and activities within the City of Sturgeon Bay, Wisconsin, and the Towns of Sturgeon Bay, Nasewaupee and Sevastopol, all in Door County, Wisconsin, which are of a cultural and/or recreational nature, for the public benefit.

It is intended that some funds may be expended which will benefit other areas in Door County along with those named above, but that the primary purpose of the trust is to benefit the named areas.

It is further intended that funds be expended for activities other than those funded or normally funded by government, so that funds provided do not replace expenditures of tax dollars, whether present or future.

Article 4

The principal office is located in Door County, Wisconsin.

Article 5.

These articles may be amended in the manner authorized by law at the time of amendment.

Article 8.

The number of directors shall be five.

Article 9.

There will be no members and the manner of electing or appointing the directors will be provided in the by-laws.

Article 11.

Other Provisions

- A. No part of the income of the Corporation shall enure to the benefit of any officer or director of the Corporation, except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the Corporation. No officer or director shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon dissolution of the Corporation.
- B. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall involve the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation. The Corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office (including the publication or distribution of statements.)

- C. The Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942 of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- D. The Corporation shall not engage in any act of self-dealing as defined in Section 4941(d) of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- E. The Corporation shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in Section 4943(c) of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- F. The Corporation shall not make any investments in such manner as to subject it to tax under Section 4944 of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent.
- G. The Corporation shall not make any taxable expenditures as defined in Section 4945(d) of the Code or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.
- H. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not conduct or carry on any activities not permitted to be conducted or carried on by an organization exempt under Section 501(c) (3) of the Code, or by an organization contributions to which are deductible under Section 170 (c) (2) of the Code.
- I. Upon the dissolution of the Corporation or the winding up of its affairs, the assets of the Corporation shall be distributed exclusively to charitable, religious, scientific, or educational organizations which would then qualify under the provisions of Section 501(c) (3) of the Code.

RIDER TO FORM 104, NONSTOCK (NONPROFIT) CORPORATION AMENDMENT

That Article 3 be amended to read as follows:

"The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, educational, religious or scientific purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code."

That Paragraph I. of Article 11 be amended to read as follows:

"DISSOLUTION CLAUSE: Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes."

ARTICLE I. OFFICES

- 1.01. <u>Principal and Business Offices.</u> The corporation may have such principal and other business offices, within Door County, in the State of Wisconsin, as the Board of Directors may designate or as the business of the corporation may require from time to time.
- 1.02. Registered Office. The registered office of the corporation required to be maintained in the State of Wisconsin, Door County, in the State of Wisconsin, and the address of the registered office may be changed from time to time by the Board of Directors. The business office of the registered agent of the corporation shall be identical to such registered office.

ARTICLE II. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 2.01. General Powers and Number. The business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors. The number of directors of the corporation shall be as set forth in Section 0.03.
- 2.02. Tenure and Qualifications. Each director shall hold office until his resignation is accepted; his death; or until be is removed pursuant to these by-laws. A director may be removed from office by affirmative vote of a majority of the directors taken at a meeting of directors called for that purpose. A director may resign at any time by filing his written resignation with the Secretary of the corporation. Directors need not be residents of the State of Wisconsin.
- 2.03. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at the date and hour in each year set forth in Section 0.01, or at such other time and date within thirty days before or after said date as may be fixed by or under the authority of the Board of Directors, for the purpose of electing directors and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting. if the day fixed for the annual meeting shall be a legal holiday in the State of Wisconsin, such meeting shall be held on the next succeeding business day.
- 2.04. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of the President, Secretary, or any two directors. The President or Secretary Calling any special meeting of the Board of Directors may fix any place, within Door County, in the State of Wisconsin, as the place for holding any special meeting of the Board of Directors Called by them, and if no other place is fixed the place of

meeting shall be the principal business office of the corporation in the State of Wisconsin.

Notice; Waiver. Notice of each meeting of the Board of Directors (unless otherwise provided in or pursuant to Section 2.03) shall be given by written notice delivered personally or mailed or given by telephone to each director at his business address or at such other address as such director shall have designated in writing filed with the Secretary, in each case not less than that number of hours prior thereto as set forth in Section 0.04. If mailed, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed, with postage thereon prepaid, or when telephone contact is made with the director personally. Whenever any notice whatever is required to be given to any director of the corporation under the articles of incorporation or by-laws or any provision of law, a waiver thereof in writing, signed at any time, whether before or after the time of meeting, by the director entitled to such notice, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice. The attendance of a director at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a director attends a meeting and objects thereat to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.

The action of the Directors to set a future meeting at a regular or special meeting shall serve as notice of that meeting to all present at the meeting.

- 2.06. Quorum. Except as otherwise provided by law or by the articles of incorporation of these by-laws, a majority of the number of directors set forth in Section 0.03 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board of Directors, but a majority of the directors present (though less than such quorum) may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.
- 2.07. Manner of Acting. The act of the majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a greater number is required by law or by the articles of incorporation or these by-laws.
- 2.08. Conduct of Meetings. The President, and in his absence, the Vice-President, and in their absence, any director chosen by the directors present, shall call meetings of the Board of Directors to order and shall act as chairman of the meeting. The Secretary of the corporation shall act as secretary of all meetings of the Board of Directors, but in the absence of the

Secretary, the presiding officer may appoint any Assistant Secretary or any director or other person present to act as secretary of the meeting.

- 2.09. <u>Vacancies</u>. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors, including a vacancy created by an increase in the number of directors, may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office, though less than a quorum of the Board of Directors.
- 2.10. Presumption of Assent. A director of the Corporation who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors or a committee thereof of which he is a member at which action on any corporate matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting or unless he shall file his written dissent to such action with the person acting as the secretary of the meeting before the adjournment thereof or shall forward such dissent by registered mail to the Secretary of the corporation immediately after the adjournment of the meeting. Such right to dissent shall not apply to a director who voted in favor of such action.
- 2.11. <u>Unanimous Consent without Meeting.</u> Any action required or permitted by the articles of incorporation or by-laws or any provision of law to be taken by the Board of Directors at a meeting or by resolution may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by all of the directors then in office.

ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

- 3.01. Number. The principal officers of the corporation shall be a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Directors, from among its members. Such other officers and assistant officers as may be deemed necessary may be elected or appointed by the Board of Directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of President and Secretary and the offices of President and Vice-President.
- 3.02. Election and Term of Office. The officers of the corporation shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at the annual meeting of the Board of Directors. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as conveniently may be. Each officer shall hold office until his successor shall have been duly elected or until his prior death, resignation or removal.

- 3.03. <u>Removal.</u> Any officer or agent may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment that best interests of the corporation will be served thereby.
- 3.04. <u>Vacancies.</u> A vacancy in any principal office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise, shall be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.
- The President shall be the principal 3.05. President. executive officer of the corporation, and subject to the control of the Board of Directors, shall in general supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the corporation. He shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. shall have authority, subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors, to appoint such agents and employees of the corporation as he shall deem necessary, to prescribe their powers, duties and compensation, and to delegate authority to them. Such agents and employees shall hold office at the discretion of the President. He shall have authority to sign, execute and acknowledge, on behalf of the corporation, all contracts, leases, reports and all other mortgages, documents or instruments necessary of proper to be executed in the course of the corporation's regular business, or which shall be authorized by resolution of the Board of Directors. authorize any Vice-President or other officer or agent of the corporation to sign, execute and acknowledge such documents or instruments in his place and stead. In general he shall perform all duties incident to the office of President and such other duties incidents to the office of President and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors from time to time.
- 3.06. The Vice-President. In the absence of the President or in the event of his death, inability or refusal to act, or in the event for any reason it shall be impracticable for the President to act personally, the Vice-President shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. The Vice-President shall perform such duties and have such authority as from time to time may be delegated or assigned to him by the President or by the Board of Directors. The execution of any instrument of the corporation by any Vice-President shall be conclusive evidence, as to third parties, of his authority to act in the stead of the President.

3.07. The Secretary. The Secretary shall:

(a) keep the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose;

- (b) see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws or as required by law:
- (c) be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the corporation, if any, and see that the seal of the corporation is affixed to all documents the execution of which on behalf of the corporation under its seal is duly authorized;
- (d) in general perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and have such other duties and exercise such authority as from time to time may be delegated or assigned to him by the President or by the Board of Directors;

3.08. The Treasurer. The Treasurer shall:

- (a) have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the corporation;
- (b) receive and give receipts for moneys due and payable to the corporation from any source whatsoever, an deposit all such moneys in the name of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositaries as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of Section 4.03; and
- (c) in general perform all of the duties and exercise such other authority as from time to time may be delegated or assigned to him by the President or by the Board of Directors. If required by the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine.
- 3.09. Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers. There shall be such number of Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers as the Board of Directors may from time to time authorize. The Assistant Treasurers shall respectively, if required by the Board of Directors, give bonds for the faithful discharge of their duties in such sums and with such sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers, in general, shall perform such duties and have such authority as shall from time to time be delegated or assigned to them by the Secretary or Treasurer, respectively, or by the President or the Board of Directors.
- 3.10. Other Assistants and Acting Officers. The Board of Directors shall have the power to appoint any person to act as assistant to any officer, or as agent for the corporation in his stead, or to perform the duties of such officer whenever for any reason it is impracticable for such officer to act personally, and such assistant or acting officer or other agent so appointed by the Board of Directors shall have the power to perform all the duties of the office to which he is so appointed to be assistant, or as to which he is so appointed to act, except as such power may be otherwise defined or restricted by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV. CONTRACT, LOANS, CHECKS AND DEPOSITS; SPECIAL CORPORATE ACTS

- 4.01. Contracts. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute or deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation, and such authorization may be general or confined to specific instances. In the absence of other designation, all deeds, mortgages and instruments of assignment or pledge made by the corporation shall be executed in the name of the corporation by the President or one of the Vice-Presidents and by the Secretary, Treasurer, an Assistant Secretary, or an Assistant Treasurer. The Secretary, Treasurer or an Assistant Secretary, when necessary or required, shall affix the corporate seal, if any, thereto; and when so executed no other party to such instrument or any third party shall be required to make any inquiry into the authority of the signing officer or officers.
- 4.02. Checks, Drafts, etc. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by or under the authority of a resolution of the Board of Directors.
- 4.03. <u>Deposits</u>. All funds of the corporation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the corporation in such banks, trust companies, or other depositaries as may be selected by or under the authority of a resolution of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V. SEAL

5.01. The Board of Directors may provide a corporate seal which shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation and the state of incorporation and the words, "Corporate Seal."

ARTICLE VI. AMENDMENTS

6.01. By Directors. These by-laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new by-laws may be adopted by the Board of Directors by affirmative vote of a majority of the number of directors present at any meeting at which a quorum is in attendance.

6.02. <u>Implied Amendments</u>. Any action taken or authorized by the Board of Directors, which would be inconsistent with the by-laws then in effect but is taken or authorized by affirmative vote of not less than the number of shares or the number of directors required to amend the by-laws so that the by-laws would be consistent with such action, shall be given the same effect as though the by-laws had been temporarily amended or suspended so far, but only so far, as is necessary to permit the specific action so taken or authorized.
