BUGDET MEETING

DATE: December 6th, 2012

PLACE: Century College

One other member was present but their signature was illegible on the sign in sheet. Jerry Kersten was there but is not on your list.

- I. Call to order at 5:03
- II. Roll call A sign in sheet sent around by James Wollack.
- IV. The treasurer gave a report about the section's annual costs and expenses and gave a presentation how the treasurer's duties have changed over the last year. This report will be sent out by the treasurer and amended to the minutes.

V. Expected Income

- 1. The ACS allotment was set at 18,773.00 based off of last year's numbers.
- 2. New member commissions from ACS was set at \$0. The section does not expect to get any extra money from ACS. Last year we did get extra money but this is not guaranteed so we did not include it in the expected income from this year.
- 3. Donations/contribution was set at \$0. The section does not expect a yearly contribution from any individual or group. This is why this number is \$0. This does not exclude donations from being given. Since these donations are not expected / guaranteed they were not included in the expected income category.

4. Councilors Travel Expenses

\$300 is allocated from national ACS for an executive member to attend the annual ACS leadership conference. \$6,230 is allocated from national for councilor travel to the spring meeting and \$6,230 allocated from national for councilor travel to the Fall meeting. This totals \$12,760. This is what was budgeted for 2013.

5. Project seed

National will provide \$500 for each student. So we budgeted \$1000 since the section is going to fund at least two students in project seed.

Sara Mullins talked about options of how many students MN-ACS should fund from 2013. She requested that the section to fund two students (\$2500 for a student

participating in the program for the first time and \$3000 for a returning student). Administration costs were set at \$1000. The administration costs would be for paying someone to send out checks to students, poster printing costs, and possibly paying for lunches where all the participants get together. These numbers will be reflected in the expense part of this report.

Outside agencies/companies may fund even more students. This is not guaranteed at this point so it was not included as income. If companies sponsor more students the income generated by their donations to project seed would be canceled out proportionally by the cost of more students.

- 6. Program revenue was left at zero.
- 7. Local Affiliate member dues. This money is from national based on the number of members that live in our section. This was placed at \$12,000 based on the number of 2012 members.
- 8. Interest and dividends was kept at zero since we are not planning to take money out of our investment account. If we ever needed more money we could look at taking it from interest and dividends.
- 9. Special events and activities We do not collect any money from other activities so this line was left at \$0.
- 10. Meal revenue This was left at the 2012 amount of \$5500.

This leaves the section with a budget around \$50,000.

VI. Expenses

- 1. Subsidies
- a. National chemistry week. This was set at \$300. This money was not spent last year. The national chemistry week leader requested only \$300 in case there is an event next year that required funds.
- b. Chemistry Olympiad. We do not have a coordinator but decided to budget money in case someone steps forward. The committee decided to allocate \$1500 in case someone steps forward to run this event.
- c. Area high school chemistry teachers. \$500 was budgeted last year. The section has not done anything in last three years in this area. So we cut it to \$100.

- d. Kids and chemistry. Jerry asked that we keep it at \$500 even though only \$368 out of the \$500 was spent last year. Jerry has plans to spend it for the program this year.
- e. YCC. James said he would spear head getting some young chemists together for a get together at a local watering hole to see if this committee can be revived. The budget for this event was set at \$100.
- f. Chemists in the library spent less than last year so it was changed from \$1200 to \$1000.
- g. Project seed was set to cover two students and administrative costs. This would cost \$5500 and this is what we budgeted for.
- h. Earth Day event for ISD 719. Nicole wants to spear head an event in her school district sponsored by MN-ACS. Different experiments would be set up at different tables at the school during earth week. Volunteers would help kids with the experiments at the tables. Nicole asked for \$200 and it was granted.
- i. Government affairs budget was set at zero since nothing was done last year in this category.
- j. Science Café. This item was kept at \$0 but was kept in budget in case people wanted to take the event on in future years.
- 2. Awards, scholarships, grants (Expenses)
- a. Awards (MN / Brastead / highschool) \$500 was allocated as the honorarium for the winner of the MN-ACS annual award.
- b. Awards (plaques and flowers) \$275 was allocated for plaques and flowers for annual awards given out by the section.
- c. Grant for high school teacher to attend BCCE or national high school conference Nobody used this money last year but \$1000 was kept in the budget in case someone wants to go to one of these conferences next year.
- d. High school science fair awards This was set at \$500.
- e. Graduate student travel grants Graduate travel grants to the national ACS meeting was kept the same at \$2000.
- f. Senior chemists awards (plaques) This was kept at zero since this money will be taken out of the plaque and flowers budget listed above.

- g. Small grant awards In case money is needed for a project that is not in the budget \$500 was allocated. No one used it last year but it is good to build flexibility in the budget.
- h. MAS Undergraduate symposium. \$2650 would fund around 30 students. There may be fewer students that use this money this year since the national ACS meeting and NCUR are both on that weekend. In 2012 all of the money was used. \$100 was added to the budget for awards for best chemistry project at the MN-ACS event.
- i. Volunteer award This was zeroed out. These funds have recently been spent to subsidize the holiday dinner.

Administration Expenses

- a. State of Minnesota Charitable Organization Fee \$25 was budgeted for this organization fee.
- b. Banking fees This costs \$3 a month. This totals \$36 a year for banking fees.
- c. Website and web hosting This will cost \$370 this year. Next year it will be only \$80.
- d. Administrative Fees This was kept at \$200 in case it is needed.

Printing, Publishing, Postage, Shipping

- a. Minnesota Chemist, printing, mailing, and ballot -- This all totaled \$11,580 last year so we set it at \$12,000 for 2013.
- b. Returned mail This was kept at \$200.
- c. Post Office Shipping and postage This money is used to buy stamps and postage since we cannot buy postage with our checks since there is no address on them. This was put at \$75.
- d. Postcard mailing This item was deleted from budget since we do not use post cards anymore.

Conducting Local Meetings

- a. Advertizing Last year we advertized for the career fair. Not many people came because of the advertisement so we decided not to advertize next year. This was set at zero.
- b. Room, audio, visual This was kept at zero. This is usually wrapped into food costs at the event.
- c. Speaker fees, travel, and board The section has several outside speakers coming next year so this was set at \$1000.
- d. Volunteer appreciation night This has not been done in a couple of years so it was set at \$0.
- e. Social events (Aug/Dec) These funds help subsidize the holiday social. This was put at \$1000.

Meal expenses

a. Meal expenses were kept at \$10,000

Travel Subsides to Councilors

a. This was put at \$15,000 based on last year's numbers.

Travel Subsidy - leadership conference

a. Chair-Elect will go to the leadership conference this year. \$1000 was allocated for this travel.

Other expenses:

a. Other expenses were put at \$100 in case we need to buy a few things to help run meetings.

Budget Summary:

This puts the section \$11,000 over budget. Last year the section budgeted \$9,000 over budget and came in right on budget. MN-ACS has never totally spent everything that was budgeted. There is also \$3000 in extra investment income from our investments from 2012 and ~\$9,000 in

the checking account. If the section really spent everything that was budgeted for then the section would have to go into investment income to cover costs. The committee agreed to do this if they needed to in 2013. The investment account has ~\$112,000.

A motion was made to change the names of the authorized parties on the investment account to treasurer, new chair, and past chair. This passed unanimously.

The treasurer will change the people with access to the investments.

MN ACS will change who is getting the extra copies of MN ACS to Matt Morgan. His shipping address was given to the MN chemist editors to make this change.

The green chemistry meeting is in February at 3M. The cuisine will be Indian food and will cost around \$15. Everyone's name must be in Rasmesh's hand a week before the meeting.

Nicole Weulander will work with the newly elected treasurer Jenna Belden to get her name on the banking and investment accounts.

Motion to pass the 2013 budget was given, seconded and passed.
