Statement of Purpose

The mission of the Charles City Family YMCA is to put Christian principles into practice through programs that build healthy spirit, mind, and body for all. We accomplish our mission through programs that develop character. We develop character by teaching and demonstrating positive values such as caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility. YMCA programs build strong kids, strong families, and strong communities. All YMCA programs fall under one of these three focus areas: 1) Youth Development; 2) Healthy Living; or 3) Social Responsibility.

The YMCA is for everyone! No one is turned away from the YMCA due to an inability to pay. Financial assistance is available on a sliding scale based upon need and programs are priced affordably for the communities in which they are offered. We are a volunteer directed organization and as such no individual profits monetarily as a result of our operations.

Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

For over 105 years the Charles City Family YMCA has provided programs and services to the individuals of all ages in the Charles City and Floyd County area. The YMCA operates year-round programming to accommodate the needs of the community. The YMCA encourages volunteer involvement and community input through the volunteer Board of Directors.

The Charles City Family YMCA, as a human service organization, meets the needs of the community and is open to people of all ages, races, religions, and income levels. YMCA programs nurture the healthy development of children, encourage positive behavior with teens, and strengthen families – all of which result in our community and neighborhoods being safe and healthy places to live, work, and play. Programs are designed to meet the health and social service needs of the children, adults, and families who participate. All programs emphasize the development of positive values, encouraging moral and ethical behavior based on Christian principles.

Highlights of significant program accomplishments include:

- The Charles City Family YMCA celebrated its 100th Anniversary in 2008. The YMCA has been a part of this community for many years and continues to be well supported with 27% of the population of Charles City belonging to the YMCA.
- In 2012 the Charles City Family YMCA gave financial assistance to 122 different families in the community. This assistance helped these families with membership fees or program fees. Almost 14% of the people that use the Charles City Family YMCA receive some form of financial assistance.

- The YMCA Roller skating Program once again provided a safe place for kids, teens, and adults to hang out on Friday evenings during the months of September through May. The YMCA averaged 100+ people each Friday evening during this 9-month period.
- The Charles City Family YMCA continued to work with the Charles City Community School District in providing a Before and After School Child Care Program for children in grades Kindergarten through 5th Grade. This program also meets for the entire day on days there was no school

Description of Services

Y's Guy's Before and After School Child Care & Summer Day Camp

The YMCA Child Care and Summer Day Camp programs are safe, affordable and convenient. Educational programs teach kids positive values and develop self-esteem and leadership skills. Parent involvement is combined with an interactive and diverse curriculum to create a supportive environment for families. Collaborations with local schools insure that YMCA Child Care is accessible to all kids. Core program activities include before and after care for school-aged children, vacation camps, summer childcare, day camps, tutorial programs, and special events.

YMCA Youth Sports

YMCA youth sports programs focus on full and equal participation as every child plays in every game. Cooperation, teamwork, and skill development are key components of YMCA youth sports programs. These goals are developed through skill clinics and league play for kids aged pre-K through Middle School. Core programs include leagues, tournaments, and clinics in basketball, soccer, volleyball, wrestling, tae kwon do, tumbling, roller-skating, tackle football, and flag-football.

YMCA Aquatics

YMCA Aquatics programs teach swimming and water safety skills, teamwork, and self-confidence while promoting good health through regular exercise. Positive values are taught and demonstrated through water safety education and progressive swim instruction. Programs are offered for infants, pre-school age children, and school-aged children. Core programs include swim team, progressive swim instruction, water aerobics, lifeguard training, and learn-to-swim. The Charles City Family YMCA provides swim lessons to three school districts yearly in which the YMCA subsidizes the entire cost of those lessons.

YMCA Family Programs

YMCA family programs strengthen and support families by providing opportunities for families to play and learn together. Programs provide opportunities for family members to spend quality time together and have fun. Core programs include various parent/child classes, family recreational activities, family fitness classes, and family nights.

YMCA Healthy Lifestyles

YMCA health and fitness programs provide a variety of safe and effective alternatives for all ages and abilities to improve or maintain a healthy lifestyle. Trained staff provides personalized and group leadership in a wide variety of settings. Core programs include aerobics, water aerobics, step aerobics, personal training, wellness orientations, adult sport leagues, martial arts, and yoga.

Description of Collaborative Efforts

With the strength and quality of past collaborations, the Charles City Family YMCA continued to experience significant increases in request from leading community organizations to partner on projects. Currently, we are participating in many collaborative partnerships with a variety of community organizations. Some examples include:

- The Charles City Community School District in providing Before & After School Child Care to school age children between the grades of Kindergarten and 5th Grade.
- The Nashua Plainfield Community School District in providing swimming lessons for all the second grade students in the school district.
- The Charles City Youth Soccer Program with assisting with program promotion, registration, league organization, and field preparation.
- Comprehensive Systems by providing a place for their clients / residents to swim and exercise at no cost.
- The American Red Cross by providing First Aid and CPR classes to the community.
- Carrie Lane High School by providing a facility for these students to participate in physical education class.
- The Charles City Housing Authority by providing 50 adult memberships to residents in their Senior Living facilities.
