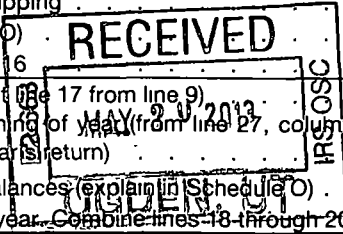

This project was provided to the local youth to insure the health and welfare of local livestock exhibitors at the Logan County Fair. This program will insure that local 4-H exhibitors will remain safe while exhibiting livestock at the Logan County Fair.

PART I (8) The Logan County Fair Foundation received no other revenue for the 2012 year than the \$9,200. that was listed on lines 1 & 9.

PART I (10) \$4,320. was paid out by the foundation for the purchase of the previously mentioned livestock gates.

PART I (13) 4,841.45 were the only professional fees paid to any organization by the Logan County Fair Foundation.

PART I (16) There were no other expenses paid by the Logan County Fair Foundation.

PART I (20) 2012 was the first year of existence of the Logan County Fair Foundation therefore there were no previous years assets to list.

PART II (24) There are no other assets owned by the Logan County Fair Foundation.

PART II (26) There are no other expenses owed by the Logan County Fair Foundation.
