The Skeebo Charitable Trust was determined to be the residuary beneficiary of the Estate of Henry J. Faison to which the residuary assets passed pursuant to the Order Approving Settlement and Final Judgment executed by the Honorable W. Erwin Spainhour, Superior Court Judge Presiding over Case Number 13-CVS-15813, filed in the North Carolina Court on June 16, 2014. Its terms were effective as of the date of death of Henry J. Faison (November 30, 2012) in a declaration of trust ("the Declaration") titled The Skeebo Charitable Trust executed by Jean Gordon Carter, Esq., as the Trustee, and solely in her capacity of Guardian ad Litem, on February 27, 2014. A copy of the Declaration dated February 27, 2014, is attached as Attachment I hereto and made a part hereof. The Order Approving Settlement and Final Judgment also approved the terms of the Amended and Restated Trust Instrument of The Skeebo Charitable Trust and ordered that it be executed by Lane Elias Faison and Jay Winters Faison, as Co-Trustees of the Trust, on June 16, 2014. A copy of the Amended and Restated Trust Instrument of The Skeebo Charitable Trust is attached hereto as Attachment II and made a part hereof.

Prior to the entry of the Order Approving Settlement and Final Judgment the identity of the Trustees of The Skeebo Charitable Trust was in dispute. The Order Approving Settlement and Final Judgment directed that Lane Elias Faison and Jay Winters Faison serve as co-Trustees of The Skeebo Charitable Trust. The Trustees have determined that they will not receive compensation. Additionally, no funding of The Skeebo Charitable Trust could occur prior to the Order Approving Settlement and Final Judgment being entered. Therefore, during calendar year 2013, The Skeebo Trust had no assets.

Form 1023, Application for Recognition of Exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code was filed by the Trustees on August 14, 2014.

THIS TRUST is signed this Aday of February, 2014, by JEAN GORDON CARTER, Guardian Ad Litem for The Skeebo Charitable Trust, as Trustee. This document memorializes the existing terms of The Skeebo Charitable Trust created by Henry J. Faison as of the date of his death on November 30, 2012. The Guardian Ad Litem was appointed by order of the Superior Court of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina on February 21, 2014.

ARTICLE I TRUST NAME AND TRUST PROPERTY

- A. <u>Trust Name</u>. This trust and this trust instrument may be referred to as "THE SKEEBO CHARITABLE TRUST."
- B. <u>Trust Property</u>. The trust property includes assets passing from the Estate of Henry J. Faison and assets held by others for the Trust, along with the income and proceeds of those assets. The Trustee may receive property from any source in cash or in other property acceptable to the Trustee. Any other person may make contributions to the principal of this trust by lifetime gift, will, designation of the Trustee as beneficiary or otherwise.

ARTICLE II CHARITABLE TRUST

Section One Trust Purpose and Limitations

The Trustee shall hold the assets in trust in accordance with the following provisions of North Carolina General Statutes Section 36C-4A-1:

- A. <u>Purposes</u>. Notwithstanding any provision in the laws of North Carolina or in this governing instrument to the contrary, the trust shall be operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, and scientific purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) and section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code or the corresponding provisions of any future federal tax statutes (the "Code").
- B. <u>Prohibited Transactions</u>. Notwithstanding any provisions in the laws of North Carolina or in this governing instrument to the contrary, the trust shall make distributions at any time and in any manner as not to subject it to tax under section 4942 of the Code; the trust shall not engage in any act of self-dealing which would subject it to tax under section 4941 of the Code; the trust shall not retain any excess business holdings that would subject it to tax under section 4943 of the Code; the trust shall not make any investments that would subject it to tax under section 4944 of the Code; and the trust shall not make any taxable expenditures that would subject it to tax under section 4945 of the Code.

C. <u>Dissolution</u>. Upon any dissolution, winding up, or liquidation of the trust, its assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or a state or local government for a public purpose.

Section Two Specific Provisions for Distributions

- A. <u>Specific Purposes of Trust</u>. This trust is organized and shall be operated to reflect the intent, values and charitable interests of Henry J. Faison, the founder of Faison Enterprises, Inc., and a distinguished entrepreneur who was an inspiration to his family, friends, colleagues and community ("Charitable Purposes").
- B. <u>Distributions</u>. The Trustee may seek to achieve the Charitable Purposes through direct programs and activities of this trust or through distributions of income and principal to other organizations that reflect the Charitable Purposes. Except as limited herein, the Trustee shall have authority to distribute from time to time exclusively for the Charitable Purposes such amounts of income or principal as the Trustee in the Trustee's discretion may determine.
- C. <u>Limitations</u>. No part of the trust fund shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to the Trustee or other private persons, except that the trust shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the Charitable Purposes. No substantial part of the activities of the trust shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation; and the trust shall not participate in, or otherwise intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this trust, the trust shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a trust exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or (b) by a trust to which contributions are deductible under Sections 170(c)(2) and 2055(a) of the Code.

ARTICLE III ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

Section One Trustee Actions

A. <u>Powers of Trustee</u>. Subject to the limitations provided herein, the Trustee shall have and exercise all powers incident to the ownership of the properties, real and personal, held by the Trustee from time to time belonging to this trust, that an unmarried competent owner has over individually owned property and any other powers appropriate to achieve the proper investment, management, administration or distribution of the trust property. The Trustee shall have all powers and authority conferred upon the Trustee by the North Carolina Uniform Trust Code, Chapter 36C of the General Statutes of North Carolina, as well as any other powers

conferred by law or elsewhere in this trust instrument, including, without limitation, the authority to invest trust property subject to the prudent investor rule.

- B. <u>Compensation and Expenses</u>. The Trustee shall be entitled to reasonable compensation and to reimbursement of expenses properly incurred or advanced in the administration of the trust in accordance with North Carolina law.
- C. <u>Restricted Contributions</u>. The Trustee may accept contributions that restrict their uses and purposes or that limit the time, manner, amount or other terms of distribution, provided that such restrictions and limitations are consistent with the Charitable Purposes. Unless otherwise specifically provided, the Trustee may mingle such restricted contributions with other trust property for investment purposes.

Section Two Successor Trustee

- A. Appointment of Trustee. The signatory Trustee shall be the individual serving from time to time as Guardian Ad Litem for The Skeebo Charitable Trust. Any successor Trustee or Trustees shall be appointed by the Superior Court of Mecklenburg County. Any successor Trustee so appointed from time to time shall have all the powers, authority, and discretion conferred upon the signatory Trustee, as fully and effectually as though named by this instrument as a Trustee.
- B. <u>Waiver of Bond and Court Supervision</u>. No Trustee shall be required to give bond or other security notwithstanding the authority of the court to require a bond. Any Trustee may act without qualifying before any court or filing with any court any inventory, accounting or other report relating to the administration of the trust unless otherwise required by law to do so.

ARTICLE IV MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. <u>Governing Law</u>. Questions relating to the meaning and effect of the terms of this instrument and the validity of any trust established under this trust instrument shall be determined by the law of the State of North Carolina.
- B. <u>Place of Administration</u>. The principal place of administration of the trust established under this trust instrument shall be the State of North Carolina. The Trustee without notice to or the consent of any qualified beneficiaries may transfer the principal place of administration to another State in which the Trustee or a successor Trustee resides or has a principal place of business. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the laws of the State of North Carolina shall continue to govern the meaning and effect of the trust instrument and the validity of the trust established under this trust instrument.

ARTICLE V AMENDMENT AND IRREVOCABILITY

- A. Amendment by Signatory Trustee. The signatory Trustee (being the Guardian Ad Litem for The Skeebo Charitable Trust) may amend this trust instrument in whole or in part in accordance with orders of the Superior Court of Mecklenburg County or in any other manner necessary or advisable for the more convenient or efficient administration of this trust; except that no amendment may make the trust ineligible for tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or, except in the case of a court-ordered amendment, alter the Charitable Purposes for which the trust is established. For the avoidance of doubt, an amendment of the trust instrument pursuant to this Paragraph that is made in accordance with orders of the Superior Court of Mecklenburg County may expand the amendment powers conferred on the Trustee by Paragraph B of this Article, provided that no amendment may make the trust ineligible for tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code.
- B. <u>Irrevocability</u>. Except as provided in Paragraph A above, this trust is irrevocable, and no one shall have the right or power, whether alone or in conjunction with others, in whatever capacity, (i) to amend or revoke the trust or any of the terms of this instrument, in whole or in part, or (ii) except as otherwise expressly provided in the trust instrument, to designate the persons who shall possess or enjoy the trust property. However, the Trustee shall have the power, acting alone, to amend the trust from time to time in any manner required for the sole purpose of ensuring that the trust qualifies and continues to qualify as tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and that contributions to it are deductible for income and transfer tax purposes to the extent allowed by the Code.

AMENDED AND RESTATED TRUST INSTRUMENT OF THE SKEEBO CHARITABLE TRUST

COUNTY OF MECKLENBURG

THIS AMENDMENT AND RESTATEMENT OF TRUST INSTRUMENT is effective on the day of June, 2014 and amends and restates the Trust Instrument signed on the 27th day of February, 2014, by JEAN GORDON CARTER, Guardian Ad Litem for The Skeebo Charitable Trust, which memorialized the existing terms of The Skeebo Charitable Trust created by Henry J. Faison as of the date of his death on November 30, 2012. The Guardian Ad Litem was appointed by order of the Superior Court of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina on February 21, 2014. This Amendment and Restatement of Trust Instrument is signed by LANE ELIAS FAISON and JAY WINTERS FAISON, who are the Trustees by order of the Superior Court of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina (the "Trustees"), and the trust instrument reflects the order of such Court.

ARTICLE I TRUST NAME, PROPERTY, AND TAX STATUS

- A. <u>Trust Name</u>. This trust may be referred to as "THE SKEEBO CHARITABLE TRUST," and this amended and restated trust instrument may be referred to as "THE SKEEBO CHARITABLE TRUST INSTRUMENT." This trust instrument sometimes refers to THE SKEEBO CHARITABLE TRUST as the "Trust."
- B. <u>Trust Property</u>. The Trust has been or will be funded with assets passing from the Estate of Henry J. Faison. The Trustees may accept assets from any source in cash or property acceptable to the Trustees. The Trustees shall not accept assets if the contribution is conditioned or limited so as to require the disposition of the income or principal of the trust for other than charitable purposes. The Trustees shall hold all assets received in trust under the terms of this trust instrument.
- C. <u>Tax Status</u>. The Trust is intended to be exempt from federal income taxes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provisions of any future federal tax statutes (the "Code"), and eligible to receive contributions that are deductible under sections 170, 2055, and 2522 of the Code. This trust instrument shall be construed accordingly.

ARTICLE II CHARITABLE PURPOSES AND ADMINISTRATION OF TRUST

A. <u>Charitable Purposes</u>. Notwithstanding any provisions in the laws of North Carolina or in this trust instrument to the contrary, the Trust is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Code. The

Trust is organized and shall be operated to support the charitable interests of Henry J. Faison, a distinguished entrepreneur who was an inspiration to his family, friends, colleagues, and community. Specifically, the Trust is organized and shall be operated in perpetuity (or until all of the assets of the Trust have been expended for the charitable purposes of the Trust) in a manner consistent with the requirements of section 501(c)(3) of the Code and for the purposes of increasing public understanding and acceptance of the conservative principles of free enterprise, limited government and traditional American values, such as individual freedom (referred to as the "Charitable Purposes"), including related education, training and research.

- B. <u>Distributions</u>. The Trustees shall use and apply all or any part of the income and principal of the Trust in such manner as they, in their sole discretion, determine appropriate to accomplish the Charitable Purposes, including but not limited to, distributions to charitable organizations described in section 501(c)(3) of the Code that support the Charitable Purposes and by the expenditure of the Trust's assets for related education, training and research to advance the Charitable Purposes.
- C. <u>Limitations</u>. No part of the net earnings of the trust shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to the Trustees or other private persons, except that the trust shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the Charitable Purposes. No substantial part of the activities of the trust shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting, to influence legislation; and the trust shall not participate in, or intervene in, any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of, or in opposition to, any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Trust, the Trust shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a trust exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Code or (b) by a trust to which contributions are deductible under sections 170(c)(2), 2055(a), and 2522(a) of the Code.
- D. <u>Prohibited Transactions</u>. Notwithstanding any provisions in the laws of North Carolina or in this governing instrument to the contrary, the Trustees shall make distributions at any time and in any manner so as not to subject the Trust to tax under section 4942 of the Code; the Trustees shall not engage in any act of self-dealing which would subject the Trust to tax under section 4941 of the Code; the Trustees shall not retain any excess business holdings that would subject the Trust to tax under section 4943 of the Code; the Trustees shall not make any investments that would subject the Trust to tax under section 4944 of the Code; and the Trustees shall not make any taxable expenditures that would subject the Trust to tax under section 4945 of the Code.
- E. <u>Dissolution</u>. In the event of the termination or dissolution of the Trust, by court order or otherwise, and after all of the Trust's liabilities and obligations have been paid, satisfied, and discharged, or adequate provisions made therefor, the Trustees shall distribute all of the Trust's remaining assets to one or more organizations selected by the Trustees that are organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of sections 501(c)(3) and 170(c)(2)(B) of the Code. In selecting the organizations to receive the remaining assets of the Trust and without limiting the discretion of the Trustees, the Trustees shall consider the

Charitable Purposes including organizations and projects supported by the Trust during its existence.

ARTICLE III TRUSTEE AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS

Section One Successor Trustees

- A. <u>Resignation or Removal of Trustee</u>. Any Trustee may resign as a Trustee by a writing delivered to the other Trustees. Any resignation shall not be effective until appointment of a successor Trustee if the resigning Trustee is the only Trustee serving.
- B. <u>Appointment of Successor Trustees</u>. Each Trustee may appoint an individual to serve as his or her successor in the event of such Trustee's death, resignation, or incapacity. Any such appointment shall be in a writing signed by the Trustee, may be made before the Trustee ceases to serve, and shall be revocable by such Trustee until his or her death, resignation, or incapacity. If a successor Trustee is not named or declines to serve, the remaining Trustees may appoint a successor Trustee. Any appointment of a successor Trustee shall take effect upon written notice to and acceptance by the successor Trustee.
- C. <u>Actions of Successor Trustees</u>. Any successor Trustee may exercise all the powers and authority conferred upon the predecessor Trustees, including the right to resign. A successor Trustee shall have no duty to inquire into the acts or omissions of any predecessor Trustee or examine such Trustee's accounts in the absence of actual knowledge of or information concerning a possible breach of trust that would cause a reasonable person to conduct such an inquiry or examination. A successor Trustee shall not be personally liable for any acts or omissions of any predecessor Trustee.
- D. <u>Waiver of Bond and Court Supervision</u>. The Trustees, including additional and successor Trustees, shall not be required to give bond or other security notwithstanding the authority of the court to require a bond and may act without qualifying before any court or filing with any court any inventory, accounting, or other report relating to the administration of the Trust unless otherwise required by law to do so.

Section Two Trustee Actions

A. <u>Powers of Trustee</u>. The Trustees shall have all powers and authority conferred upon the Trustees by the North Carolina Uniform Trust Code, Chapter 36C of the General Statutes of North Carolina, as well as any other powers conferred by law or elsewhere in this trust instrument, including, without limitation, the authority to invest trust property subject to the prudent investor rule. Such powers may be exercised without court order and only in a fiduciary capacity. The powers granted to the Trustees are subject, however, to the restrictions set forth in this instrument and the Trustees are prohibited from exercising any power or discretion granted

by North Carolina or other laws that would jeopardize or affect the Trust's status as an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Code.

- B. <u>Actions by Trustees</u>. The Trustees shall act by majority vote if more than two Trustees are serving and by unanimous vote if two Trustees are serving.
- C. <u>Compensation and Expenses</u>. The Trustees shall be entitled to receive reasonable compensation for, and reimbursement of reasonable expenses incurred in connection with, services as a Trustee.

Section Three Liability of Trustees and Indemnification

- A. <u>Limitations on Liability</u>. The Trustees shall not be answerable for any losses attributable to investments made in good faith and with reasonable care. The Trustees shall not be liable for the acts or omissions of any other Trustee or Trustees, or of any accountant, agent, counsel, or custodian selected and overseen with reasonable care. Each of the Trustees shall be fully protected in acting upon any instrument, certificate, or paper believed by him or her to be genuine and to be signed or presented by the proper person or persons and shall not be under any duty to make any investigation or inquiry as to any statement contained in any such writing but may accept the same as conclusive evidence of the truth and accuracy of the statements.
- Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted under the laws of North Carolina, B. a Trustee who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a Trustee or for actions taken in accordance with the powers granted to the Trustees under this trust instrument, or for actions not taken, as applicable, shall not be held personally liable and shall be fully indemnified and held harmless by the Trust against all fees and expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such Trustee in connection with such action, suit, or proceeding if he or she acted in good faith and without willful misconduct or intentional neglect without reasonable cause. It is intended that each Trustee be indemnified if he or she acted in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in good faith, and with respect to any business or investment decision, exercised reasonable care. The termination of any action, suit, or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction, or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent, shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in accordance with the applicable standard of conduct for indemnification under this Section. The indemnification provided by this Section shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which the Trustee seeking indemnification may be entitled under applicable law, or otherwise and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Trustee and shall inure to the benefit of the successors, heirs, executors, and administrators of such Trustee. The Trustees may purchase and maintain such insurance as is commercially reasonable, in the Trustees' discretion, on behalf of any person who is or was a Trustee against any liability asserted against him or her and incurred by him or her in such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as a Trustee, whether or not the Trust would have the power to indemnify him or her against such liability under the provisions of this Section and in order to reimburse the Trust for any indemnification payment

made to a Trustee or former Trustee by the Trust. The Trust shall advance expenses, including reasonable legal fees and costs, incurred or to be incurred, in connection with any proceeding to indemnify any such Trustee in accordance with this Section and applicable law and such payment shall not require the prior approval or consent of any court, provided that if there is a final determination in any legal proceeding that the Trustee is not entitled to indemnification, in whole or in part, the Trustee shall reimburse the Trust for such expenses that are not subject to being indemnified, except for the expenses for the purchase and maintenance of insurance on such Trustee. The use of funds of the Trust for indemnification or for purchase and maintenance of insurance for the benefit of the Trustees as designated in this Section shall be deemed a proper expense of the trust.

- C. <u>Legal Expenses</u>. The Trustees shall be authorized to advise and consult with legal counsel, and to obtain a legal opinion therefrom, if applicable, regarding any potential trust administration matter and shall not be liable for or chargeable with any action taken or not taken with respect to such matter in reliance on such consultation or opinion. The cost of such consultation or opinion shall be paid from the assets of the trust.
- D. <u>Limits on Indemnification</u>. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Section, during any period that the Trust is classified as a private foundation under the Code, the Trust shall not indemnify any person otherwise entitled to indemnification pursuant to the provisions of this Section or purchase insurance to provide such indemnification if such indemnification or purchase of insurance is an act of self-dealing as defined in section 4941(d) of the Code or as a taxable expenditure as defined in section 4945(d) of the Code. For the avoidance of doubt, to the extent permitted under the laws of North Carolina, the Trust may indemnify a Trustee for compensatory expenses within the meaning of section 53.4941(d)-2(f)(4) of the Treasury Regulations promulgated under the Code, including, but not limited to any penalty, tax (including a tax imposed by Chapter 42 of the Code) or expense of correction that is owed by the Trustee, provided that, when added to any other compensation paid by the Trust to the Trustee, the total compensation is reasonable

ARTICLE IV MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. <u>Governing Law</u>. Questions relating to the meaning and effect of the terms of this instrument and the validity of the trust established under this trust instrument shall be determined by the law of the State of North Carolina.
- B. <u>Place of Administration</u>. The principal place of administration of the Trust established under this trust instrument shall be the State of North Carolina. In the event the place of administration is ever in another state, the laws of the State of North Carolina shall continue to govern the meaning and effect of the trust instrument and the validity of the Trust established under this trust instrument.

ARTICLE V AMENDMENT AND IRREVOCABILITY

- Limited Power to Amend. The Trustees may amend this trust instrument in whole or in part to provide a different name for the trust, to permit additional Trustees and successor Trustees, in any manner the Trustees determine necessary or advisable for the sole purpose of ensuring that the Trust qualifies and continues to qualify as tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Code and that contributions to the Trust are deductible for income and transfer tax purposes to the extent allowed by the Code, and in any manner the Trustees determine necessary or advisable to improve the efficiency of administration of the Trust. No amendment may alter the Charitable Purposes, or affect the trust's status as an organization exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Code.
- B. Irrevocability. Except as provided in Paragraph A above, this Trust is irrevocable, and no one shall have the right or power, whether alone or in conjunction with others, in whatever capacity, (i) to amend or revoke the Trust or any of the terms of this instrument, in whole or in part, or (ii) except as otherwise expressly provided in the trust instrument, to designate the persons who shall possess or enjoy the trust property.

This trust instrument is executed effective as amended and restated on the date provided above. By their signatures below, each of the Trustees agrees to serve as a Trustee of the Trust, consistent with the order of the Superior Court of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina.
